Nepal president says Amir's visit fosters friendship, bolsters co-operation

is Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani's visit to Nepal will give the two countries opportunities for further multi-field co-operation and boost the bonds of friendship, said President of Nepal Ram Chandra Poudel, stressing that the two countries have a longstanding relationship, enriched by friendliness and co-operation which is steadily growing and also expanding with the passage of time.

Speaking to Qatar News Agency (QNA), he added that His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani is making his first official visit to Nepal, hailing His Highness the Amir as a "visionary leader" and said this is clear in the enormous progress of Qatar and efforts in establishing peace in the Middle East under His Highness' leadership. He added: "This visit shall provide us (with) strides in our socio-economic engagements and also an occasion to strengthening bonds of friendship." He hailed the cordial Qatar-Nepal relations based on "friendliness, mutual trust, support and co-operation" since the establishment of their diplomatic relations in 1977. He added that "the Government of Nepal always attaches high importance to its relation with Qatar."

Highlighting Qatar's unwavering support for his country, he expressed appreciation for Doha's assistance when "Nepal was devastated by the earthquake in 2015 followed by Covid-19 pandemic", a gesture of deep and warm relations between the two countries. "I'd like to thank His Highness and the government of Qatar once again for this assistance," he said.

"We will give continuity to these domains of co-operation, yet with higher degree of zeal," he said.

He added that bilateral co-operation will cover other global issues, primarily the environmental challenges. He said, "On top of that, the issue of climate change has been a major concern for both of us and also to protect the mother Earth collectively. "The global warming has adversely been affecting the Mount Everest and adjoining Himalayas, a major source

of fresh water in the region. All this (co-operation) will help elevate our bilateral relations to the next level".

Regarding his evaluation of bilateral agreements to protect workers' rights, improve their conditions, and the contribution of Nepalese workers to supporting the Nepalese economy, he hailed Qatar's extensive reforms to strengthen labour laws and to increase protection for workers, spotlighting the reforms' positive impact on the protection of workers and promoting their interests, as well as regulating the supply of Nepali manpower to Qatar.

Qatar, Nepal set to expand economic ties

In accordance with its vision for international relations, Qatar has always been keen on building a robust network of foreign relations and is working to strengthen these relations through engagement and openness towards many fraternal and friendly nations and peoples, in addition to advancing co-operation with them in multiple fields to serve shared interests, objectives and aspirations.

In confirmation of these orientations, comes the visit of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani to Nepal within His Highness' Asia trip, where His Highness is set to hold a session of official talks in the capital Kathmandu with President Ram Chandra Poudel to discuss bilateral relations between the countries and ways to enhance them, in addition to a range of regional and global issues of shared interest

The visit of His Highness the Amir and the discussions he is set to hold with the Nepali officials are expected to broaden the horizons of the relations between the two countries, especially in economy, trade, energy, and investment fields.

The Qatar-Nepal relations date back to more than forty years, as the two nations established their diplomatic relations on Jan 21, 1977. Since then, the bilateral relations and co-operation have evolved through years and became rock solid at all levels based on understanding and mutual respect.

The two countries share an array of agreements and memorandums of understanding in economic, trade, labour, sporting spheres, along with agreements on the cancellation of visa requirements for those who hold diplomatic and official passports, as well as co-operation in the areas of agriculture, food security and aviation services.

The relations between Doha and Kathmandu have been strengthened throughout the past years through shared visits of highranking officials in the two countries, including the visit of former president of Nepal Bidya Devi Bhandari to Doha during the period October 30-Nov 2, 2018.

His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani held a session of official talks with Bidya Devi Bhandari at the Amiri Diwan during which they discussed avenues to upgrade bilateral relations between the two countries in the areas of investment, education, agriculture, food security and exchange of expertise, especially that Qatar hosts a large number of Nepali manpower.

During these talks, the former Nepali president hailed the steadfast efforts made by Oatar to protect the rights of expatriate workers in Qatar, including the Nepali ones, noting the legislations and measures enforced by Oatar in this regard. Also, she met with a delegation from Qatar Chamber (QC), alongside Qatari businessmen at Sheraton Grand Doha and discussed ways to boost economic and trade ties between the two countries. She also urged the Qatari businessmen to invest in Nepal, describing the investment climate as secure. She affirmed that the Nepali government would guarantee these investments. highlighting that numerous international firms were operating in Nepal. Last November, political discussions were held in Kathmandu between the Ministries of Foreign Affairs in the two countries co-chaired by HE the Minister of State for Foreign Affairs Sultan bin Saad al-Muraikhi and Foreign Secretary of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Bharat Raj Paudyal during which they discussed co-operative relationships and ways to reinforce them.

