

As the Muslim world welcomed the holy month and its customary daytime fast, many Gazans faced bombardment that saw residents once more search through the rubble of destroyed homes for survivors and bodies.

A UN report, citing the health ministry in Hamas-run Gaza, said 25 people have now died from malnutrition and dehydration, most of them children.

Gazans are feeling the shortages even more during Ramadan. "We don't know what we are

going to eat to break the fast," Zaki Abu Mansour, 63, said inside his tent. "I have only a tomato and a cucumber... and I have no money to buy anything." Goods that are available are sold

# Shura reviews proposal on promoting national identity in private schools

he Shura Council held its weekly meeting yesterday, under the chairpersonship of its Speaker HE Hassan bin Abdullah al-Ghanem.

At the outset of the meeting, HE al-Ghanem extended greetings in his name and on behalf of members of the Shura Council to His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani on the advent of the holy month of Ramadan, asking Allah Almighty to return it to the Amir, the Qatari people and all those residing in Qatar with good and blessings, and to the Arab and Islamic nations with security, peace and stability.

Afterwards, the Shura Council reviewed a proposal submitted by a member of the council related to strengthening national belonging and identity among Qatari students in private schools. The proposal included views aimed at strengthening students' national identity, including reconsidering the legislation regulating private schools with regard to clothing, by adding regulations that obligate all Qatari male students to wear the traditional clothing, and female students to wear clothing in accordance with values, customs and traditions of the Qatari

society, thus preserving the national identity in private schools.

The proposal included other views related to determining the specifications of school uniforms for each grade and age, as well as performing the national anthem and raising the state flag in schoolyards or on the buildings of private schools that have Qatari students. Members of the Council discussed the proposal and decided to submit it to the esteemed government.

Meanwhile, the Shura Council was briefed on the opinion of the Financial and Economic Affairs Committee regarding the response of the Cabinet's General Secretariat to the proposal submitted by the Council related to

inflation, high costs of living and increasing financial burdens on citizens, and took the appropriate decision thereon.

The Shura Council also reviewed the report on its delegation's participation in the meeting of the Standing Committee on Political Affairs of the Asian Parliamentary Association (APA), which was held in Baghdad in November 2023; and another report on its participation in the 45th conference of the International Women's Empowerment and Capacity Building (Tamkeen), which was held in Kuwait in December 2023 under the title "New Reading of the Challenges Facing Women's Empowerment for Sustainable Development".

## Firm, consistent Qatari position in supporting Sudan to overcome crises: report

atar is always keen to play a leading role in providing aid based on its humanitarian and moral role and commitment to its responsibility as an active partner in the international community.

In this context, it continues its generous giving and tireless efforts in supporting the containment of crises in brotherly and friendly countries and extending a helping hand to the afflicted peoples without exception and discrimination or compensation, as its goal is only to alleviate the suffering of those affected by crises of all kinds around the world, and to operate air bridg-

es to transport hundreds or even thousands of tonnes of relief aid, in response to the emergency and urgent circumstances.

Out of awareness of the human suffering that the brotherly Sudanese people are currently experiencing, the ongoing humanitarian and non-humanitarian support and assistance to the Sudanese people comes under the generous directives of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani.

The death toll and injuries and the number of internally displaced people or refugees outside Sudan have doubled as a result of what is happening in Sudan now, in addition to the material losses and major destruction of infrastructure and public and private facilities in the capital Khartoum, and several other cities and states.

Additionally, there is evident damage to water, electricity, and Internet networks, which greatly increased the suffering of civilians for more than 10 months, in light of the acute shortage of services, food and medical supplies, and the horrific security chaos. In the context of Qatari support for Sudan in its current crisis, the State operates an air bridge of vital humanitarian


aid to the brothers there, including food, health, shelter, water, and other shipments through planes belonging to the Amiri Air Force.

In light of the complexities of the Sudanese scene since the beginning of the war and the worsening suffering of the brotherly people of Sudan, HE the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Mohamed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim al-Thani participated in June 2023, via video conferencing, in the High-level Pledging Event to Support the Humanitarian Response in Sudan and the Region, which was co-chaired by the State of Qatar,

## EAA, IRC enhance access to education for conflict-hit children in Nigeria

ducation Above All Foundation's (EAA) Educate A ■ Child programme and the International Rescue Committee (IRC) announced the successful completion of their collaborative project, "Improving Access to Education for Conflict-Affected Children in Northeast Nigeria."

The two-year initiative targeted the enrolment of out of school children (OOSC) in the Borno, Adamawa, and Yobe States of Northeast Nigeria, areas severely affected by extremist violence and insurgency.

Against a goal of reaching 20,000 of the most marginalised OOSC with quality primary education, the project not only met, but exceeded this goal by ultimately enrolling 21,589 children between the ages 7 to 14 into nonformal education, surpassing the target by 8%. The establishment of 643 non-formal education centres within community primary schools, along with the renovation of 29 classrooms, has provided these children with a much more conducive-learning environment.

