Lopez, players delighted with dream Asian Cup run

The coach, who was roped in five weeks before the tournament, says he is going back to Al Wakrah

Head coach Marquez Lopez lauded his Qatar players for their composure and focus in their 3-1 victory over Jordan in the AFC Asian Cup Qatar 2023 final on Saturday.

The hosts produced a dominant display from start to finish with Akram Afif netting a hat-trick of penalties to seal the victory at a packed Lusail Stadium, a victory which meant back-to-back AFC Asian Cup titles for Qatar.

"I'm extremely happy and I congratulate the Qatari people and the players. We are so happy that we won the match. The tension was high.

"Maybe it was not beautiful football but everyone remembers the winner and I'm proud of my players and their achievements," said Lopez.

Afif's hat-trick took his tally to eight, with his performances landing him the Most Valuable Player and AFC Asian Cup Qatar 2023 Yili Top Scorer Awards, and Lopez was effusive in his praise of the striker.

"I'm happy Akram (Afif) won both the awards and he deserves to win them."

Qatar became only the fifth nation to win back-to-back AFC Asian Cup titles with Lopez having masterminded the triumph despite having only taken charge in December.

"I have been working in Qatar and I know the players well. It was

easy to work with them and they effectively implemented our ideas on the field.

"For now, I'm going to go back to work with Al Wakrah (in the Qatar Stars League). I'm not sure what will happen but we will enjoy the moment for now."

Abdulaziz Hatem, the Annabi midfielder, yesterday said his team deserved to win the Asian Cup final.

The 33-year-old said after the

match: "A new chapter has been added in Qatar football history. It was certainly not an easy success."

Hatem added: "This achievement was recorded thanks to the great work and collective efforts by everyone. What distinguished the team in this tournament was that we were far from being touted as the favourite. We were able to provide a distinguished level in all matches to reach the final and win the title.

"I thank all my fellow players for what they provided in the matches and the technical staff, which was able to play a major role in us winning the title for the second time in a row."

Defender Tareq Salman praised Al Annabi's performance and victory over its Jordanian counterpart in the final.

Salman said: "I thank God for this amazing win. My teammates delivering a crowning perform-

ance is indeed a new chapter in our football history. We extend our congratulations to everyone. It was a difficult tournament that we entered while we were far from being favourites.

"Perhaps this thing helped us a lot in avoiding pressures and we played normally in the first round as well as in the final against Jordan."

He said: "I congratulate everyone on this achievement, which

was the result of teamwork from the management, technical staff and players, as well as the fans who played a major role by supporting the team throughout the tournament.

"We lived a special night to win the Asian Cup title in our homeland and among our fans.

"We previously won the title, but among our fans, the tournament has a special taste, the sweet taste of a title win," he concluded.

Afif coy on Europe after guiding Qatar to Asian title

DOHA: Qatar's **Akram Afif** underlined his credentials as one of Asia's finest forwards with a hat-trick in the Asian Cup final to guide his team to back-to-back titles, but the forward was coy on playing for another European club in future.

Afif netted three penalties in the 3-1 victory over Jordan, and he bagged a treble of individual awards: player of the match, most valuable player of the tournament, and top scorer with eight goals.

Opposition coaches who have faced him have praised his skills, with Tajikistan's Petar Segrt saying it was only a question of time and whether the 27-year-old Al Sadd forward wanted to return to Europe.

Since leading Qatar to the 2019 title with a tournament record 10 assists, Afif has become one of Asia's most-feared players.

At the start of this tournament, he said he had dreams of returning to Europe having

previously played for Eupen in the Belgian Pro League. He later became the first Qatari player to be signed by a LaLiga club when he moved to Villarreal in 2016, but he was loaned out to Sporting Gijon before returning to Eupen and finally to Al Sadd in 2018.

He has since developed and is arguably playing at his peak based on his Asian Cup exploits.

"I talked about becoming a professional player (in Europe). But it's not me who decides. My wife also has to make the decision for me. It's not easy to leave the club and country," Afif told reporters after the final. But he added: "I'd love to become a professional player (in Europe) ... I'd say I would love to go."

BACK-TO-BACK
For now, he will enjoy helping Qatar become only the fifth country to successfully defend their Asian Cup crown.

"We're happy and we will enjoy until the next Asian Cup. Then we'll see what happens," he added.

Coach Marquez Lopez was appointed only in December when Portuguese coach Carlos Queiroz abruptly parted company with the national team.

But Lopez, who came in from Qatari side Al Wakrah, managed to implement his philosophy despite taking charge less than a month before the Asian Cup. The Spaniard did not say if he would stay in the job long-term, however.

