#### Silencing the media has never worked and never will

Through its despicable and pathetic move to close Al Jazeera's offices, Israel has once again proved that it is a liar, does not believe in democracy, free journalism nor follow the international laws or the orders from the International Court of Justice

It is unfortunate that the world is a mute witness the state of gangsters trying to get away with their unpardonable crimes against humanity while blaming others to hide the failure of their management.

As Al Jazeera Media Network stated yesterday, ironically as the world marked World Press Freedom Day, the Israeli government closed Al Jazeera's offices preventing the public from accessing its content, disregarding the universally recognised fundamentals of freedom of expression. Israel's ongoing suppression of the free press, seen as an effort to conceal its actions in the Gaza Strip, stands in contravention of international and humanitarian law. Israel has killed more than 140 Palestinian journalists since the beginning of the war on Gaza. The world has not forgotten that Israeli forces used lethal force without justification when they shot and killed Al Jazeera journalist Shireen Abu Akleh in the occupied West Bank in May 2022. violating her "right to life". Abu Akleh, a Christian American citizen and acclaimed correspondent for the Doha-

## Al Jazeera offices in Israel shut down

#### Network condemns violation of right to information access

n a deceptive and slanderous move, the Israeli cabinet, led by Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, unanimously voted to shut down Al Jazeera's offices in Israel, the network said in a statement issued in Doha yesterday.

"They also chose to withdraw crew accreditations as well as banning media service providers from transmitting its broadcasts and blocking Al Jazeera Media Network websites.

"Ironically as the world marked World Press Freedom Day; the Israeli government closed Al Jazeera's offices, preventing the public from accessing its content, disregarding the universally recognised fundamentals of freedom of expression.

"Al Jazeera Media Network strongly condemns and denounces this criminal act that violates human rights and the basic right to access of information. Al Jazeera affirms its right to continue to provide news and information to its global audiences

"Israel's ongoing suppression of the free press, seen as an effort to conceal its actions in the Gaza Strip, stands in contravention of international and humanitarian law. Israel's direct targeting and killing of journalists, arrests, intimidation and threats will not deter Al Jazeera from its commitment to cover, whilst more than 140 Palestinian journalists have been killed since the beginning of the war on Gaza.

"The Network vehemently rejects the allegations presented by Israeli authorities suggesting professional media standards have been violated. It reaffirms its unwavering commitment to the values embodied by its Code of

"Al Jazeera urges all media freedom, human rights, and other concerned organisations, to condemn the repeated attacks on journalists and the press by Israel, and to hold those responsible to account. The Network will pursue all available legal channels through international legal institutions in its quest to protect both its rights and iournalists, as well as the public's right to information. Targeting journalists is a crime," the statement added.

## Hamas, Israel in truce stalemate

Hamas official said yesterday the group's delegation for Gaza truce talks in Cairo was leaving, after public disagreement with Israel intensified over demands to end their sevenmonth war.

Earlier, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said "surrendering" to a demand to end the war would amount to defeat.

The political chief of Hamas, Ismail Haniyeh, countered by accusing Netanyahu of sabotaging

The Hamas official, who requested anonymity to discuss the negotiations, told AFP that "the meeting with the Egyptian intelligence minister has ended and the Hamas delegation is leaving for further consultations".

The Hamas negotiators are due back in Cairo tomorrow, said Al-Qahera News, a site linked to Egyptian intelligence services.

CIA director Bill Burns meanwhile was headed for "emergency" talks on mediation efforts, a source with knowledge of the discussions told AFP.

Netanyahu yesterday also announced a government decision to close operations in Israel of Oatarbased news channel Al Jazeera, which has broadcast round-theclock coverage of the conflict.

It went off-air a short time later. The network condemned Israel's decision as a "criminal act", and said it would take legal action.

Israel's military offensive has killed at least 34,683 people in Gaza, mostly women and children, according to the Hamas-run territory's health ministry.

## MoECC launches aerial monitoring service



The aircraft has the ability to early detect fires in wild areas, by searching for any smoke plumes or abnormal temperature points.

The Ministry of Environment and Climate Change yesterday (MoECC) launched an environmental and meteorological monitoring initiative through autogyro or gyrocopter.