The trade relations between Qatar and Nepal are constantly evolving with the Nepal's main exports to Qatar including cloth and textile, magnetic storage discs, vegetables, and other goods. Nepal's imports from Qatar include polyethylene, polypropylene and some food products.



Qatar at forefront of promoting women's representation at global level

A prominent diplomat has hailed Qatar for its efforts to encourage women's representation in diplomacy and international relations.

"Qatar has been at the forefront of promoting women's representation at the global level," said ambassador Androulla Kaminara, inaugural Distinguished-Diplomat-in-Residence at Georgetown University in Qatar (GU-Q).

She was speaking to Gulf Times on the sidelines of GU-Q's 'Gender in Foreign Policy' Hiwaraat conference, which discussed the role of gender-informed strategies and gender diversity within international institutions to drive better and more equitable foreign policy and outcomes.

"Qatar has been the key promoter of the idea of the UN having its first woman secretary general.

Qatar has been active in the initiatives to ensure the presence of more women in the UN General Assembly," she noted adding that several such initiatives are spearheaded by Qatar at the global level. "These are very important and Qatar has a competent representative in the UN," she explained.

She called for efforts to give women the possibility to be at the table of international relations and diplomacy. "Let them express their opinions and listen to them. If that takes place,

the condition will be improved. The selection should be based on excellence not based on gender," she said.

Kaminara, who noted the presence of women in UN agencies and governments is too low, said the condition is improving and better.

"The scenario is getting better, but is not fast enough," she said. Despite evidence that women's full participation makes peacebuilding much more effective, the number of women in decision-making roles is falling, she said.

"At the current rate of change, achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) will take 170 years, including SDG 5 - gender equality, integral to all SDGs," she said.

"There are challenges. But, things are getting better. We still have to talk about the issue. Women should be given better allocation. Some countries are allocating quotas for women to make the changes fast. Whatever the means change needs to happen," she said.



Red-hot US economy: 'Cool it,' say global finance chiefs

The US economy is heating up despite the interest rate hikes by

After another burst of growth in early 2024, the economy is on track to expand by at least 2% for the seventh quarter in a row. The last time the US pulled off such a feat was 20 years ago, in 2003-2004, according to a Dow Jones report.

New forecasts released by the International Monetary Fund show just how much of an outlier the US is.

The fund boosted its 2024 growth outlook for the US to 2.7%, up from 2.1% in January - more than double the pace of each of its Group of Seven counterparts.

While that's helping support global growth, it also means the US is "slightly overheated," IMF managing director Kristalina Georgieva has said - thanks in part to Washington's fiscal stance, with the budget gap pushing toward 7% of GDP.

As President Joe Biden hailed America's booming economy as the strongest in the world, global finance chiefs who convened in Washington last week had a different message: Cool it.

The push-back from central bank governors and finance ministers highlights how the sting from a surging US economy - manifested through high interest rates and a strong dollar - is ricocheting around the world by forcing other currencies lower and complicating plans to bring down borrowing costs.

Fed chair Jerome Powell on April 16 issued a warning that the long-anticipated interest-rate cuts will be delayed yet further due to

disappointingly high US inflation readings.

That shift triggered a global governmentbond selloff that sent yields to the highest levels in months and put pressure on a raft of currencies including the yen, which hit the lowest since 1990 against the dollar.

Japanese and So Korean authorities scrambled to talk up their currencies, Indonesia told state firms to hold off on big dollar purchases and Malaysia issued an intervention warning. IMF chief economist

Pierre-Olivier Gourinchas, earlier last week said the US budget stance creates "longer-term fiscal and financial stability risks for the

German Finance Minister Christian Lindner was more blunt, calling out Biden administration industrial policies including the so-called Inflation Reduction Act, which offers subsidies for clean energy and the electric vehicle sector. A resurgent US dollar is exasperating central bankers and governments around the world, forcing them into action to relieve the pressure on their own

The greenback has gained against virtually every major peer in 2024, defying many on Wall Street who came into the year predicting

The US economy's standout performance will be a major driver of global growth this year but could make America's inflation problem harder to solve, according to the IMF.