Moreover, the joint project achieved significant success in transitioning enrolled children into the formal education system, thereby bridging the education gap. In addition, bursary support, in the form of scholastic materials (exercise books, pencils, and a school bag) at the point of enrolment, proved critical and reached 14,213 children (7,268 girls and 6,945 boys) across 48 formal primary schools in the BAY States.

In response to concerns related to the volatile security situation, the project implemented robust mechanisms to enhance the safety of children travelling to and from school and during their time at

Executive Director of EAA's Educate A Child programme Dr Mary Joy Pigozzi expressed her appreciation at the project's achievements in light of the challenges that conflict poses.
She noted: "This project exem-

plifies our commitment with our partners to providing quality primary education to those affected by barriers beyond their control.

in this case, insecurity and conflict. Exceeding the OOSC enrolment target is not only a testament to the positive impact we can have on the lives of children, but the fact that we can enable children to realise their right to education in extremely challenging circumstances as well."

For his part, IRC Country Director in Nigeria Babatunde Ojei said: "Our collaborative project with the Education Above All Foundation marks a significant milestone in our shared mission to provide quality education to conflict-affected children in northeast Nigeria.

The successful completion of this initiative underscores the transformative power of education in restoring hope and stability to communities ravaged by violence and insecurity. We remain steadfast in our commitment to improving education access for vulnerable children, recognising it as a cornerstone for building resilience and fostering a brighter future in regions affected by conflict." # Zakat Affairs Department distributed more than QR235mn in aid last year

he Zakat Affairs Department at the Ministry of Endowments (Awqaf) and Islamic Affairs distributed a total of more than QR235mn in aid last year.

According to a statement from Awqaf, more than 8,800 families received aid in 2023, totalling QR235,067,786 disbursed by the department to support needy families inside Oatar.

"This assistance is divided into two types:

one that is provided to families monthly to help them with their needs, and the lump sum aid that is provided to families once according to need," said Zakat Affairs Department director Saad bin Omran al-Kuwari.

The aid is distributed to the families that deserve Zakat.

Al-Kuwari explained that the Zakat Affairs Department is the government entity that has been assigned by law the jurisdic-

one that is provided to families monthly to help them with their needs, and the lump them to those entitled to them.

The largest amounts disbursed by the administration are for permanent and lump sum aid, which this stood at 59.52% of the total aid.

The education fees aid for university and school students stood at 19.89%, while the aid for debtors stood at 9.37%.

Of the total aid, 2.03% was spent on treat-

ment assistance and the Zakat al-Fitr assistance rate stood at 0.85%.

Al-Kuwari said that the Zakat Affairs Department has processes in place to ensure the eligibility of requests for assistance.

The department receives Zakat from individuals and companies throughout the year through offices and collection points spread across the country or through the Department of Zakat Affairs application.

# DIFI holds meeting in Malaysia on how megatrends impact the family

he interlinkages between migration, urbanisation, climate change and technological and demographic trends were raised at an event organised by the Doha International Family Institute (DIFI), a member of Qatar Foundation (QF), during the Expert Group Meeting (EGM) held in Kuala Lumpur.

The meeting highlighted the New Urban Agenda and explored ways to achieve inclusive, safe, resilient, and sustainable cities, and envisaged outcomes, including underlining the impact of migration on family structures and analysing strategies for optimising the benefits of technology while minimising its drawbacks on family relationships.

The meeting also discussed the policy lessons learned from Asia that can be applied globally, and the potential contributions of global experiences to the Asian context, interlinkages between migration, urbanisation, new technologies, and climate change, said the statement issued by the QF.

The event was held in partnership with the Malaysia's National Population and Family Development (LPPKN), the UN Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UNDESA), and the International Federation for Family Development (IFFD), the statement continued.

LPPKN director-general Ab-

# MoPH launches National Oral and Dental Health Survey

he Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) has launched the 3rd National Oral and Dental Health Survey for adolescent male and female students aged 12-16 in collaboration with the Ministry of Education and Higher Education, Hamad Medical Corporation, Primary Health Care Corporation, the Medical Services Department at the Ministry of Interior, Qatar University and Qatar Energy.

The survey targets about 2,300 students in public and private schools. It aims to find out dental caries and gum disease prevalence among students in all public and private schools participating in the survey in Qatar for the age group 12-16.

MoPH recently organised a number of training workshops for the medical staff participating in the implementation of the survey. The workshops, conducted by specialised doctors, included advanced handson training on the survey steps.

Sheikh Dr Mohamed bin Hamad al-Thani, director of the Non-Communicable Diseases Prevention Programmes Department, Ministry of Public Health, said that the survey

contributes to getting more accurate results on oral and dental healthcare level among male and female students from the target group and relevant health problems.

A specialised and trained medical team examines the students participating in the survey through a mobile clinic, and the examination includes filling out a questionnaire by the students' parents. The survey contains questions related to food eaten by young students to determine the percentage of caries they have and to identify the relationship between the type of food and the rate of caries, in addition to assessing the impact of oral health on the lives of young students. At the end of the examination, students will be advised on their need to see a dentist.

