Saudi FM sees progress to end Yemen conflict

Saudi Arabia's foreign minister said yesterday progress was being made towards ending the Yemen conflict, in which Riyadh leads a military coalition, but more work was needed, including reinstating a truce and transitioning to a permanent ceasefire. "The conflict is only going to end through a political settlement and that needs to be the focus, and I can say that we are making progress but there's still work to be done," Prince Faisal bin Farhan al-Saud said on a panel at the World Economic Forum in Davos, Switzerland.

Nasa-Boeing project for fuel-efficient plane

Nasa said yesterday it awarded \$425mn to Boeing Co for the agency's "Sustainable Flight Demonstrator" project as the Biden administration works to cut aviation sector emissions. Boeing will work with Nasa to "build, test, and fly a full-scale demonstrator aircraft and validate technologies aimed at lowering emissions," the agency said. Over seven years, Nasa will invest \$425mn, while Boeing and its partners will contribute the remainder of the agreement funding, estimated at about \$725mn.

Microsoft to shed 10,000 jobs on recession worries

Microsoft Corp yesterday said it would eliminate 10,000 jobs and take a \$1.2bn charge, as its cloud-computing customers reassess their spending and the company braces for potential recession. The layoff, far larger than cuts by Microsoft last year, pile on to tens of thousands of job cuts across the technology sector that's long past its strong growth during the pandemic. Page 11

Minister among 14 dead in Ukraine copter crash

Ukraine's interior minister Denys Monastyrskyi and a child were among at least 14 people killed yesterday when a helicopter crashed into a nursery and set it ablaze in a suburb of the capital Kyiv. Separately, Ukraine reported more fighting along front lines hundreds of kilometres away in the east. World Cup investments done for Qatar's future: al-Kuwari

atar's investments for the World Cup have been done for the country's future and economic diversification as part of Qatar National Vision 2030, said HE the Minister of Finance Ali bin Ahmed al-Kuwari.

In an interview with CNN's Richard Quest at the World Economic Forum in Davos, al-Kuwari discussed what was next for the country after the success of FIFA World Cup Qatar

Al-Kuwari said: "World Cup is only one month...and nobody would do a huge investment or prepare only for one month. So what we have been doing with the investments...infrastructure ... it's for Qatar. It's for the future of Qatar. This is part of our principles. And it is part of our diversification journey."

On Qatar budget surplus (of \$8bn in the third quarter of 2022), al-Kuwari said. "We have a very clear and disciplined fiscal policy framework. This is

already approved by the government. And this decides how we do and how we deal with surpluses. Our surplus goes to Qatar Investment Authority for investments as part of our diversification."

Al-Kuwari said: "Our economy to-

day is 57% non-hydro-carbon. Only 43% is hydrocarbon. Most of the growth we see in our economy today comes from the non-hydrocarbon sector. But in reality, we are dependent on the hydrocarbon sector...and on the prices of oil. That's why we have achieved an excellent surplus in the nine months of last year...9% GDP growth. This year also we are project-

ing a 3.5% growth in our GDP."

The minister also listed out global recession, inflation, ongoing war in Ukraine and energy crisis as major concerns for the global economy.

Doha Metro celebrates 100mn-rider milestone

atar Railways Company (Qatar Rail) yesterday announced that Doha Metro has recorded a ridership of 100mn since the launch of its services in 2019.

"Doha Metro has changed the public transport landscape in Qatar by providing a high-quality, fast, reliable and affordable alternative to the predominant mode of transport, i.e. private car," Qatar Rail said in a statement. "The ridership has steadily grown since opening of the metro netro netro netro in the predominant in the predominant of the metro netro netro in the predominant in the p

Qatar Rail also recognised the importance of the first and last miles in the metro journey. On this front, Qatar Rail is actively engaged and supported by the Ministry of Transport and Mowasalat (Karwa) to introduce first and last mile connectivity initiatives such as metrolink and metroexpress to encourage the use of metro.

Interms of operational performance, the metro witnessed several records, the first of which was in the first year of operation when it recorded the largest



number of passengers in one day during the 2019 Qatar National Day, transporting 333,000 passengers.

This number was recently surpassed during the FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022 on the fifth day of the tournament, November 24, 2022, when the metro set a record in the daily number of passengers by transporting more than 827,000 people in one day.