The surprising resilience of the US economy would seem, on the face of it, to be good for corporations. But as the expansion ploughs ahead, pressures are forming beneath the surface to threaten some of the country's riskiest companies.

The relentless string of hot economic data pushes back the expected timing of rate cuts, and even calls them into question. Now, struggling companies instead face an extended period of elevated

borrowing costs, pinched cash flows and rising defaults.
"America is rising," Biden has said. "We are the strongest economy

Yet the renewed use of industrial policy, export controls and other protectionist measures is also stoking a backlash from trading

Trade protection is likely only to intensify should former president Donald Trump win re-election. Trump's plan to raise tariffs on US imports would spark a "free for all" in the global trading system that renders existing rules useless and hurts every economy, according to World Trade Organisation director-general Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala.



Culture ministry launches flagpole design contest

The Ministry of Culture has announced the launch of a flagpole design competition for the national flag of Qatar, starting from April 22 until the deadline on June 25.

Visual Arts Centre director Hoda al-Saadi said that the competition consists of designing and implementing a flagpole for the national flag, to be installed in various locations in the country and to become an artistic landmark and tourist attraction.

She added that the design must be innovative and artistic, exhibit a unique conceptual design and skillful production, and must be inspired by the local environment, history, and/or society, in an expression of national unity, solidarity, and pride.

The application must include a clear, executable, original and personally-made design, attached with a comprehensive description of all aspects and stages of the design, including the concept behind it, as well as all technical and engineering aspects and specifications such as measurements, dimensions, and raw materials to be used and their specifications.

The design must be three-dimensional, have at least two interfaces, and be designed using design software programs such as AutoCAD, 3D Max, Sketchup, or Revit, with all software programs used for the design indicated in the application.

The application must be sent in PDF format to visualartmoc. gov.qa, in addition to being submitted in hard copy format, printed on A3 paper, with the designer's name indicated at the back of the sheet, and must be placed in a sealed envelope and handed in at the Visual Arts Centre.

For quality purposes, the winner is obliged to attend all meetings and design workshops with the implementing agency and follow through with the project until the flagposts are installed on

Participants must be Qatari nationals and must participate with one design only.

The design must not have been submitted to other entities, competitions, or projects in Qatar, and cannot be used for any other entities, competitions, or projects until the winning design is announced.

The winning design's intellectual property rights will be transferred to the Ministry of Culture. - QNA

Helicopters crash in Malaysia, killing 10

Two Malaysian navy helicopters collided in mid-air during a rehearsal for a naval parade yesterday, killing all 10 crew members aboard. The incident occurred at the Lumut naval base in the western state of Perak at 9.32am yesterday (0132 GMT), the navy said.

"All victims were confirmed dead at the scene and sent to the Lumut naval base military hospital for identification," the navy said. The navy said it would carry out an investigation into the cause of the accident. - Reuters

China issues highest-level rain warning

More than 100,000 people have been evacuated due to heavy rain and fatal floods in southern China, with the government issuing its highestlevel rainstorm warning for the affected area yesterday. Torrential rains have lashed Guangdong province in recent days, swelling rivers and raising fears of severe flooding that state media said could be of the sort only "seen around once a century". - AFP

Community Police hold awareness lecture

The Community Police Department at the Ministry of Interior (MoI) organised a lecture on Monday at the residential complex of Qatar Energy in Al Khor area, a statement said, as part of the department's plan to implement an educational and guidance programme aimed at raising awareness among the company's employees and enhancing community partnerships.

munity Police 1 director Brigadier Dr Ibrahim Mohamed al-Sameeh outlined the concept of community policing and the roles it performs, as well as the strategy, objectives and imple-



mentation requirements.

He emphasised the role of community police in serving the community, strengthening ties with individuals and institutions, promoting a culture of crime prevention, reducing crime rates and enhancing public security.

The official also explained several key principles for crime prevention highlighting the importance of constructive and positive communication between the community members and the MoI to achieve comprehensive security.