The launch event at Umm Shakhout airstrip was attended by HE the Minister of Environment and Climate Change Dr Abdullah bin Abdulaziz bin Turki al-Subaie, who took a tour in the small aircraft over a large swathe of land and sea.

Commenting on the event. HE the Minister said the initiative comes within the framework of the MoECC's direction to use modern means and advanced technology to achieve its mission aimed at protecting the local environment and its biodiversity.

He described the aerial monitoring as a new phase in environmental protection and biodiversity conservation, relying primarily on the use of technological development and artificial intelligence. The MoECC seeks to augment its collaboration with national scientific and research institutions, including Hamad Bin Khalifa University, University of Doha for Science and Technology, Qatar University, and ExxonMobil Research Qatar.

A statement from the MoECC explained that the gyrocopter deployed for the task features advanced technologies including remote sensing and high-resolution photo and video cameras. wireless communications system with various devices installed on the ground.

During its flights to monitor the environment and conduct scientific research, there will be an environmental observer accompanying the pilot of the craft, and communicating directly with the MoECC's ground teams, which undertakes rapid measures as required. To Page 9

## MoFA unveils new website

E the Secretary-General of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA), Dr Ahmed bin Hassan al-Hammadi, launched yesterday the MoFA's new website, which was built in accordance with the latest global technologies.

The newly launched website is set to carry the MoFA's activities and events and highlight its vision and mission, and the achievements of Qatar's diplomacy.

Director of Information Technology at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Abdulaziz bin Mohamed al-Naemi, said the new site would offer several advanced E-services, including those related to attestations.

For attestations, applicants can log in using the national authentication system (NAS), and submit their requests, while handing the documents to be carried in collaboration with Qatar Post, he said.



He added that the new website would offer around-the-clock support in nine languages, in collaboration with the Government Contact Center (109).

Meanwhile, Media and Communication Department Director, Ibrahim bin Sultan al-Hashmi, said that the new website will serve in its first phase as a reference and open archive for the Mo-FA's data before expanding in the second phase to a photo gallery and a page that documents Qatar's several regional and international mediation achievements.

He added that the website's content will be available in Spanish and French in the next stage.

Al-Hashmi added the site's content had been developed to streamline access to official data and information on Qatar's all diplomatic missions, in addition to displaying news, events and various activities of the MoFA and Qatari diplomatic missions abroad. (QNA)
































# Shura, GCC to hold panel discussion on diversity, safeguarding Gulf identity

#### **Qatar National Archive** holds second meeting





## Ashghal's stormwater drainage tunnel project aims to protect vital assets

he Public Works Authority 'Ashghal' announced the commencement of construction of a stormwater drainage tunnel within the Critical Asset Resilience Programme (CARP), with the aim of protecting vital assets as part of the Flood Prevention Scheme – Phase 3 (Doha South).

Manager of the Drainage Networks Projects Department at Ashghal Eng Khalid Saif al-Khayareen explained that the project comes within the Authority's efforts to protect people and assets from the negative impacts of rainwater accumulation in several vital areas in Doha South, the most important of which is the intersection of Mohamed Bin Thani Street and Ahmed Bin Ali Street, Hamad Hospital tunnel and the surrounding areas, in addition to a number of government facilities and institutions in the area, including the Ministry of Interior, the Shura Council, the Fire Station Museum and others.

In line with the sustainable development objectives and the Qatar National Strategy for En-

vironment and Climate Change, the project will provide a long-term solution to reduce rainwater accumulation in the aforementioned areas instead of relying on the use of temporary pumps during the rainy season. These works would increase road safety and enhance the protection of public and private assets, Eng Khalid Saif al-Khayareen underlined.

The project work includes constructing a stormwater drainage tunnel with a length of approximately 1.7km and a diameter of 1,400mm. Excavation work will be conducted at depths ranging between seven and 10 metres below the ground level, using a tunnel boring machine, and with the aim of reducing the impact of the work on traffic and on the area's residents and institutions. It is expected that the construction of the stormwater drainage tunnel will be completed in Q4 of 2024. (QNA)

## Over 1,500 healthcare professionals attend **HMC** conference

ore than 1,500 healthcare professionals attended the 8th Qatar Diabetes, Endocrinology, and Metabolic Conference 2024 from May 2-4, hosted by Hamad Medical Corporation's (HMC) Endocrine and Diabetes Division, Department of Medicine, and the Qatar Metabolic Institute (QMI).

mated to be pre-diabetic," he said. "Qatar is at the forefront of research and treatment of this condition. Earlier this year we opened the Qatar Diabetes Research Centre at Hamad Medical Corporation and also launched the landmark Qatar Diabetes Prevention Programme which are spearheading a personalised approach diabetes and its prevention."