In terms of stations, Msheireb, the heart of Doha Metro and its central station connecting the three Metro lines, recorded the highest number of passengers travelling through it in one day during the World Cup with approximately 405,000 passengers, on December 2, 2022. **To Page 6**

Qatar 2022 souvenir tickets now available for purchase

Physical versions of mobile match tickets for the FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022 are on sale now, FIFA has said.

"You saw history made at the FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022 and now you can get a unique memento of your unforgettable experience to treasure forever," FIFA said in an e-mail to ticketholders.

The personalised tickets are available for QR10 each, including delivery, for a limited time only.

Original mobile match ticket buyers can log in to their account at FIFA. com/tickets and purchase the keepsakes for themselves and any guests who joined them at the games.

Orders can be processed until February 7, with the tickets distributed from late March.

All tickets included in a ticket application will be printed, which means that ticket purchasers will not be able



to select which tickets within a ticket application are printed.

All souvenir ticket purchases will be processed as a real-time transaction and customers will receive a confirmation email after payment is successfully completed.

Visa payment cards are the exclusive payment method accepted for residents of Qatar.

The FIFA website explains that "the price per souvenir ticket is fixed at QR10 and all tickets contained

within a single application number will be printed. The total price is calculated as QR10 multiplied by the number of tickets with the same application number. For example, if an original ticket purchaser purchased six tickets within a given ticket application (one for themselves and five for their guests), all six tickets will be printed. In this case, the cost would be QR60".

Only FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022 original ticket purchasers can purchase souvenir tickets related to the mobile tickets they owned for the tournament. Guests are not entitled to purchase souvenir tickets directly. "Please note that personal data, including ticket holder names, cannot be changed on a souvenir ticket," the website says.

FM: Gas most secure source of energy in decades to come

E the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Mohamed bin Abdulrahman al-Thani participated on Tuesday in a discussion session on the geopolitical changes in the world, within the framework of the 53rd World Economic Forum annual meeting in Davos, Switzerland.

During the session, HE Sheikh Mohamed asserted that gas is the cleanest and the most secure and reliable source of energy, and will remain appropriate and very vital in energy blend for decades to come.

He said that many policy-makers have unfortunately set extremely ambitious objectives without realising that such objectives would require time and a substantial amount of investment, then they stopped and most likely did allow investments in the last decade.

HE Sheikh Mohamed added that world countries have experienced energy poverty due to these policies, and unfortunately this has been accelerating due to the war in Ukraine.

Qatar did not pursue the approach of reducing the investment in gas, which allowed it to obtain such an additional expansion, allowing pumping more gas in 2027, specially to Europe, he pointed out.

He said that it is unfair that many developing countries are demanded not to develop their special resources and to be independent in the field of energy, while they are still in need of development, noting that many countries around the world see that rich countries are unfair and are requesting them to stop

developing their oil resources.

Regarding the Afghan issue, HE Sheikh Mohamed said that the recent procedures undertaken by the Afghan caretaker government were disappointing, adding that communication with all parties in Afghanistan is important because the alternative to dialogue in Afghanistan is a civil war.

He noted that Afghanistan suffered from war during the past few years, thus we can not expect that the agreement that took place between the US and Taliban will achieve peace in one day or even a year.

He considered that the Afghani dialogue was not conducted properly and that the latest

procedures would worsen the situation for the Afghani people, making the international community unable to deal with Afghanistan.

Regarding the conflict in Ukraine, HE Sheikh Mohamed referred to the UN Charter that was adopted by all countries, stressing that no one wishes to see a country use or threaten to use force against another country, we would all rather want to see all countries standing together abiding to the UN charter

He added that people in the Middle East have been suffering for decades from all violations of the UN Charter, including the Palestinian cause and the Israeli

Regarding the Afghan issue, HE **Sheikh Mohamed** said that the recent procedures undertaken by the **Afghan caretaker** government were disappointing, adding that communication with all parties in Afghanistan is important because the alternative to dialoque in Afghanistan is a civil war

occupation as well as the Syrian issue. "We wish to see the world standing against these violations, because, unfortunately, we still see them unaddressed, which constitutes a big concern to us, especially what is happening now in Palestine as provocative practices of Israel towards Palestinians are still occurring.

"In Qatar, we would like to see a real stance from our allies towards these provocative practices carried out by the Israeli government, which also applies to the suffering of the Syrian people and others.

"We truly wish to see an end to the war in Ukraine and we wish to see everyone abide by the UN Charter.