"What will happen is I'll go back to Al Wakrah. I haven't talked about the future," Lopez said. "I took charge only recently but what was most important was that I know the players, they implemented my ideas very fast.

"In some matches we didn't deliver our best, but in others we were better and exceeded expectations."

Young Pan sets 100m freestyle world record

The teen clocked 46.80secs, eclipsing previous mark of 46.86secs

Chinese teenager Pan Zhanle broke the men's 100m freestyle world record with a time of 46.80sec at the world championships in Doha yesterday.

Pan achieved the new mark leading off his team during the 4x100m freestyle relay to set up teammates Ji Xinjie, Zhang Zhan-shuo and Wang Haoyu to seal gold for China in 3minutes 11:08seconds.

The 19-year-old shaved 0.06sec off the previous record of 46.86 achieved by Romanian David Popovici at the European championships in Rome in August 2022.

"Yeah, it was an incredible time. I trusted my friends and we did our best," Pan said.

"I said to myself 'swim hard'. I was shocked when I saw the time, I didn't expect to break the world record now, I wanted to keep it for the Paris Olympics."

Italy took silver in 3:12.08 and the United States bronze in 3:12.29. Before these worlds Pan had only one world medal, silver in the 4x100m freestyle relay last year in Fukuoka, Japan.

He also has three Asian Games titles, including the 100m. His previous personal best was 46.97, which made him the fifth fastest man in the world before arriving in Qatar.

Earlier South Korea's Kim Woo-min won gold in the men's 400m freestyle on the first day of the swimming competition.

Kim clocked 3 minutes 42.71 seconds to edge out Australia's Elijah Winnington, the 2022 world champion. Germany's Lukas Martens took third place.

The 22-year-old Kim was

on course to break Paul Biedermann's world record going into the final 100m but couldn't maintain the pace and finished over two seconds off the German's mark, set in 2009.

Olympic champion Ahmed Hafnaoui of Tunisia was a surprise casualty in the heats, coming a lowly 17th overall and missing out on a place in the final.

New Zealand's Erika Fairweather cruised to victory in the women's 400m freestyle, touching the wall over two seconds clear of China's Li Bingjie. Isabel Gose of Germany claimed the bronze.

Beijing to host 2029 world swimming championships

Beijing will host the 2029 World Aquatics Championships, becoming the second Chinese city to do so after Shanghai in 2011,

World Aquatics announced yesterday.

An aquatics hotspot, Beijing has hosted 15 editions of the World Aquatics Swimming World Cup, along with multiple World Cup events in swimming, diving, artistic swimming and water polo. China also hosted both the World Aquatics Swimming Championships (25m) in Hangzhou in 2018 and the World Aquatics Championships in Shanghai in 2011.

Yesterday's announcement comes in the middle of the present world championships in Doha where China dominated the first week taking 16 golds out of 29 events to top the medal table.

"World Aquatics today confirmed that the Chinese capital will host the World Aquatics Championships - Beijing 2029," read a statement by World Aquatics. "The flagship World Aquatics

event will welcome more than 2,500 world-class athletes from over 200 countries and regions to compete in the six aquatic sports of swimming, diving, water polo, artistic swimming, open water swimming and high diving."

China Swimming Association President Zhou Jihong said the awarding of the hosting rights fitted in with the Chinese love of aquatic sports.

"We have a very proud history of welcoming the best aquatic athletes to our country," she said yesterday.

"We are therefore very honoured with Beijing being awarded the opportunity to host the world's largest aquatic event, the World Aquatics Championships, in 2029."

Singapore and Budapest will host the 2025 and 2027 editions respectively.

The first round of the Qatar TotalEnergies Open, which is hosted by the Qatar Tennis Federation on the courts of the Khalifa International Tennis and Squash Complex, began yesterday with the participation of the world top ranked players.

Czech Katerina Siniakova (22) qualified for the second round by defeating Croatian Donna Vekic (28th seed) 7-5, 6-1.

Ukrainian Marta Kostyuk (30) also advanced to the second round, after defeating US Caroline Dolehide (43) 6-3, 7-5.

Belgian Greet Minnen (54) achieved an easy victory over the German Maria Tatjana (49) 6-1, 6-1, and Russia's Ekaterina Alexandrova (19) defeated Bulgaria's Victoriya Tomova (64) 7-6, 6-3.

Ukrainian Lesia Tsurenko (37) qualified for the second round after a hard-fought win over Turkish Zeynep Sonmez (184) 7-5, 6-3.