On December 15, 2023, while al-Dahdouh and his cameraman Samer Abu Daqqa were covering the Haifa School airstrike in Khan Younis, they were hit by an Israeli missile, injuring Dahdouh and fatally wounding Abu Daqqa.

His son, journalist Hamza al-Dahdouh, was killed by an Israeli airstrike in Khan Younis on January 7 this year, and two of his nephews were killed in an airstrike the following day.

Of the more than 34,000 Palestinians killed by Israel in the seven months, the majority are women and children.

In its annual report published in January this year, the New Yorkbased Human Rights Watch accused Israel of war crimes and said many governments were expressing "selective outrage" over atrocities committed in the conflict in Gaza.

Undoubtedly, the Israeli government's decision to shut down Al Jazeera in the country is a blatant violation of press freedom and an effort to hide the truth of the Gaza war.

The action is a repressive and retaliatory measure against the professional role of Al Jazeera in exposing the crimes and violations in Gaza, and represents the culmination of the declared war against journalists, aimed at concealing the truth.

If Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and his cabinet are thinking that they can continue to fool the world by continuing their autocratic and ruthless actions, they should realise that their masks have been torn away

With a focus on metastasis - the threatening spread of cancer cells to distant organs - the study revealed alarming statistics about the prevalence and patterns of metastasis in lung cancer pa-

This highlighted the urgent need for more comprehensive research to address the challenges posed by the disease.

Traditionally, obesity has been viewed as an adverse prognostic factor in various diseases; however, the study introduces a paradoxical association with lung cancer outcomes.



Studies have indicated that the inverse association between obesity and lung cancer is primarily observed among smokers, suggesting that smoking may confound this relationship. Other studies suggest that weight loss, resulting from damage to lung tissue over a long period of time and declining lung function, may precede the diagnosis of lung cancer.

The researchers revealed that while obesity significantly increases readmissions in lung cancer patients, it reduces the risk of surgical complications.

Dr Waqas Sami, assistant professor of Pre-Clinical Affairs at QU's College of Nursing (pictured), said: "To gain a more detailed comprehension of the link between metabolically healthy obesity and lung cancer metastasis, a heightened emphasis on follow-up or randomised controlled trials, coupled with the application of advanced meta-analysis techniques, is recommended."

## New self-recycling plastic could combat ocean pollution

Every day, the equivalent of 2,000 garbage trucks full of plastic are dumped into the world's oceans, rivers, and lakes. This statement from the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) website, drives home the point that plastic pollution is a global problem. Every year 19-23mn tonnes of plastic waste leaks into aquatic ecosystems, polluting lakes, rivers and seas. Plastic pollution can alter habitats and natural processes, reducing ecosystems' ability to adapt to climate change, directly affecting millions of people's livelihoods, food production capabilities and social well-being, according to the UNEP.

So much for a depressing but factual introduction about plastic pollution. But a latest breakthrough has come as a beacon of hope. A team of researchers from UC San Diego has created a form of plastic that can basically recycle itself. Dr Adam Feist and Professor Jon Pokorski combined traditional polyurethane with a microbial spore to create plastic that can break down in compost or any other natural environment in around five months. The newly crafted biodegradable thermoplastic polyurethane (TPU) is just as durable and elastic as traditional polyurethane, with the ability to stretch up to 15 times its original size. TPU is used in footwear, floor mats, cushions, and memory foam. But unlike other plastic, the new blend almost completely decomposes much faster.

