#### THE PISQ ODYSSEY

#### A Report on School's Progress, Achievements, and Accolades

f children are the capital assets of a country, then schools are undoubtedly the banks. They are the banks of knowledge where children stay for a fixed time to become affluent and ready to go about the life business that awaits ahead. Pakistan International School, Qatar (PISQ) is also one such bank that has been taking care of the capital assets of the Pakistani community in its best capacity over the years, and it is quite a journey – an odyssey. In this ongoing odyssey, PISQ's academic year 2022-2023 is nearing its end, and here is the report of some gains and progress.

#### Milestones in Academic

On the academic side, the school has progressed incrementally.

- So it happened that PISQ's total 40 students scored A1 grades in Federal Board Annual Examination 2022 at SSC level 16 students grabbed top 16 positions at HSSC level in all Federal Board-affiliated institutions in Doha. Surpassing all Doha-based Pakistani schools with top performance, 10 students of PISQ crossed the 1000-mark threshold. This year, total students appeared in the HSSC-II examination out of which 163 students passed with 99.39 % result. The school made an impressive show of academic excellence with 49 A1, 45 A, 49 B grades.
- The same tradition of earning success was upheld by the newly operative Cambridge Wing of PISQ. In May/June 2022, in the first post-Covid physical Cambridge IGCSE Examination, 58 students appeared in the examination and 36 students secured A\* and A's in multiple subjects. In addition, Cambridge Wing's Year 11 students the passing out IGCSE class Khadija Yousaf and Noura Muhammad scored 7 A\*; whereas, Maheen Rahat, Rumaisa Attique, Hakeemat Opeyemi, and Omer Said of the same class bagged 6 A\*.

- International opportunities for higher education are the focus of every progressive school. Being fully cognizant of this fact, on 08 March 2023, PISQ held a "Yes 2 Malaysia School Roadshow" wherein representatives of 10 notable universities of Malaysia guided and counselled the college section students of Boys, Girls, and Cambridge Wings. In addition to the student attendees, a sizeable number of parents also attended the gathering and expressed their gratitude to the management of the school for arranging such a relevant and fruitful event.
- Aiming at students' academic well-being and facilitation, PISQ has taken a step further
  for the students who plan to go abroad. The school partnered with the British Council
  on 6th March 2023 in order to become its affiliated IELTS Test Center. This step is going
  to be beneficial for the students and staff of the school in many ways as they will be
  availing themselves of solid professional guidance and practical tips for taking IELTS
  confidently.
- Competition a positive and healthy competition is a key ingredient in the development of confidence and creativity in students during their school life. With this target in sight, PISQ held its signature "Literary Competition" on 26 January 2023. This time, 28 schools took part in this program wherein the students poured out the best of their creative side in the events of essay writing, dramatic declamation, poetic recital, storytelling, etc.

Khadija, a student from the Cambridge Wing, and Rubab, a student from the Girls' Wing, won the Best Mention in Security Council and the Best Diplomat titles respectively.

Technology is considered the biggest equalizer and has empowered women giving them access to online education and work opportunities. The panelists then discussed





In order to increase the ship repair capacity a state-of-the-art Ship Lift & Transfer System (SLTS) has been installed at KS&EW. This system is fully operational since Sept 2021 and capable to lift ships up to 7300 tons with 12 x parking stations for al kind of above water repairs.

Afterward scope of work has been extended to undertake various services including metallurgical analysis, mechanical, physical, chemical, and welding tests required for external customers. Services range also covers the chemical composition, testing of metals, ferrous and non-ferrous, alloys, refractory, cement etc. The tests are carried out in accordance with BSS/ASTM standards and/or any other classification / standard to comply customer's specific requirement.



The Shipyard Training School (STS) was established in 1957 as an apprentice training school for Marine Engineering. The school has provided prime facilities for technical training of officers, supervisors and workers to enhance their skills in various trades. STS is also contributing to skill development and employment opportunities. Currently, school is undertaking various diplomas, and numerous vocational courses in electrical, mechanical and ship construction technologies etc. STS have so far trained more than 25,000 young entrants in different cadres. It also runs internship programs for engineers and diploma holders. The courses are affiliated with STEVTA (Sindh Technical Education & Vocational Training), some of these courses are run in collaboration and sponsorship of NAVTTC (National Vocational and Technical Training Commission). STS is also certified by Saudi Government to conduct TAKAMOL - Skill Development Program and authorized by TUV Rhineland Centre, Germany for conducting advanced training for metal fabrication and welding

KS&EW is the only shipyard of Pakistan and has been silently serving the nation since 1956 with continuous effort in Nation Building and carrying the mandate of "Made in Pakistan". KS&EW has also played a pivotal role in transferring of technologies and broadening the industrial base of country. KS&EW has constructed over 500 vessels of different sizes and repaired more than 5000 vessels and has the capacity to provide new as well as replacement of all floating platforms up to 26000 DWT.



The United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, a collection of 17 interlinked objectives, are at the core of the thought process for our learners to discuss, think, research, propose and present new and innovative solutions to the world's challenges.

The school's Youth Leadership Programme is a unique platform which reflects the school's mission and vision of fostering globally responsible citizens. The Youth Leadership Programme (YLP) is an initiative that provides students from Kindergarten to Year 13 with a platform to explore global and local challenges they are interested in. Students during YLP conduct in-depth research, hold discussions with industry experts, and come up with new and innovative solutions to challenges they feel strongly about.



These YLP projects are linked to the United Nation's Sustainable Development Goals and the Qatar National Vision 2030. In the past, our students have been interested in learning about SDG 15 - Life on Land and have conducted several projects exploring the sustainability goal from different angles. While one class answered the big question: 'How do modern planting techniques like "Hydroponics" help grow plants in desert areas like Qatar?', the other class looked at, 'What are some of the problems that arise in Qatar in relation to hunting and habitat loss?

Another frequently researched topic has been SDG 11 -Sustainable Cities and Communities, where students explored the importance of sustainability and why solar panels are not extensively used in Qatar, even though sunlight is abundant.

TNG Students also participate in research-oriented initiatives such as the Qatar National Scientific Research Competitions

organized by the Ministry of Education and Higher Education, Qatar Environment and Energy Research Institute, QEERI, HBKU, and the Weill Cornell Research Competition.

"TNG students focus on topics that are important in the global and Qatari contexts and conduct their research on topics that range from 'Cost Efficient Light Bulbs for War Struck Countries' to 'Terminating the alarming increase of food waste in Qatar' to 'Accept the Specially Abled - Williams Syndrome and Down Syndrome."

In participating in such research competitions, our students create cross-curricular links, make global

connections with what they have learned, and take their learning beyond classroom teaching.

TNG students also participate in numerous other national sustainability initiatives, such as the National Sustainability Campaign and Qatar Sustainability Week. These projects and engagements raise awareness of sustainable consumption and production and allow students to learn about sustainability in a meaningful learning environment.

At TNG, we believe in providing our students with a safe, secure, and engaging learning environment where they are encouraged to become independent learners and inspired to become globally responsible citizens. We believe in providing students with internal and external platforms that allow students to look at local and global contexts and make global connections.