The survey contributes to providing officials and supervisors of oral health in Qatar with the necessary information to make recommendations on how to reduce the spread of oral and dental diseases and develop optimal plans for their prevention.

MoPH is also getting ready to launch the fourth national oral health survey for adults aged 18 and above, as part of the ministry's keenness to includes all segment of the society in dental surveys to promote awareness and provide high-quality oral and dental health services in Qatar.

MoPH conducted two other surveys, the first in 2011 and the second in 2017, during which they found out the prevalence of tooth decay among male and female students, Qatari and non-Qatari, in addition to identifying the relationship between the level of oral health information and health practices, including dietary habits. It was found that the rate of tooth decay among school students at that time was about

In preparation of the country-wide adoption of Vehicle-to-everything (V2X) technology and applications, Qatar Mobility Innovations Centre (Qmic) announced the readiness of its V2X platform to support the new Cellular-V2X (C-V2X) standard and technology, in addition to the traditional Dedicated Short Range Communication (DSRC) standard, that has been already supported.

By supporting both technologies, the C-V2X and the DSRC-V2X, Qmic's V2X platform can enable the rapid adoption of V2X in the country and region.

C-V2X is a cellular-based communication technology that allows vehicles to communicate with other vehicles, infrastructure, pedestrians, and networks.

Qmic has successfully piloted both technologies, DSR and C-V2X, and has been working with its national partners and stakeholders to plan the next step in







# Objectives of fasting

Ilah, the Almighty, enjoined fasting on His servants not to make them suffer, nor that He, the Almighty benefits from their fasting, as He is not in need of His servants and the acts of worship they offer.

Rather, Allah enjoined fasting in order to benefit His servants in the worldly life and in the Hereafter, physically and spiritually, and in relation to their morals and religion. Allah, the Almighty, evidently mentioned in the Qur'an the intention of fasting is to become righteous. Moreover, the one who reflects on the objectives of fasting will find that these benefits are limitless and beyond description.

According to Ibn al-Qayyim, fasting acts like a rein for pious people, protection for fighters, and a sport for righteous people and those drawing closer to Allah. It is also offered for the sake of Allah more than any other act of worship and is considered a secret between Allah and His servant as no one else sees it. Fasting has an amazing impact on guarding the outward limbs and inward powers and protecting them from anything that may spoil them or make them unsound. Fasting protects the heart and the organs and restores to them that which illegal desires have stolen from them, as fasting is the greatest helper with piety. The benefits of fasting include

the following: Fasting maintains the power of Allah's servant and protects him from the diseases which are caused by repletion and satiety, as the stomach is the home of disease and diet is the basis of remedy. Imam Ahmad, Imam At-Tirmithi, and Imam Ibn Majah reported from Al-Miqdam Ibn Ma'd Yakrib, may Allah be pleased with him, that he heard the Messenger of Allah, sallallaahu 'alaihi wa sallam (may Allah exalt his mention), saying: "No man fills a utensil worse than his stomach. A few morsels that keep his back upright are sufficient for a man. If eating is necessary, he should fill one-third with food, one-third with drink, and leave one-third



for easy breathing." (Saheeh Al-Jami'a, 5674)

The fullness of one's stomach leads to the arousal of desires and enables Satan to control the person and lead him to sins, evils, and abominable acts, as satiety and gluttony lead to all evils. Al-Qurtubi said: "Whenever a person decreases the amount of food he eats, his desire will be weak; whenever the desire becomes weak, acts of disobedience will decrease."

When the stomach becomes full, the person becomes inclined to acts of disobedience and oppression, but when a person fasts, he becomes calm, tenderhearted, and tranquil. Therefore, the person who fasts is protected from all evils, preserved from all abominable acts, and guarded against all pitfalls. The two Saheeh (authentic) Books of Hadith (Saheeh Al-Bukhari and Saheeh Al-Muslim) stated the following Hadith: "Fasting is a protection against sins." Ibn Mas'ooud, may Allah be pleased with him, reported that the Messenger of Allah, sallallaahu 'alaihi wa sallam, said: "He who can afford to marry should marry because it will help him refrain from looking at other women, and save his private parts from committing illegal sexual relation; and he who cannot afford to marry is advised to fast, as fasting will diminish his sexual power." (Imam Al-Bukhari and Imam Muslim)

Fasting guards the servant's organs, as Jabir Ibn Abdullah said: "If you fast, then let your hearing, sight, and tongue refrain from lying and forbidden deeds; do not annoy your servant, and be dignified and tranquil on the day of your fast; do not let the day when you fast and the day when you do not fast be the same"

Al-Musnad and Saheeh Al-Bukhari stated that Abu Hurairah, may Allah be pleased with him, reported that the Prophet, sallallaahu 'alaihi wa sallam, said: "Unless one abandons falsehood and indecent deeds, Allah will have no need in his abstaining from food and drink."