The biodegradable TPU was made with bacterial spores from

a strain of Bacillus subtilis that has the ability to break down plastic polymer materials. Pokorski and Feist say that will help the environment by eliminated waste. They say plastic companies can start to massproduce this kind of "self-eating" plastic right now, simply by adding the microbial spores to their existing ingredients. It's about 10% more expensive, but they believe that's worth it to help with pollution and climate change. "

To make the biodegradable plastic, the researchers fed

Bacillus subtilis spores and TPU pellets into a plastic extruder. The ingredients were mixed and melted at over 200F, then extruded as thin strips of plastic. To assess the material's biodegradability, the strips were placed in both microbially active and sterile compost environments. Prof Pokorski said the compost setups were maintained at around 100F with a relative humidity ranging from 44-55%. Water and other nutrients in the compost triggered germination of the spores within the plastic strips, which reached 90% degradation within five months.

Although the researchers still need to study what gets left behind after the material degrades, they believe that any lingering bacterial spores are likely harmless. Pokorski explained that Bacillus subtilis is a strain used in probiotics that's generally regarded as safe to humans and animals and can even be beneficial to plant health. For the study, published in the journal Nature Communications, the bacterial spores were evolutionary nudged to adapt to the hot temperatures necessary for manufacturing the TPU. The spores also serve as a strengthening filler, similar to how rebar reinforces concrete, resulting in a TPU variant with enhanced mechanical properties—requiring more force to break and showing greater stretchability.

"This is great because the addition of spores pushes the mechanical properties beyond known limitations where there was previously a trade-off between tensile strength and stretchability," said Pokorski. The research team is now working on optimising the approach for use on an industrial scale.



## In the dock: Pivotal climate change testimonies in US

- **■** Court to clarify how climate change affects human rights
- Hundreds of people offer testimony on climate upheaval
- **■** Court's advisory opinion to shape future litigation

rom Mexicans left homeless by rising seas to Colombians affected by coral bleaching, hundreds of people are telling the top human rights court in the Americas what climate change means to them in an historic case that could shape international law.

Environmental lawyers also hope the hearings at the Inter-American Court of Human Rights (IACHR), which were requested by Colombia and Chile, will define the duties of states to confront the climate crisis and stop it infringing on human rights.

As well as receiving submissions from climate victims, the Costa Rica-based court, which started its inquiry in Barbados in April, will hear from UN agencies, legal experts, grassroots environmental campaign groups, and youth groups.

The next sessions are due to be held in Brasilia and then Manaus, Brazil at the end of May, and an advisory opinion is expected by May 2025.

"We're hoping that the court's legal opinion is a guide and reference for Mexico, and other states, to develop public policies from a climate justice perspective," said Nora Cabrera, a lawyer and head of Our Future, a Mexico-based youth climate justice campaign group.

"And that it includes loss and damage compensation for affected communities, and adaptation policies for those not yet directly affected by climate change," said Cabrera, who will be speaking at the next hearing in Manaus.

In January, Colombia and Chile asked the IACHR to issue the advisory opinion, saying that they were experiencing the "daily challenge of dealing with the consequences of the climate emergency," including fires, landslides, droughts and floods.

"These events reveal the need for an urgent response based on the principles of equity, justice, co-operation and sustainability, with a human rights-based approach," they said in their petition.

"There is a close relationship between the climate emergency and the violation of human rights," they added.

It is this link between climate change and human rights that the IACHR will seek to define, while also examining how climate change affects migration and looking at the disproportionate effect on children, women and Indigenous people.

Chile and Colombia also

asked the court for clarification on a state's duties to protect environmental activists.

Latin America is the most dangerous place in the world for environmental and land defenders, according to advocacy group Global Witness. Around 90% of the 177 killings of environmental activists recorded in 2022 took place in the region.

"The hearing aims to ask for clarity about human rights obligations and the climate crisis," said Jacob Kopas, senior attorney at the Earthjustice environmental group, one of a group of lawyers who spoke at the Barbados hearing on April 26.

"It will help to create a more concise framework to guide state behaviour and policy to confront the climate crisis and protect human rights," said Kopas.

Among those submitting testimonies will be the residents of the El Bosque fishing community in Tabasco, Mexico, where rising sea levels caused by climate change have swept away about 200 meters of coastline.

Since 2019, the school and

more than 50 homes have been destroyed, forcing about 200 people to leave.

El Bosque community leader, Guadalupe Cobos, said she and 10 neighbours will probably have to leave within a year and resettle in an area about 12km away, where new homes are being built by the government.