Ministry reaffirms Qatar's commitment to sparing children from ravages of war

The Official Spokesperson for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA), Dr Majed bin Mohamed al-Ansari, has reaffirmed Qatar's commitment to sparing children from the horrors of war, regardless of their religious or ethnic backgrounds, and emphasised the necessity for the international community to consider the situation in Gaza from this perspective.

During the Foreign Ministry's weekly media briefing, Dr al-Ansari highlighted that the number of children dying in Gaza exceeds that of any conflict in past decades.

He stressed the need for international co-operation to understand the suffering resulting from this prolonged conflict and the daily tragedies they en-

Dr al-Ansari added that there is a generation of orphans suffering from the consequences of this war, and said that they must be cared for and spared the scourge of this humanitarian catastrophe and its

He pointed to a prevailing sense of frustration, not only among mediators but also across the international community, due to the failure to reach an agreement during Ramadan or Eid al-Fitr to alleviate the suffering of Palestinian brethren.

Dr al-Ansari said that Qatar is currently reassessing this phase of mediation efforts and has expressed displeasure on several occasions regarding continuous and fabricated attacks on mediators, especially Doha, despite its commitment to play a significant role in achieving a positive outcome that halts the war machine.

He highlighted Qatar's success in brokering a seven-day ceasefire, during which prisoners were exchanged between the Palestinian and Israeli sides.

The official reiterated that Qatar's diplomatic efforts continue through Gulf, Arab, and United Nations platforms, and said that HE the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Mohamed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim al-Thani will meet the Greek foreign minister today.

Dr al-Ansari added that HE the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs will meet his Armenian counterpart on Sunday, and lead the Qatar delegation participating in the World Economic Forum

Special Meeting on Global Collabora-

tion, Growth and Energy for Development, scheduled to take place in Rivadh on the same day. The official added that Qatar will

host the third edition of the Arab Economic and Co-operation Forum with the countries of Central Asia and Azerbaijan on Monday, where the minister will deliver the opening speech, in addition to holding meetings with top officials the same day.

Dr al-Ansari emphasised that all these diplomatic activities and ongoing efforts are aimed at de-escalating tensions in the region and end the ongoing war in the Gaza Strip. He also expressed dismay at statements made by

Israeli officials and ministers regarding Qatar's role in the negotiations, saying that they are fabricating lies for political purposes. Dr al-Ansari called for the cessation of these

statements, which distort reality and do not reflect commitment and seriousness in reaching a peaceful agreement and ending the conflict. He pointed out that Qatar's mediation efforts

that have yielded positive results on numerous occasions, leading to the return of 109 individuals to their families and halting the war multiple times. Regarding the possibility of a military operation in Rafah, Dr al-Ansari said that any Israeli attack

under the current situation in Rafah is entirely un-

acceptable amidst the ongoing humanitarian crisis. He stressed the importance of halting the anticipated attack on Rafah and compelling the Israeli side to adhere to the decisions of the International Court of Justice, the United Nations General Assembly, and the Security Council.

Dr al-Ansari affirmed Qatar's ongoing humanitarian commitment, with continuous airlifts and aid efforts, and diplomatic endeavours through the Gulf, Arab, and United Nations platforms.

He highlighted the arrival of 20 Russian and Ukrainian families, including 37 children, in Doha under a comprehensive programme aimed at providing healthcare and comprehensive support to these families and their children, as part of Qatar's ongoing mediation efforts to reunite families displaced by the Russian-Ukrainian conflict.

Doha will host these families until April 27. - QNA

UN calls for international probe into deaths at Gaza hospitals

The United Nations has called for an international investigation into reports of mass graves at two Gaza hospitals destroyed in Israeli sieges, saying war crimes might have been committed. The UN rights office said it was "horrified" by the destruction of Gaza's biggest hospital, Al-Shifa in Gaza City,

and its second largest, the Nasser Medical Complex in Khan Yunis. Gaza's Civil Defence agency said yesterday that health workers had uncovered nearly 340 bodies, updating an

earlier figure, of Palestinians allegedly killed and buried by Israeli forces at the Nasser complex. Israel's army dismissed claims that its troops had buried bodies during its operation at Nasser as "baseless and

The UN rights office demanded "independent, effective and transparent investigations into the deaths". "Given the prevailing climate of impunity, this should include international investigators." UN rights chief Volker Turk said in a statement.

Hospitals, which are protected under international law, have repeatedly come under Israeli bombardment over more than six months of war in Gaza. - AFP

Despite serving as a mediator in various conflicts, Oatar asserts that it does not benefit from such endeavours.