"We wish to see an end to the suffering of the Ukrainian people as soon as possible, as well as the sufferings of all other peoples of the world." Amir welcomed on arrival in Abu Dhabi

Cabinet approves draft law amending CMC regulations

E the Prime Minister and Minister of Interior Sheikh Khalid bin Khalifa bin Abdulaziz al-Thani chaired the Cabinet's regular meeting held yesterday morning at the Amiri Diwan. Following the meeting, HE the Minister of State for Cabinet Affairs issued

the following statement:
The Cabinet considered the topics on its agenda as follows:

First: Approval of a draft law amending some provisions of Law No 12 of 1998 concerning the regulations of the Central Municipal Council, and its referral to the Shura Council.

Second: Approval of a draft Cabinet decision on establishing a technical committee to study the fees for services provided by government agencies and define its functions. The functions of this committee include the following:
1- Study the proposals submitted by government agencies regarding determining or amending the fees for the services they provide in light of their respective legal basis.

2- Conduct the necessary evaluation of the fee and its suitability with the service proposed for it, and whether or not a fee should be imposed.

3- Study the effect of the required amendments on fees compared to the financial conditions of the groups targeted, and the extent to which this is affected by inflation conditions that may occur on economic activity in general.

Third — Approval of providing financial support to the United Nations Road Safety Fund (UNRS).

Fourth: Approval of a draft agreement on encouraging and protecting mutual investments between the governments of Qatar and Sao Tome and Principe.

Fifth: The Cabinet reviewed the following topics and took the appropriate decisions:

1- Approval of a draft law regulating security permits to enter concession and usufruct areas.

2- The first report of the team concerned with following up the implementation of the recommendations of the committee formed to prepare a study on chemicals and hazardous materials, dual-use materials, and chemical precursors in Oatar.

3.The outcomes of the 27th Conference of the Parties to the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (COP 27). (QNA)



Saudi cuts Umrah insurance cost for foreign pilgrims

In a move aimed at encouraging and facilitating Umrah pilgrimage, the Saudi Ministry of Haj and Umrah has announced a reduction in the insurance cost for foreign pilgrims. The ministry tweeted that the insurance fee has been reduced from SR235 to SR87, marking a 63% decrease. The visa procedures require visitors to get Umrah insurance that covers emergency treatments, admission, traffic accident injuries, hospitalisation, dental emergencies, pregnancy, dialysis cases and medical evacuations. Also, the insurance covers general cases such as permanent total disability and death due to natural disasters or other causes. The ministry said the insurance includes travelrelated coverage, such as flight delay and cancellation compensation. A person with the insurance can benefit up to 100,000 Saudi riyals. The duration of the coverage is 90 days from the date of entry into the country with its validity limited within Saudi only.

Only two falcons were able to hunt their prey during the afternoon session of the competitions of Haddad Al Tahadi (where the falcon has to hunt a homing pigeon within certain standards). One of the falcons is owned by a Kuwaiti falconer and the other by a Qatari falconer

A total of 58 falcons have qualified for the higher round of this competition since the start of the festival.

Shawi al-Kaabi, deputy head of Haddad Al Tahadi, pointed out that the ultimate upper hand yesterday was certainly for the homing pigeons as it was clear that most of the falcons were not fully prepared for the hunt. Some said that the strong winds gave pigeons advantage over the falcons but al-Kaabi stressed that the strong winds have equal effect on both the pigeons and the falcons, which shows the excellent skills of the pigeons.

Also, on Qatar National Day (December 18, 2022), which coincided with the FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022 final at Lusail Stadium, Lusail QNB station recorded more than 290,000 passengers.

Doha Metro is seamlessly connected to the Lusail Tram network through Legtaifiya station. the city. During these events, the Metro transported more than 1.2mn passengers.

In 2021, five sporting tournaments took place and during which the metro recorded approximately 2.5mn passengers. These events included the FIFA Club World Cup 2020, the final of the African Super Cup, the preliminary round of the joint Asian qualifiers, the qualifiers for the Arab Cup, and the FIFA Arab Cup Oatar 2021.

In addition, the various events and sports tournaments held in Qatar over the last three years enabled developing the operational expertise, and further enhancing customer experience and significantly contributed to the inte-

grated public transport system in the county. 



Airlines face hurdles to cashing in on China reopening

US and European airlines will benefit from pent-up demand for travel to China after its recent border reopening, but route approvals, fresh Covid-19 testing rules and not enough large aircraft remain barriers to rising sales, analysts and industry officials say.