"We depend on the sea but coastal erosion has affected our way of life. It's important for the court to know that we're living climate change now and that this isn't something that will happen in the future in 20 or 50 years' time," said Cobos.

"We want the court to hear our experiences and to know that our rights have been violated, that we have been forced to migrate," Cobos told the Thomson Reuters Foundation.

The court's advisory opinion could have important implications for climate litigation across Latin America and the Caribbean and make it easier for communities living with the effects of global warming to take legal action.

The opinion will apply to all signatories of the American Convention on Human Rights, most of whom are members of the Organization of American States. The United States and Canada have not ratified the treaty however.

The advisory opinion will help shape the region's legal systems as many countries incorporate its jurisprudence into their laws and constitutions.

"We're hoping that the court makes the link between the climate crisis and human rights violations and that it recognises climate displacement," said Cabrera, whose organisation has been supporting the El Bosque community.

The IACHR is known for its progressive stance on climate justice and human rights.

In March, it recognised that citizens in Peru have the right to a healthy environment when it ruled in favor of people living in the Andean mining town of La Oroya, who had suffered from decades of environmental pollution.

Other courts are also breaking new ground in this sphere. In Colombia in April, in

response to a lawsuit filed by a farming couple who were driven out of their home by flooding caused by heavy rains, the country's constitutional court recognised the links between environmental disasters and climate change and people being forcibly displaced.

Across the world, other top courts are also examining the connection between human rights and climate change. On April 9, the European Court of Human Rights (ECHR) ruled that the Swiss government had violated the human rights of its citizens by failing to do enough to combat climate change.

Two other courts - the
International Court of Justice
(ICJ) and the International
Tribunal for the Law of the
Seas (ITLOS) — are also
expected to give advisory
opinions on international legal
obligations of states regarding
climate change.

Kopas said the IACHR ruling could lead the way by delivering a "forward-reaching and progressive" advisory opinion.

#### **Police kill** 'radicalised' teenager in Australia

Pestern Australian police shot and killed a "radicalised" 16-year-old boy with a knife who had stabbed a man in a Perth car park, police and the state premier said yesterday.

The teenager "rushed" at police who responded by shooting him twice with Tasers before firing a single fatal shot, they said.

"There are indications he had been radicalised online. But I want to reassure the community at this stage it appears he acted solely and alone." Premier Roger Cook said.

Prime Minister Anthony Albanese said he had been briefed on the incident by police and intelligence agencies, which advised there was no ongoing threat.

Police received a call late on Saturday from a male warning that he was going to commit "acts of violence" but without giving his name or location, the state's police commissioner, Col Blanch, told reporters.

Within minutes, another emergency call alerted police that a "male with a knife was running around the car park" in Willetton, a southern suburb of Perth, he said.

Police body camera images showed the teenager refused officers' demands that he put down the knife, the police chief said.

Officers fired two Tasers at him but "both of them did not have the full desired effect", he said. "The male continued to advance on the third officer with a firearm who fired a single shot and fatally wounded the male."

The "middle-aged" man who had been stabbed was in a "serious" but stable condition and appeared to be doing well, the police commissioner said.

Police believe the teenager sent "relevant messages" to some members of the Muslim community who immediately called police, he said, without giving details of the messages. - AFP/Reuters

## **UN accuses Israel of continued** denial of aid access to Gaza

While not a formal famine declaration, World Food Programme (WFP) executive director Cindy McCain said - in an NBC News interview broadcast yesterday that based on the "horror" on the ground: "There is famine, full-blown famine, in the north, and it's moving its way south."

Israel's government did not immediately

respond to a request for comment on Mc-Cain's remarks.

The head of the UN Palestinian refugee agency (UNRWA), Philippe Lazzarini, meanwhile accused Israel of continuing to deny the United Nations aid access in Gaza as it tries to avert famine.

"Just this week, they have denied - for the second time - my entry to Gaza where I planned to be with our UNRWA colleagues, including those on the front lines," he posted on X.

Lazzarini has been to Gaza four times since the war broke out including on March

"Only in the past two weeks, we have recorded 10 incidents involving shooting at convoys, arrests of UN staff including bullying, stripping them naked, threats with

arms and long delays at checkpoints forcing convoys to move during the dark or abort," Lazzarini wrote yesterday.

Israel's government did not immediately respond to a request for comment on Lazzarini's remarks.