Instead, the primary beneficiaries are the conflicting parties themselves and external actors, including the US. Qatar refuses to succumb to congres-

sional pressure or electoral propaganda, rejecting any involvement in tarnishing its national reputation. It should be noted that Qatar and the

US are strategic allies. Qatar has been designated a major non-North Atlantic Treaty Organisation (Nato) ally by the US. Qatar's partnership with the US has

indeed strengthened over the years, with both countries engaging in various sectors beyond oil and gas.

Qatar has been a trustworthy partner for the US in the Middle East.

It has supported US military operations in the region and hosts the Al Udeid Air Base, one of the largest US military bases in the Middle East.

The trade relationship between Qatar and the US has flourished, with trade exceeding \$200bn.

Qatar is a significant market for US. exports, particularly in sectors such as aircraft, machinery, and technology.

The US is also a key destination for Qatari exports, including liquefied natural gas (LNG) and petrochemicals.

Qatar has been a major buyer of aircraft from the US aerospace company Boeing and the F16 fighter. These purchases have contributed to the US. economy and job creation in the civil and military aerospace industry.

Qatar Foundation's Education City is home to branch campuses of several elite American universities from where thousands of students have graduated over the

Further, a large number of Qatari students have graduated from many American universities, and many are studying currently.

Overall, the partnership between Qatar and the US is multifaceted and extends across economic, military, and security domains, contributing to stability and prosperity in the region and beyond.

That said, Oatar recently rejected US congressman Steny Hoyer's comments regarding the Gaza hostage crisis and his threat to "reevaluate" the US relationship with Oatar.

Hoyer said that Qatar, which along with Egypt is mediating negotiations for a ceasefire in Gaza, should tell Hamas there will be "repercussions" if it continues to block progress.

In response, Qatar said Hoyer's comments were not "constructive".

Qatar's embassy in the US said that "it is useful to remember that Qatar's mediation role exists only because we were asked by the US in 2012 to play this role. since regrettably. Israel and Hamas refuse to speak to each other directly".

It was reiterated that "Qatar is only a mediator".

Needless to say, such false accusations

destroy relationships. In November last year, Republican senator Ted Budd and Qatar's ambassador to the US Meshal Hamad al-Thani argued back and forth on social media, with the US lawmaker criticising the Gulf country for hosting Hamas while at the same time negotiating for the release of hostages held by the group in the Gaza Strip.

The Qatari envoy reminded Budd that he had earlier explained that the channel of communication between Oatar and Hamas was set up at the request of the US.

It was only because of Qatar's historic mediations that the US could withdraw its troops from Afghanistan.

Qatar sponsored the negotiations between the US and Afghanistan for several

Qatar's role as a facilitator of dialogue between all parties in Afghanistan during the two-decade war is widely considered one of the Gulf state's most prominent mediation efforts.

Qatar has been involved in talks both before and after the Taliban captured the Afghan capital, Kabul, on August 15, 2021.

Later, it assumed a more pivotal role by evacuating more than 100,000 Afghans and foreigners from the country, in what

has been described as history's largest airlift of people.

With regard to the ongoing Israeli incursion into Gaza, Qatar hosted all the American and Israeli parties and the Hamas movement, and the first phase was crowned with success

If the negotiation process had continued, we would have stopped the war of genocide and ethnic cleansing and saved the lives of thousands of innocent children, women, civilians, and also Israeli

The idea of demonising Qatar is a ridiculous and despicable idea that we have become accustomed to, and it has several factors, including that of political gains and the failure of all parties to reach a solution.

The reason is a desire for ultimate revenge and also the disgusting international support for Israel by obstructing

the Security Council from issuing any resolution against Israel.

We return to mediation.

I applaud my country's role in the courage to continue in the role of regional mediator, but we will not accept the affixation of accusations and the transmission of the narrative of Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, the failed, fanatical politician and his fascist government that uses religious texts, such as ISIS and others, that Qatar supports Hamas and is conveyed by members of the US Congress for unscrupulous political gain.

Qatari public opinion supports the government's approach to reconsider mediation because we do not accept that there will be political gain based on our country's reputation, and enough of the political hypocrisy.