Travel is returning to China, the world's largest outbound tourism market worth \$255bn in 2019, after the country ended mandatory quarantines on January 8. Airfares from China are now 160% higher than before the pandemic, data from travel firm ForwardKeys shows, due to limited supply.

Iowa-based lawyer Jinying Zhan, 50, said he paid \$1,600 for a oneway ticket in December to fly via Chicago and Dubai to Guangzhou.

"I haven't visited my family in three years, so I will go to the spring festival with my sisters," he said. "Flights were very expensive." Before the pandemic, he used to pay \$1,000-1,500 for a round trip direct flight from Chicago.

A round-trip fare from San Francisco to Shanghai on United Airlines for a week-long trip in early March costs \$3,852 in economy class and \$18,369 in business class, according to a Reuters search on the airline's website.

Global airlines are running only 11% of 2019 capacity levels to and from China in January, Cirium data shows, but the figure is expected to hit 25% by April.

Booking website Expedia said it saw US-China and Europe-China searches double after the reopening announcement.

Chinese airlines, with ample staff and widebody planes, and a cost and time advantage of roughly two hours from flying a more direct route using Russian airspace, are expected to be early winners.

But US and European airlines, which have focused traditionally on the strong business travel market to China, and often cater more to the preferences of Western passengers, are poised to benefit from companies willing to pay a premium to rekindle face-to-face ties.

Trips to China "are already on the books for many companies and travellers as they kick off a new business year," said Suzanne Neufang, chief executive of the Global Business Travel Association.

China's reopening comes as surging Covid infections have led the United States, Japan and others to require negative coronavirus tests from Chinese arrivals, discouraging travel.

Since regulatory approval from both countries is required to add flights, at a time of US-China

trade tensions, short-term capacity could be limited, industry sources said.

United, which had 584 flights to and from China in January 2019 according to Cirium, can now fly four times weekly from the US to

mainland China. United said it could add services pending government authorisations.

"There are some things brewing," said US Deputy Transportation

Foreign carriers seeking to add flights to China require approvals from the Civil Aviation Administration of China, which did not respond

to a request for comment.

American Airlines said this week it would fly non-stop from Dallas to Shanghai twice-weekly from March, dropping a current stop in Seoul. However, other flights were paused as it assessed market demand and

Delta Air Lines expects to cautiously "rebuild capacity to China in line with demand starting later this year," President Glen Hauenstein

said when the company reported quarterly results.

China, which accounted for about 5-6% of long-haul travel from Europe in 2019, is also a key market for some European carriers including Germany's Lufthansa, Bernstein analyst Alex Irving said.

But European and US carriers may prioritise their wide body planes for lucrative trans-Atlantic travel this summer, leaving them stretched to accommodate fresh demand for China, said George Dimitroff, an



Russian aggression has undermined populism

While populists with pro-Russian leanings have been marginalised, those who have come out in support of Ukraine have been welcomed back into the fold

ussia's war in Ukraine has affected political life in countries around the world, and this influence has been greater in the countries that are politically closest not to Ukraine but to Russia. Because Ukraine is a democracy and Russia is an authoritarian kleptocracy, the war has highlighted a fundamental clash between alternative political systems. This dynamic raises the stakes considerably, because a military defeat for the democracy could be an invitation to dictators elsewhere to pursue their own conquests.

Fortunately, as the war has dragged on, the spectre of populism has receded in Europe, where it has been overshadowed by the larger threat of a Russia victory. While those populists with pro-Russian leanings have been marginalised, those who have moderated and come out in support of Ukraine have been welcomed back into the fold, despite having spent years undermining democracy at home.

For example, before the Russian invasion, Polish President Andrzej Duda was receiving a cold shoulder just about everywhere in the West. Yet his staunch support of Ukraine has turned him into a key participant in major transatlantic and European meetings, and an important partner to antipopulist Western politicians, not least US President Joe Biden.

At the same time, Duda himself has become less populist. Never an independent thinker or politician, he now takes his cues from the American embassy, rather than from Law and Justice (PiS) party leader Jarosław Kaczynski, to whom he owes his current position. Duda seems to have concluded that Kaczynski cannot hope to reward him with the kind of international profile that the Americans can.