The intention for the acts of worship and the result of the acts of obedience is piety, as Allah, the Almighty, Says in the Qur'an (what means): {O mankind, worship your Lord, who created you and those before you, that you may become righteous} [Qur'an 2: 21]

Piety is also one of the greatest objectives of fasting, as fasting is the main act that leads to piety. Moreover, the person who fasts in the manner prescribed by the Messenger of Allah should attain piety, as Allah, the Almighty, Says (what means): {O you who have believed, decreed upon you is fasting as it was decreed upon those before you that you may become righteous} [Qur'an 2: 183]

Due to the above-mentioned reasons, fasting is an act of worship offered sincerely to Allah Alone, as Allah singles it out for Himself. Although all the other acts of worship are for the sake of Allah, fasting has some specialty with regard to sincerity, rather than any other act of worship. This is in accordance with the Sacred Hadith: "All the deeds of Adam's sons (people) are for them, except fasting which is for Me, and I will give the reward for it." (Imam Al-Bukhari and Imam Muslim)

As per some historians, the cannon is the most important media for the people of Qatar besides its merit during the prayer time, as people fast and break the fast based on the sound of the cannon.

As for Qataris when sunset approaches, they circle around the Iftar table, waiting for the cannon sound as it coincides with the call to Maghrib prayer.

Qatari women also ask the young ones to either go out to the

yard or go up to the roof of the house, moments before sunset to wait for the sound of the cannon, or watch its flash and smoke rising in the sky, to inform them about the time for breaking fast.

Ramadan cannon was set up in recent years in both Souq Waqif and the southern side of Katara. In the past it used to be in a number of areas such as Al Koot Fort, next to the Eid prayer hall in Jasra, the old Salata area, the new Rayyan area, Al-Khalifat area, and until recently on Corniche (near the post office).

Currently, the cannon is set up in Souq Waqif and Katara, where people from all classes, especially children, visit to see it in action. Soldiers in uniform stand in a military arrangement behind the cannon, waiting for the order to give the signal to fire it, coinciding with the call for Maghrib prayer. (QNA)

# Princess Catherine apologises over edited photograph

atherine, Princess of Wales, yesterday apologised and admitted to editing an official portrait of her released by the palace that prompted AFP and other agencies to withdraw the image.

Kate, 42, has not been seen in public since December 25, and underwent abdominal surgery in January, fuelling speculation about her

Her Kensington Palace office on Sunday sought to dispel rumours by distributing an official photograph said to have been taken by her husband Prince William of his wife with their three children. But questions quickly emerged about the Mother's Day portrait of a smiling Kate, casually dressed and seated in a garden chair, surrounded by Prince George, Princess Charlotte and Prince Louis.

They included several inconsistencies such as the zip of Kate's jacket being misaligned in one place, while part of Princess Charlotte's sleeve is missing. The eight-year-old princess's hair also ends abruptly on her shoulder.

Responding to the growing controversy yesterday, the palace issued a statement on X (formerly Twitter), signed by "C" for Catherine.

"Like many amateur photographers, I do occasionally experiment with editing," it stated.

"I wanted to express my apologies for any confusion the family photograph we shared caused."

Royal sources told several British media outlets that Kate had made "minor adjustments" to the picture. Kensington Palace, however, said it would not republish the original, unedited photo.

# SBI must share electoral bonds' details by today: India's top court

ndia's Supreme Court yesterday rejected a plea by government-run State Bank of India for more time to make public names of individuals and companies who donated billions of rupees to political parties through an opaque funding system.

The court had on February 15 scrapped the seven-year-old election funding system that allowed unlimited and anonymous donations to political parties, calling it "unconstitutional".

That decision was a setback for Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Bharatiya Janata Party, which has been the largest beneficiary of the system introduced in 2017, and came ahead of a national election expected to be held in April or May.

SBI had been asked to share names of the donors, the beneficiaries and the amounts with the independent Election Commission of India (ECI) by March 6 and the poll panel was directed to make it public by March 13.

SBI, however, filed a petition on March 4 seeking time until June 30 - by when elections would be completed - saying the information sought by the court was in separate sections and it needed time to compile and match the information involving 22,217 dona-

Responding to the plea yesterday, the court said the information

SBI was asked to share is readily available with the bank and it should be shared with the ECI "by close of business" today.

The ECI should compile the information and publish the details no later than 5pm on March 15, the five-judge bench ordered, days before general elections are expected to be called.

"We place SBI on notice that we might be inclined to proceed on wilful disobedience of court order if it does not comply with the timeline given today," the bench led by chief justice D Y Chandrachud said.

"Our directions require SBI to disclose information which is already available," Chandrachud said. "We have not told you to do the matching exercise ... simply comply with the judgment. You have the details."

The election funding system, called Electoral Bonds, was challenged by members of the opposition and a civil society group on the grounds that it hindered the public's right to know who had given money to political parties.

Under the system, a person or company could buy bonds from SBI and donate them to a political party. Individuals and companies bought Rs165.18bn (\$2bn) of such bonds in total up to November 2023, according to the Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR), a non-government civil society group working on election funding in India. The group was a petitioner challenging the system.

# India govt moves to enact controversial citizenship law

ndia yesterday announced rules to implement a 2019 citizenship law that critics call anti-Muslim, weeks before Prime Minister Narendra Modi seeks a rare third term for his Hindu nationalist government.

The Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA) grants Indian nationality to Hindus, Parsis, Sikhs, Buddhists, Jains and Christians who fled to India from Afghanistan, Bangladesh and Pakistan before December 31, 2014.

Modi's government had not crafted implementation rules for the law, after protests and sectarian violence broke out in New Delhi and elsewhere within weeks of the law's December 2019 enactment. Scores were killed and hundreds injured during days of clashes.

"The Modi government announces implementation of Citizenship Amendment Act," a spokesperson for the prime minister's office said in a text message.

"It was an integral part of BJP's 2019 manifesto. This will pave (the) way for the persecuted to find citizenship in India," he said, referring to the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party's (BJP) 2019 election manifesto.

A home ministry spokesperson said the rules will enable those eligible under CAA-2019 to apply for grant of Indian citizenship, and that applications would be submitted online via a web portal that had been pro-

Muslim groups say the law, combined with a proposed national register of citizens, can discriminate against India's 200mn Muslims - the world's third-largest Muslim population. They fear the government might remove the citizenship of Muslims without documents in some border states.

The government denies it is anti-Muslim. It says the law is meant to grant citizenship, not take it away from anyone, and has called the earlier protests politically motivated.

Modi swept to power in 2014 and has

consolidated his hold since with a focus on growth, welfare economics, boosting infrastructure and aggressive Hindu nationalism.

Opinion polls suggest he will comfortably win a majority in a general election that must be held by May.

The main opposition Congress party said yesterday's announcement was motivated by the approaching election.

"After seeking nine extensions for the notification of the rules, the timing right before the elections is evidently designed to polarise the elections, especially in West Bengal and Assam," Congress spokesperson Jairam Ramesh said on X.

The eastern states of West Bengal and Assam are home to large Muslim populations and witnessed protests against CAA as some Muslims feared the law could be used to declare them illegal immigrants from neighbouring Bangladesh and take away their Indian citizenship.

Many poor Indians do not have documents to prove their nationality.

#### **Ex-senior Tory** defects to fringe right-wing party

A prominent former deputy

chairman of Britain's governing Conservatives, who was suspended from the party over accusations of Islamophobia, yesterday defected to the small right-wing Reform UK party in a setback for Prime Minister Rishi Sunak. The move by Lee Anderson, a former miner who has courted controversy with his outspoken views, comes months before a national election in which Reform is expected to draw votes away from the Conservatives and in doing so threaten Sunak's re-election bid. Anderson's defection to Reform, which has Brexit campaigner Nigel Farage as its honorary president and backs populist causes such as tougher immigration laws, gives the party its first member of parliament. It also represents a blow to Sunak, given Anderson was appointed as the Conservatives' deputy chairman last year to appeal to voters in former Labour Party-voting heartlands known as the "Red Wall" that backed the Conservatives at the

## US firms 'to invest over \$1bn in the Philippines'

merican companies are set to announce investments amounting to more than \$1bn in the Philippines, US Commerce Secretary Gina Raimondo said during an official visit to Manila yesterday.

Raimondo is heading a two-day trade and investment mission, the first of its kind for the Philippines. The delegation includes executives from 22 companies including United Airlines, Alphabet's Google, Visa, KKR Asia Pacific and Microsoft. The investments will span areas like solar energy, electric vehicles and digitisation, she said.

United said last week it would launch new flights from Tokyo-Narita to Cebu, Philippines starting July 31.

US efforts to deepen economic ties with the Philippines come in tandem with increased co-operation in defence.

Both US President Joe Biden and Philippine President Ferdinand Marcos Jr are keen to counter what they see as aggressive actions by China in the South China Sea and near Taiwan.

Speaking at a joint briefing with Philippine officials after meeting with Marcos at the presidential palace, Raimondo said Washington's commitment to expanding trade and investment in the Philippines extends to the larger Indo-Pacific region through the Indo-Pacific Economic Framework - a 14-nation US-led group.

Raimondo reiterated the US has no intention of "decoupling" from China but it would not be allowed access to Washington's advanced technology.

"My job is to protect the American people and to make sure that our most sophisticated technology, including semiconductor technology, artificial intelligence technology that we have and China doesn't have, that they can't access it and use it to enable the Chinese military," Raimondo said.

She also reaffirmed the US' alliance with the Philippines, calling it

# 50 injured as plane 'just dropped' mid-flight

t least 50 people were hurt when a Boeing 787 operated by LATAM Airlines dropped abruptly mid-flight from Sydney to Auckland yesterday, according to the airline and a New Zealand health service organisation that treated the injured.

The aircraft experienced a strong shake and as a result 10 passengers and three cabin crew members were taken to a hospital, the South American carrier said as

it investigates the cause. The flight with 263 passengers and nine cabin crew members landed at Auckland airport as

scheduled yesterday afternoon.

One person is in a serious condition while the rest suffered mildto-moderate injuries, a spokesperson for Hato Hone St John, which treated roughly 50 people at the airport, said.