Rybakina cruises past Kasatkina to claim Abu Dhabi title

Top seed Elena Rybakina powered to a 6-1 6-4 win over Russian Daria Kasatkina in the final of the Abu Dhabi Open yesterday to lift her second trophy of the season and seventh overall.

The 2022 Wimbledon champion began the contest on Stadium Court in typically dominant fashion to grab an early break, but seventh seed Kasatkina struck back with one of her own only to fall behind again in blustery conditions.

Rybakina regained composure to go 5-1 up on the back of big serving as Kasatkina struggled for consistency and the 24-year-old Brisbane champion wrapped up the opening set in 25 minutes when her opponent sent a forehand wide.

The pair had come into the contest having split their four meetings - all on hardcourts - and Adelaide runner-up Kasatkina showed plenty of fight to pull two breaks back in the next set with relentless baseline hitting and stunning winners.

Level at 4-4, Rybakina turned the heat up to break the 26-year-old Kasatkina with a crosscourt scorcher and the Moscow-born Kazakh returned after a brief rain delay to secure the victory on serve.

Both players will now head to Doha for the Qatar TotalEnergies Open, with Kasatkina set to face Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova in her opener today while Rybakina has a bye into the second round.

"A tough week, especially the last matches, and tomorrow is already a match in Doha (for Kasatkina)," Rybakina said. "Hopefully we both recover and do well there and maybe play final there. 'I want to thank all the fans who came to support us. It's been an amazing atmosphere and especially to see the flags from Kazakhstan it really means a lot.'"

Japan's Rikuya Hoshino sunk two birdies on his final three holes to win the Qatar Masters and claim his first DP World Tour title by a single stroke ahead of France's Ugo Coussaud at Doha Golf Club yesterday.

Hoshino, who was in a three-way tie for the lead going into the final day, carded a four-under-par 68 to finish on 14-under overall, a shot ahead of Coussaud and two ahead of Scotland's Scott Jamieson in third place.

The 27-year-old made a nervy start, mixing two bogeys with three birdies on the front nine but rediscovered his touch after the turn, with a birdie on the 10th and consecutive birdies on the 16th and 17th holes to claim the \$425,000 top prize.

"I'm honoured to win at this wonderful tournament," Hoshino said. "Of course I was nervous but I just tried to keep enjoying it."

Hoshino, who becomes the fourth Japanese to win a DP World Tour title after Isao Aoki, Hideki Matsuyama and Ryo Hisatsune, was tied with Denmark's Rasmus Hojgaard and Coussaud on 10-under heading into the final round.

Hojgaard dropped off the pace early, with bogeys on the first and fourth and another after the turn seeing him sign for a one-over-par 73 in his closing round and end in a three-way tie for sixth place.

Jamieson was the day's big mover, charging up 15 places in the standings with six birdies and an eagle, offset by a single bogey to sign for a seven-under par 65 and 12-under overall.

Northern Ireland's Tom McKibbin also secured his first top-10 finish of the season. McKibbin started the final round just one shot off the lead but could only manage a closing two-under 70, making birdie on the two par-fives on the back nine.

The 21-year-old Hollywood Golf Club member takes home a cheque for €116,000, taking his earnings this season on the DP World Tour over €300,000.

Arsenal smash six past West Ham

Arsenal exacted sweet revenge on West Ham United with a 6-0 away thrashing to stay right in the thick of the English Premier League title race yesterday, obliterating their hosts before halftime.

Mikel Arteta's side had lost twice against their London rivals this season but were 4-0 ahead by halftime with goals by William Saliba, Bukayo Saka, Gabriel and Leandro Trossard.

The punishment continued in the second half with Saka making it 5-0 before former West Ham midfielder Declan Rice, who assisted two goals in the opening period, thumped his team's sixth on a day of abject humiliation for the hosts.

It was a sublime display by Arsenal who wiped off a goal difference deficit to champions Manchester City who they joined on 52 points, although they stay in third place courtesy of scoring fewer goals. Leaders Liverpool have 54 points.

Arsenal were defeated by West Ham in the League Cup although

the bigger blow was a 2-0 home defeat in December when they were guilty of squandering a host of chances.

This time they were lethal as they tore eighth-placed West Ham to shreds at the London Stadium. Thousands of home fans who streamed out of the exits before halftime were spared the rest of West Ham's worst home league defeat since an 8-2 loss by Blackburn Rovers in 1963.

It was even more impressive seeing that wins for Liverpool and Manchester City on Saturday had cranked up the pressure on Arsenal to respond.