Meanwhile, pro-Russian populists have fallen out of favour almost everywhere. The notable exception is Hungarian Prime Minister Viktor Orbán, who has long convinced Hungarian voters that their country can occupy the best of all possible economic worlds by juggling relations with Russia, China, and the European Union. But even Orbán has had to soften his position. He has not dared to block the bulk of Western sanctions against Russia, because he knows that he must play nice with the EU to receive Covid recovery-package funds that have been withheld as a result of his rule-of-law violations. Orbán is thus in limbo - neither a pariah nor a partner to leaders in Washington, London, or even Berlin.

But the previously ironclad Kaczynski-Orbán axis is finished. Poland is supplying Ukraine with every kind of weapon, including more than 200 tanks; and it has just declared that it will be the first country to furnish German Leopard 2s. By contrast, Hungary not only refuses to help Ukraine, but is also transmitting Russian propaganda through its government-controlled media channels.

As a result, relations between Warsaw and Budapest have chilled, with Kaczynski even criticising Orbán directly. "We can't co-operate as before," he complains: "If Prime Minister Orbán says he doesn't see exactly what happened in Bucza [Bucha, the site of Russian atrocities early in the war], he should be advised to go to an ophthalmologist."

When it comes to military, territorial, or economic bargaining power, Orbán cannot hope to compete with Turkiye's president, Recep Tayyip Erdogan. While Orbán is still grasping for crumbs from larger powers' tables, Erdogan's international standing has grown overnight. Western leaders must give him what he wants to secure Finland and Sweden's entry into Nato, and the Kremlin must work with him to prevent Turkiye from joining the sanctions and embargoes on Russian raw materials, goods, and technologies.

Turkiye's relations with Russia do not prevent it from having good relations with Ukraine. It was Turkiye that negotiated the prisoner exchanges and limited ceasefires needed to unblock Ukrainian exports through the Black Sea.

Importantly, while Ukraine's defeat is not in Turkiye's interest, a total Russian defeat also is not in its interest. A diminished Russia would reduce Turkiye's clout within Nato, and Turkiye is also an economic beneficiary of the sanctions against Russia (despite the loss of millions of regular tourists from Russia and Ukraine). With Erdo an a responsible global actor, he may have markedly improved his chances of winning re-election this Spring, despite an economic crisis and rampant inflation.

While individual populists have either moderated their positions or been marginalised, the broader "populist international" has become

more fractured with the loss of its
Russian patron. Western politicians
can no longer walk around in pro-Putin
t-shirts, as the Italian nationalist
leader Matteo Salvini once did, or
borrow money from Russian banks, as
the French right-wing leader Marine
Le Pen's party has done. Pro-Russian
and anti-Nato views are no longer
acceptable. In 2022, the German
pro-Russian parties Alternative für
Deutschland and Die Linke lost local
elections across the board.

Populists also suffered losses in elections in the United States and France, and Russia's war of aggression was certainly one reason. Candidates backed by former US president Donald Trump – an open admirer of Putin – were roundly defeated in the US midterms. And in the French presidential and parliamentary elections last spring, Le Pen and the left-wing leader Jean-Luc Mélenchon's sympathies for Russia did not go unnoticed.

If the pro-Russian populist former Czech prime minister Andrej Babiš loses this week's presidential election to Petr Pavel, the former head of Nato's Military Committee, that, too, will be partly because of Russia's war.

But we should remain only cautiously optimistic. The New Year could always bring a trend reversal. If fatigue with the refugee crisis and high inflation deepens, today's discredited populists will be the natural beneficiaries.

UN chief slams oil firms for 'big lie' on global warming

UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres skewered oil firms yesterday for having "peddled the big lie" about their role in global warming, telling the World Economic Forum that they should be held accountable.

Addressing a room full of the world's business and political elite, Guterres drew a parallel between the actions of oil companies and those of tobacco companies that have been hit by huge lawsuits over the adverse effects of cigarettes.

"We learned last week that certain fossil fuel producers were fully aware in the 1970s that their core product was baking our planet," Guterres

He was referring to a study published in the journal Science that said ExxonMobil had dismissed the findings of its own scientists on the role of fossil fuels in climate change.

"Just like the tobacco industry, they rode roughshod over their own science," Guterres said, referring to lawsuits that determined cigarette companies had hidden the dangers of their products.

"Some in Big Oil peddled the big lie. And like the tobacco industry, those responsible must be held to account," he said.

In 1998, US states won a landmark settlement against tobacco companies worth \$246bn aimed at recovering the costs of treating smokers from the harmful effects of cigarettes.