"The plane, unannounced, just dropped. I mean it dropped unlike anything I've ever experienced on any kind of minor turbulence, and people were thrown out of their seats, hit the top of the roof of the plane, throwing down the aisles," passenger Brian Jokat told the BBC.

The cause of the apparent sudden change in trajectory of flight LA800 could not be ascertained immediately. Safety experts say most airplane accidents are caused by a cocktail of factors that need to

be thoroughly investigated.

"Some of the roof panels were broken from people being thrown up and knocking through the plastic roof panels in the aisle ways. And there was blood coming from several people's heads." Jokat, who was not injured in the incident,

He said passengers who were doctors on the plane provided bandages and neck braces for people who were severely injured.

The eight-year-old Boeing 787-

9 Dreamliner, according to flight tracking website FlightRadar24, was on its way to Santiago via Auckland.

LATAM Airlines said a new flight to Chile will depart from Auckland

In 2008, dozens of people were injured when another wide-body iet, an Airbus 330 operated by Qantas Airways, dropped sharply because of faulty readings from a flight data computer while heading for Perth in Australia.

Boeing said it was working to gather more information and will provide any support to the airline.

The US Federal Aviation Administration and the National Safety Board did not immediately respond to requests for comments.

Separately, the Wall Street Journal reported on Saturday the US department of justice has opened a criminal investigation into 737 MAX mid-air cabin-panel blowout on an Alaska Airlines flight in Ianuary.

# Degrowth is a dead end

The concept of degrowth has recently captured the imagination of academics, activists, and politicians – particularly in rich countries  $\,$ - who are concerned about environmental sustainability and socioeconomic justice. Last May, the European Parliament organised a Beyond Growth Conference. Since then, a spate of articles (including in leading scientific journals) has documented the rise of this once-niche movement, which calls for abandoning GDP growth as a goal, reducing energy and material use, and focusing economic activity on human

But despite the fervour of its adherents, the degrowth movement lacks a coherent theory of change, and is thus a dead end. While the ideals that underpin the movement and some of its proposals, such as universal access to public services and a green-jobs guarantee, resonate powerfully, its overarching goals are politically impractical. Moreover, because degrowth is an all-or-nothing strategy, it would actually impede progress on climate policy.

For starters, degrowth is premised on the idea that "the system" is to blame for our climate predicament, which implies that the solution is to abolish capitalism. In this context, advocates do not view incremental progress toward the movement's stated goals, such as reduced working hours or targeted bans on highly polluting activities, as a step in the right direction; on the contrary, they interpret such changes as a way for policymakers to defend the current system against criticism. In other

words, reform is anti-revolutionary. At the international level, degrowth calls for actively shrinking rich economies and launching a voluntary transfer of resources to the Global South. Notwithstanding abstract social-justice considerations, this would be a political non-starter: when fewer resources are available, countries become less, not more, generous. Even now, when advanced economies are expanding, securing adequate funding for the Loss and Damage Fund operationalised at last year's United Nations Climate Change Conference in Dubai has proven difficult.

## **Instead of** trying to halt growth, we must redefine and reorient our growth patterns toward sustainability

On a societal level, degrowthers urge a collective moral awakening. If only people fully grasped the damage caused by the current economic model, the thinking goes, they would lifestyle. They would give up meat, flying, SUVs, and other carbon-intensive products and services.

But while proponents of degrowth imagine an enlightened society, betting on the moral improvement of humankind is a poor wager. As philosopher Emrys

Westacott has shown, most world religions, including Christianity, Buddhism, Islam, and Confucianism, have long preached simple living. It is safe to assume, given the state of the planet, that these calls for moderation have done little to tame the relentless drive for consumption. Expecting a moral revolution to kickstart structural

transformation is like waiting for Godot.

In fact, a backlash against the current pace of climate action – which is far from sufficient - is already gaining steam, with nationalist parties running in several upcoming elections exploiting fears about greener lifestyles. In this context, the idea that a swift change of heart among the rich would make degrowth politically feasible looks even more

The politics of climate change and environmental policy are complex precisely because of the need to balance people's immediate demands for quality of life, affordable energy, and economic security with longterm sustainability. As the New York Times' Ezra Klein eloquently put it, the degrowth movement is "trying to take the politics out of politics" and is "attacking the flaws of the current strategy as not moving fast enough when the impediments are political, but then not accepting the impediments to its own political path forward."

Instead of trying to halt growth, we must redefine and reorient our growth patterns toward sustainability, so that we can reconcile the persistent desire to consume more with the imperative to make greener choices. Technological advances, renewable energy, and a shift toward a circular economy offer ways to align economic progress with environmental stewardship.

The political obstacles facing the degrowth movement are insurmountable, which is why its newfound prominence will prove ephemeral. The most degrowthers can hope to achieve is to prod a privileged few toward more sustainable consumption habits. To the extent that it is successful, the movement will contribute, albeit modestly, to mitigating the effects of climate change.