Lazzarini also called on "Hamas and other armed groups to stop any attacks on humanitarian crossings, refrain from aid diversion and make sure assistance reaches all those in need".

The militants claimed responsibility yesterday for an attack that shut down the main humanitarian aid crossing into Gaza.

A UN-backed report in March said famine was imminent and likely by May in northern Gaza, and could spread across the enclave by July.

Famine is assessed as at least 20% of the

population suffering extreme food shortages, with one in three children acutely malnourished and two people out of every 10,000 dying daily from starvation or from malnutrition and disease.

UN officials say that generally by the time a famine is formally declared somewhere it is too late to save many people.

UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres said last week that the most vulnerable in northern Gaza "are already dying of hunger and disease".

Israel is retaliating against Hamas over the events of October 7 in which Israel about 1,200 people were killed and more than 250 people taken hostage.

#### **Top Afghan** diplomat in **India quits** after gold smuggling reports

fghanistan's top diplomat in India resigned days after she was reportedly caught by airport authorities smuggling nearly \$2mn worth of gold into the country.

Zakia Wardak, the Afghan consul-general in India's financial capital Mumbai, posted a statement on social media platform X announcing her resignation.

Afghanistan's embassy in New Delhi shut down in November, more than two years after the Taliban returned to power in Kabul following the collapse of the Western-backed government, leaving Wardak as the country's most senior representative in In-

"It is with great regret that I announce my decision to step away from my role at the consulate and embassy in India, effective May 5, 2024." Wardak said on Saturday.

Indian media reports said Wardak was stopped last month by financial intelligence authorities at Mumbai airport on arrival from Dubai - along with her son carrying 25kg of gold.

She was not arrested because of her diplomatic immunity, the reports said, but the gold - worth around \$1.9mn - was confiscated.

Wardak's resignation leaves thousands of Afghan nationals, including students and business men, without any consular representation in India.

Most foreign nations - including India - do not officially recognise Afghanistan's Taliban government, but acknowledge them as the de facto ruling authority.

In many Afghan missions, diplomats appointed by the former government have refused to cede control of embassy buildings and property to representatives of the Taliban authorities.

Wardak said in the statement that she had "encountered numerous personal attacks and defamation" over the past year.

Such incidents "have demonstrated the challenges faced by women in Afghan society", she added, making no explicit reference to the gold allegations.

The Taliban authorities have full control of around a dozen Afghan embassies abroad - including in Pakistan, China, Turkiye

and Iran. Others operate on a hybrid system, with the ambassador gone but embassy staff still carrying out

routine consular work such as issuing visas and other documents. Most countries evacuated their missions from Kabul as the Taliban closed in on the Afghan capital

in August 2021, although a handful of embassies - including Pakistan, China and Russia - never shut, and still have ambassadors in Kabul. - AFP

## French bakers make world's longest baguette, beating Italy

#### Niger gold mines ordered shut over animal deaths

neveral gold mines in northern Niger managed by a Chinese company were ordered to temporarily close after dozens of animals died from drinking wastewater, local authorities told AFP yesterday. Herders around the town of Tabelot had pointed to Sahara SARL's mines as the only explanation for their animals' deaths, saying the re-

gion was not suffering from drought or any epidemics. "We counted 24 dead over two days and at the end of April we finally realised that the slaughter was being caused by harmful products in the water the mines were rejecting," said Youssaf Houssa, the chief of

Tamannit, one of the affected villages. Almou Akoli, who lives in Fasso, another village, said he lost 16 animals while some of his "neighbours cannot keep track of how many they have lost".

China's Sahara SARL started mining gold in January in the middle of grazing grounds where there are hardly any natural waterholes. Following a visit on Friday by police investigators, Niger's ministry of mines ordered the temporary closure of at least four of the mining

sites, according to the sources. "The Chinese have suspended work and we are monitoring our ani-

mals," said Houssa. Private local newspaper Air Info said an official report confirmed that "the catastrophe" was caused by chemical products used in the mines that threaten the water table in what is already a hostile environment for animal husbandry.

French company Orano (formerly Areva), which has been extracting uranium in northern Niger for more than 40 years, is regularly accused by non-governmental organisations (NGOs) of polluting the environment. - AFP