The study on ExxonMobil found that the firm's scientists had modelled and predicted global warming "with shocking accuracy", only for the company "to spend the next couple of decades denying that very climate science"

ExxonMobil is the target of a number of lawsuits in the United States.

Microsoft to shed 10,000 jobs amid recession blues

Microsoft Corp vesterday said it would eliminate 10,000 jobs and take a \$1.2bn charge to earnings, as its cloud-computing customers reassess their spending and the company braces for potential

The layoffs, far larger than cuts by Microsoft last year, add to the tens of thousands of job cuts across the technology sector, which has downshifted following a strong growth period during the

The news comes even as the software maker is set to ramp up spending in generative artificial intelligence that the industry sees as the new bright spot. In a note to employees, CEO Satya Nadella attempted to address the divergent realities.

Customers wanted to "optimise their digital spend to do more with less" and "exercise caution as some parts of the world are in a recession and other parts are anticipating one," he said. "At the same time, the next major wave of computing is being born with advances in Al."

Nadella said the layoffs, affecting less than 5% of Microsoft's workforce, would conclude by the end of March, with notifications beginning yesterday. However, Microsoft would keep hiring in "strategic

Al is likely to be one of those areas. Nadella this week touted AI to world leaders gathered in Davos, Switzerland, claiming the technology would transform its products and touch people around the

Microsoft has looked at adding to its \$1bn stake in OpenAl, the startup behind the Silicon Valley chathot sensation known as ChatGPT, which Microsoft plans to soon market through its cloud service.

French city asks Madonna for loan of lost painting

The mayor of Amiens in northern France has released a video "requesting" that Madonna "loan" the city a painting from her personal collection, which resembles one lost there during World War I. The 19th-century work, "Diane and Endymion" by artist Jerome-Martin Langlois, is "likely" the same one "loaned by the Louvre to the Fine Art Museum in Amiens before World War I and which subsequently disappeared", Brigitte Foure said in a video message to the Queen of Pop posted on Facebook.

"Obviously, we don't dispute in any way the legal acquisition that you made of this work," Foure

Instead she asked the singer for a "loan" to exhibit it in 2028, when Amiens hopes to be the year's European Capital of Culture. Lending the image would allow "the inhabitants to

discover this work and enjoy it," the mayor said. The painting's possible provenance was suggested by newspaper Le Figaro in an investigation published this month

Sold at auction for \$1.3mn to Madonna in 1989. an art conservator spotted the monumental work in a photo of her home published in magazine *Paris*

In rare attack, polar bear kills 2 people in Alaska

A polar bear on a rampage killed a woman and a boy in a remote area of Alaska, police said, in a rare attack on humans. The bear was itself then shot and killed by a resident in the tiny community of Wales, on the far western coast of Alaska. "Initial reports indicate that a polar bear had entered the community and had chased multiple residents," police said in a statement on Tuesday's attack. The bear fatally attacked an adult female and juvenile male – it was shot and killed by a local resident as it attacked the pair," police said, adding that state troopers and Fish and Game Department authorities were trying to reach the town "as weather conditions allow." The victims' identities were not made public as authorities were trying to notify their families. Polar bear attacks are extremely rare, with local media reporting one of the most recent fatal encounters between a human and polar bear in Alaska was in 1990. According to Canadian NGO Polar Bears International, only 20 people worldwide are known to have been killed by polar bears between 1870 and 2014, though the frequency

Ukraine copter crash kills interior minister

kraine's interior minister and a child were among at least 14 people killed yesterday when a helicopter crashed into a nursery and set it ablaze in a suburb of the capital Kyiv.

Separately, Ukraine said its forces again blunted Russian attempts to advance on the front-line city Bakhmut hundreds of kilometres away in the east, where both sides have taken heavy losses for scant gain in trench warfare since November.

Ukrainian officials said it was too early to determine what caused the helicopter crash. None immediately spoke of any attack by Russia, which invaded Ukraine last February and has been battering Ukrainian cities often far from front lines with missiles almost daily since October.

Dozens of people were injured including children, many suffering burns, after the French-made Super Puma helicopter went down in the fog in Brovary on the eastern outskirts of Kyiv, plummeting into the nursery grounds.

Ukrainian state emergency services said 14 people in total had been killed. Government agencies had earlier published higher death tolls ranging up to 18.