As climate experts often remind us, there is no silver bullet for global warming. Avoiding a climate catastrophe demands a multifaceted strategy comprising multiple solutions. But degrowth is not one of them. - Project Syndicate



# X factor: How Twitter ban continues to hurt Pakistan



The country has restricted access to social media platform X



businesses, free speech and news gathering



State-imposed bans can curb freedoms, warn campaigners

rom business owners fretting over lost clients to journalists seeking new sources, Pakistanis want the government to restore regular access to the social media platform X, formerly Twitter, which has been blocked for nearly

Authorities have blocked X either partially or fully - since February 17 after protests swept the country over allegations of vote rigging in a general election, according to the Netblocks global Internet monitor.

When users try t they often see this message: "Something went wrong, but don't fret — let's give it another

But Shaista Ayesha, who runs Karachi-based social enterprise SEED Ventures, is fretting.

"We do our social media postings through X, and connect with other organisations and funders so there is definitely social media outreach loss and one avenue of strategic visibility gone," Ayesha told the Thomson Reuters Foundation.

She said she had not yet calculated the financial cost of the X ban, which is just the latest in a series of Internet restrictions linked to the Feb. 8 election. The vote was marred by a mobile Internet shutdown on polling day and unusually delayed results,

leading to accusations of vote tampering.

The United States, Britain and the European Union have separately expressed concerns about the electoral process and said reported irregularities should be investigated. The US State Department has

also condemned the Internet shutdowns and urged the federal government to lift restrictions and respect freedom of expression. On Tuesday, the Islamabad

High Court summoned the Pakistan Telecommunication Authority (PTA) and the federal information ministry to answer a case filed by a resident of the capital challenging the disrupte access to X.

The case is scheduled to be heard next week.

Initially, the PTA denied any knowledge of Internet restrictions but in a similar case in the high court of Sindh province on Monday it said that the Interior Ministry had issued instructions to suspend mobile phone services on polling day.

Jibran Nasir, a lawyer who filed one of many petitions over X disruptions and slow Internet speeds in the Sindh high court, warned that such state-imposed shutdowns could start dictating "how we are to live our lives and what freedoms we can enjoy".

On February 22, the Sindh court ordered the government to restore access to X immediately, but Nasir said the block continued,

leading to a contempt case against authorities. The case was adjourned until March 20.

## **Virtual Private Networks**

Just over 45% of Pakistan's population of 241mn people have access to the Internet and nearly 72mn - or almost 30% - use social media, according to research site DataReportal.

X had 4.5mn users in Pakistan in early 2024, meaning that the social media platform's advertising reach in the country was equivalent to 1.9% of the population.

Hisham Sarwar, a popular tech guru who runs several digital marketing companies in Pakistan, said small busine were making losses because the shutdown had hit social media marketing.

"The absence of (X) has resulted in panic as it takes time to create content on Meta platforms," he said, referring to Facebook and Instagram.

Nor is TikTok a viable alternative, Sarwar said, as the platform has not rolled out a service for businesses in Pakistan. X offers a better return on marketing investment for companies like his, he said.

To circumvent the restrictions, many Pakistanis have turned to virtual private networks that encrypt data and obscure where a user is located, according to VPN service providers.

Farieha Aziz, co-founder of Bolo Bhi, a digital rights

advocacy group, said she used VPNs to access X, which she said was crucial to get "realtime information on everything that is blocked by authorities on mainstream media outlets like election irregularities, arrests of journalists".

But she said that Internet speeds had been slowed down, meaning it was taking longer to connect, and the government was also believed to be trying to block Neither the PTA nor the

information ministry responded to requests for comment on allegations of blocking VPNs.

Journalist Omair Alavi said that since the blackout he had not been able to use X to break new share updates or find sources.

"I get news updates from (X) and embed links in my stories," said the Karachi-based reporter at the Voice of America broadcaster. "Social media is an integral part of our lives and banning it is making things worse."

Lahore-based environment lawyer Ahmad Rafay Alam said he worried that the X shutdown would cause him to miss important weather updates in a country hit hard by climate disasters, including floods, droughts and deadly heat.

But, taking a grim glass-halffull approach, he could see one silver lining to the blackout.

"Frankly, the ban is also relief from the overwhelmingly bad news about the climate crisis." -Thomson Reuters Foundation



# CEO of largest Pak bank new finance minister

**Ishaq Dar to head Foreign Ministry** to push 'economic diplomacy'

uhammad Aurangzeb, the CEO of Pakistan's largest bank, was picked as finance minister in the country's new cabinet that was sworn in vesterday, as Pakistan looks to strike a new IMF deal and stabilise the economy.

A national election last month resulted in no party holding a majority, after which a coalition alliance elected Shehbaz Sharif as prime minister for a second time to tackle the country's economic and politi-

Sharif has included Muhammad Aurangzeb, chief executive officer of HBL bank, in the cabinet and he will be given the portfolio of finance minister.

"Mr Muhammad Aurangzeb officially took over the responsibility as Finance Minister of Pakistan after taking oath at the Presidency, today," the Ministry of Finance said in a post on X last night.

HBL said he was stepping down from the bank.