It should not be forgotten that the Hamas office in Qatar is under special ar-

rangement by the US. Financial transfers to Gaza were part of the global Oatari humanitarian aid.

Qatar's role in Gaza has always been developmental and supporting the Palestinian brothers in Gaza and all of Palestine.

Some of Gaza's projects are in supporting schools, including the Al-Fakhoora programme, developing communications network, and urban development. building housing for people with limited income, and hospitals in Gaza, including Hamad Hospital.

All of these projects are working with the knowledge and co-ordination of all parties; it is not a secret.

In the face of political obstinacy, Qatar singles out Netanyahu for his intransigence, driven by internal ideological agendas and religious fervour.

It underscores the limited international support for Israel's actions, with only a handful of countries backing its stance in international forums such as the International Criminal Court.

Qatar reaffirms its commitment to mediation based on principles of mutual respect and trust.

It emphasises that genuine mediation requires integrity and a willingness to uphold impartiality, rather than succumbing to internal political skirmishes or external pressure.

Qatar's track record as a respected mediator, trusted by all parties, underscores its dedication to fostering peace and stability in the region. Despite criticism, Qatar contemplates

the possibility of withdrawing from mediation altogether, calling upon the international community, particularly superpowers, to bear their moral responsibility. Qatar suggests that relinquishing its

role as a mediator would compel powerful nations to assume greater accountability on the global stage, resonating with the sentiments of the Qatari public. In conclusion, Qatar's response to po-

litical pressure and propaganda underscores its unwavering commitment to mediation integrity and impartiality. As the nation navigates geopolitical

challenges, it remains steadfast in upholding its reputation as a trusted mediator and advocate for peace on the world

The ministry, in co-ordination with relevant entities, has developed a strategic plan to increase green spaces and the number of parks across the country, distributed among all municipalities in the coming years.

Mohamed Ibrahim al-Sada, acting director of the Public Gardens Department, said that the construction of the Mesaieed Park was completed within 10 months, and the department will supervise its maintenance and operation. The park, spread across 38,029sq m, includes a 676m sports track with rubber surface.

The green areas cover about 11,316sq m with natural grass, trees, and palms, irrigated using the latest automatic methods.

Further, the park features three football fields: the first with 1,847sq m for adults, the second with 450sq m for children aged

atar yesterday laid the foundation stone for its pavilion at EXPO 2025 Osaka, Kansar, Japan, aiming to further fortify the comprehensive strategic bilateral partnership, which has been flourishing for more than

50 years.

The event was attended by Jaber Jaralla al-Marri, Qatar's ambassador to Japan and Commissioner-General of Qatar at EXPO 2025; and Sheikh Ali Alwaleed al-Thani, deputy commissioner-general and chairman of the preparation committee for Qatar's participation in EXPO 2025 Osaka, as well as a number of political, media, social and business figures in addition to EXPO organising committee representatives.

The EXPO, which will be held from April 13 to October 13, 2025, will focus on three sub-themes "Saving Lives, Empowering Lives and Connecting Lives."

The pavilion was collaboratively designed by Qatar Museums and Kengo Kuma and Associates after extensive visits to Doha by the de-

The pavilion's design is inspired by a fusion of Qatari and Japanese cultures, particularly the shared elements such as the wood used in the building of traditional dhows, the wood used in the construction of traditional Japanese houses and the fabric used in their interiors. The total area of the pavilion is es-

timated at 1,292sq m.

China Southern Airlines' Guangzhou-Doha services commence



amad International Airport has announced the commencement of four weekly flights from Guangzhou to Doha by China Southern Airlines, further enhancing connectivity between China and Qatar.

This follows the codeshare announcement between Qatar Airways and China Southern Airlines in February this year.

Commenced on Monday, the route was being served by a Boeing B787-9 aircraft with a capacity of some 203 seats.

This new service by China Southern Airlines supplements Qatar Airways' existing operations to seven major cities in China – Beijing, Shanghai, Guangzhou, Hangzhou, Chengdu, Chongqing, and Xiamen, offering over 27,000 weekly seats to and from Doha through Hamad International Airport.

As one of China's largest airlines, China Southern Airlines operates around 3,000 daily flights to more than 200 destinations globally.

It joined Hamad International Airport as the second Chinese airline, following Xiamen Airlines, and marks the fourth airline to commence operations to the airport in 2024, after Akasa Air,