Interior Minister Denys Monastyrskyi, who was on board the helicopter, was among the dead. He was the most senior Ukrainian official to die since the war began with a Russian invasion in February last year. Residents described a frantic res-

"We saw wounded people, we saw children. There was a lot of fog here, everything was strewn all around. We could hear screams, we ran towards them," Hlib, a 17-yearold local resident, told Reuters. "We took the children and passed them over the fence, away from the nurs-

Indian diamond heiress, 8, loses fortune for monkhood

An eight-year-old girl in India who stood to inherit a multimillion-dollar diamond fortune has instead been inducted as a nun to a strict religious order after renouncing worldly pleasures.

Devanshi Sanghvi was, until this week, an heiress to the Sanghvi and Sons jewellery business in the western city of Surat, known locally as "Diamond City" for its prominence in the global gem

Her family are also members of the Jain faith, a small but ancient Indian religion that preaches non-violence, strict vegetarianism and love for all creatures great and small. This week, she was feted in a four-day ceremony to herald her new vocation, which at one point saw her ride in a carriage pulled by an elephant, according to pictures shared on local media. Yesterday, she arrived at a temple to trade her elaborate

garments for a simple white cotton outfit, after having all her hair removed. Sanghvi was known among members of Surat's Jain community for her piousness even as a young child, according to a witness to yesterday's ceremony, who spoke to AFP on condition of anonymity

"Devanshi has never watched television, movies or gone to malls and restaurants," they said, adding that the girl had been a regular presence at temple ceremonies. The child is one of the youngest people to have taken the "diksha" ceremony to abandon their material possessions and enter the Jain monkhood.

Sanghvi's parents said she had been eager to become a nun, according to local media. Jain

families are sometimes said to encourage their children to enter the monkhood to enhance their relatives' social

Her family's business, founded in 1981, has a net worth of Rs5bn (\$61mn) according to ICRA, an Indian credit rating agency.

Jainism has more than four million followers in India. many - such as Sanghvi's

family – from affluent trading communities. Followers adhere to a strict vegetarian diet and some monks and nuns cover their mouths with fabric to prevent them from accidentally

swallowing insects. The religion has come under criticism for some of its ritual practices, particularly for a tradition of extreme fasts to the death.

A 13-year-old girl in Hyderabad fell into a coma and died in 2016 while undertaking a two-month fast as an act of penance, during which she was only allowed to drink warm water twice a day. Her parents were charged by police with manslaughter and were subject to public outrage over claims the family had forced her into the fast.

Philippine Nobel laureate acquitted of tax evasion

Philippine Nobel Prize winner Maria Ressa was yesterday acquitted of tax evasion, among a slew of charges she has long maintained are politically motivated, calling the verdict a victory for "truth". Ressa, who shared the Nobel Peace Prize with Russian journalist Dmitry Muratov in 2021, still faces three other cases, including a cyber libel conviction now under appeal that could mean nearly seven years in

"Today, facts win. Truth wins," a teary-eyed and defiant Ressa told reporters outside the Manila



courtroom after the ruling on four government charges that she and her online media company Rappler had dodged taxes in a 2015 bond sale to foreign investors.

It was her first court acquittal since former president Rodrigo Duterte's government began filing charges against her. Ressa had earlier termed the cases "politically motivated" and "a brazen abuse of power".

The tax court said prosecutors failed to prove "beyond reasonable" doubt" that Ressa and Rappler had evaded income taxes.

Modi govt mulls banning news identified as 'fake'

India's government will not permit social media platforms to host any information that it identifies as false, according to a draft proposal of the country's IT rules released this week.

This is the latest in a slew of measures by Prime Minister Narendra Modi's government that are being seen as efforts to rein in big tech Any information identified as "fake or false" by the Press Information

Bureau (PIB), or by any other agency authorised for fact-checking by the government or "by its department in which such business is transacted", would be prohibited under the draft.

Once information was identified as such, social media platforms or other "online intermediaries" would have to "make reasonable efforts" to ensure users do not "host, display, upload, modify, publish, transmit, store, update or share" such information, it added.

In October, the government announced a panel would be set up to hear complaints from users regarding content moderation decisions of social media firms, which are already required to appoint in-house grievance redressal officers and executives to co-ordinate with law enforcement officials.

The government has also repeatedly been involved in tussles with various platforms when they failed to heed demands that certain content or accounts be taken down for allegedly spreading

Fugitive tiger euthanised in South Africa after attacks

A tiger which escaped from a farm and roamed the countryside outside of Johannesburg for four days, attacking a man and killing several animals, was euthanised yesterday.