Aurangzeb was picked over several veterans previously involved in handling the \$350bn economy, including four-time finance minister Ishaq Dar, as the country looks to plot a path out of its economic

Dar was also named a federal minister and has been appointed as foreign minister, Reuters saw in a government document outlining the allocation of portfo-

The document listed 18 ministers and their portfolios.

"Economic diplomacy is the need of the hour for sure," Dar told Reuters.

HBL yesterday informed the Pakistan Stock Exchange of Aurangzeb's resignation from the bank, in a letter to the bourse.

In a statement from HBL, Aurangzeb said, "I am excited about the opportunity to serve our country in this new capacity and contribute to the economic growth and development of Pakistan."

The bank called his stepping down from his position a "remarkable act of national

Pakistan's current International Monetary Fund programme expires next month, and Sharif has said his government would look to negotiate a new, longer term bailout to keep the country's economy stable amidst high inflation and external financing requirements.

# American gets life term for tourist rape-murder

Kempten

German court handed an American man a life sen-Latence yesterday for raping and killing a fellow US tourist near Bavaria's famed Neuschwanstein castle last year.

The district tribunal in the southern town of Kempten convicted the defendant, identified only as Troy Philipp B., 31, after he made a wide-ranging confession on the first day of his trial last

The judges also noted the "particular severity of guilt", meaning he is unlikely to be released after 15 years as is customary with life sentences in Germany.

Troy Philipp B. was convicted of raping and murdering the 21-yearold US woman as well as the attempted murder of her friend, 22, also a US citizen. The two women were hiking in

the Neuschwanstein area in June last year at the end of a European trip that had taken them to Italy

The pair got speaking to the accused after he and the younger of the women slipped at a similar point on a mountain trail, prosecutors said.

"That's enough adventure for today," B is said to have remarked to the women, before offering to

take them to a nearby viewing point on the way back to the cas-

At a secluded spot, the man, then 30, pushed the 21-year-old woman to the ground and proceeded to rape and strangle her, according to investigators.

Her friend intervened, leading to a scuffle in which the accused pushed the 22-year-old down a steep, 50-metre (165-foot) slope.

The suspect then continued his sexual assault of the 21-year-old woman, strangling her with a belt while filming the act. Interrupted by a pair of hikers

who stumbled on the crime, he

pushed the rape victim over the

same ledge while she was uncon-The 21-year-old landed at the bottom of the slope next to her

friend, who called the emergency services, telling them her friend was "gasping". When mountain rescue work-

ers found the two women, the 22-year-old was injured but able The rape victim was seriously

niured and taken by helicopter to

hospital, where she died that night from her injuries. The defendant, who is from the US state of Michigan, admitted the crimes as the high-profile trial opened on February 19, with

## Katara launches Prize for Manuscripts, Archaeological Sites in the Arab region

atara – the Cultural Village Foundation has launched the Katara Prize for Manuscripts and Archaeological Sites in the Arab region.

Accordingly, an Arab country will be selected as the guest for each edition of the prize.

Participation in this edition will be limited to authenticated manuscripts and research studies on archaeological sites in that country.

However, participation will be open to participants of all nationalities and not limited to those from the selected country.

Morocco has been selected as the honorary guest for the inaugural edition of the Katara Prize for Manuscripts and Archaeological Sites, coinciding with the Qatar-Moroccan Year of Cultural 2024.

The new prize has two categories: the first is dedicated to conducting research on original manuscripts that have not been previously published, and the second is for the best research study on archaeological sites or landmarks in the Arab region, under specific conditions.

A specialised scientific committee will be entrusted with studying and evaluating the authenticated manuscripts and archaeological research submitted to select the top three authenticated manuscripts and the top three archaeological research papers.

The winning works will become the property of Katara Publishing House, which will have the right to publish and distribute them. Submissions for the inaugural edition of Katara

Prize for Manuscripts and Archaeological Sites will be accepted starting today, and will be open for three months.

The prize is aimed at encouraging manuscript


owners, experts, and specialists in the field of archaeology to share their collections and research efforts for wider audience to enhance the Arab and Islamic culture.

Further, it aims to encourage Arabic publishing and urge publishers to contribute to the advancement of the Arab intellectual activities through presenting innovative and contemporary works that address contemporary issues.

The prize committee has set specific conditions for participation in the prize, including common requirements for both categories as well as specific requirements for each category.

For instance, manuscripts must be original, unpublished, and in Arabic, while archaeological research must provide comprehensive backgrounds on the historical context and cultural significance of the sites being studied.

The winners in both categories will receive cash



prizes, with the first prize winner receiving \$20,000, the second prize \$15,000, and the third prize winner \$10,000.

Katara general manager Prof Khalid bin Ibrahim al-Sulaiti said that the launch of the Katara Prize for Manuscripts and Archaeological Sites is part of Katara's efforts to foster culture and preserve the Arab and Islamic heritage through the promotion of valuable manuscripts and facilitating their accessibility

to researchers and scholars.

He added that shedding light on archaeological sites in the Arab region, which are essential elements of national heritage, provides an opportunity to explore valuable historical sources, enrich research, expand knowledge, and promote tourism in the Arab region.