The tiger's breakout and eventual killing has reignited concerns over South Africa's legal and flourishing breeding of big cats. The eight-year-old female Bengal tiger was put down just before dawn after it killed a dog, the latest in a series of attacks that followed its escape from an enclosure at a private farm on Saturday, Gresham Mandy, a member of a local safety volunteer group in Walkerville, 30km south of Johannesburg, told AFP.

Tigers are not native to South Africa, but in recent years their rearing has become common in the country, where they are owned as pets or bred for commercial exports.

One month on: 5bn engaged with World Cup, 1.5bn watched final

n December 18, 2022, 88,966 spectators packed into Lusail Stadium and close to 1.5bn around the world watched a pulsating final between Argentina and France. One month to the day since Lionel Messi, Lionel Scaloni and La Albiceleste lifted the trophy, FIFA has reviewed some facts and figures from on and off the pitch, which reflect the sheer scale of the biggest single sporting event on the planet.

Early figures suggest that around 5bn people have engaged with the FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022, following tournament content across an array of platforms and devices across the media universe. On social media, according to Nielsen, there have been 93.6mn posts across all platforms, with a 262bn cumulative reach and 5.95bn engagements.

The FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022 was enjoyed inside the stadiums by 3.4mn spectators - up from 3mn in 2018 - who were treated to a historic tournament. A total of 172 goals ensured that Qatar 2022 became the highest scoring FIFA World Cup in

history, eclipsing the previous highest total of 171, in both 1998 and 2014.

Three matches at Lusail Stadium, including the final, saw the highest attendance for a match registered at a FIFA World Cup since USA 1994 when Brazil played Italy in front of 94,194 at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena.

It was a tournament too of notable contributions from some of football's heavyweights. Cristiano Ronaldo became the first man to score at five FIFA World Cups (2006, 2010, 2014, 2018 and 2022) while Lionel Messi became the first player to score in four successive knockout stage matches in a FIFA World Cup since the round of 16 was introduced into the modern era, at Mexico 1986. Messi also passed another landmark when his 26th FIFA World Cup appearance in the final, overtaking the record previously held by Lothar Matthaus.

The fastest goal came after just 68 seconds when Canada's Alphonso Davies, 22, scored against Croatia. At just 18 years and 110 days, Spain's Gavi became the youngest goal scorer at

a World Cup since Pele in 1958, with a stunning strike during the 7-0 win against Costa Rica.

There were many other notable achievements:

• Stephanie Frappart became the first woman in FIFA World Cup history to referee a finals match. Together with assistants Neuza Back and Karen Diaz, she composed the first-ever female trio to officiate in the tourna-

 The eight group stage winners included teams from four different confederations for only the third time, and the first in 20 years (1986, 2002, 2022).

• Three teams from the AFC reached the round of 16 for the first time in FIFA World Cup his-

• Qatar 2022 was the first time an African or Arab team

made it to the semi-final, with Morocco's incredible campaign uniting the Middle East and Arab

● 1.85mn visitors attended the FIFA Fan Festival in Doha, which had its own anthem for the first time – 'Tukoh Taka' was one of the nine songs of the first-ever FIFA World Cup Official Soundtrack, which generated 450mn views on YouTube.

• In a record-breaking first, FIFA+ live-streamed the entire tournament in Brazil, partnering with the likes of YouTube streamer Casimiro and Brazilian legend Ronaldo to deliver an innovative and engaging product to a new generation of fans.

• All global and regional sponsorship packages were sold out, with the 32 commercial affiliates activating more than 600 special marketing programmes.

No tournament can run without the incredible hard work behind the scenes. The FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022 was supported by 20,000 volunteers, selected from 150 nationalities. 17,000 volunteers were residents of Qatar; 3,000 were international. The volunteers ranged in age

from 18-77 years. In total, there were 180,000 accredited people working to make the tournament a success, including more than 10,000 media representatives who shared their impressions and images with the world as football history was being made.

Qatar 2022 also featured a number of firsts in the areas of workers' welfare and sustainability. This was the first FIFA World Cup to offer audio-descriptive commentary for blind and partially sighted fans globally through the Internet, with the service being available in English and Arabic. Three stadiums hosted sensory rooms for fans with sensory access requirements, while every match venue was built to exacting acing accessible parking, seating, bathrooms and concession
