E the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Mohamed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim al-Thani has affirmed that under the leadership and wisdom of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani, embodied in the Qatar National Vision 2030, Qatar has successfully navigated significant challenges, leading to the flexibility that characterises its economy and positioning it competitively on the global stage, with efficient investment in natural resources and human energies.

Addressing the 4th Qatar Economic Forum, under the theme "A World Remade: Navigating the Year of Uncertainty," HE Sheikh Mohamed said that the Qatari economy continues to achieve indicators reflecting its stability and prosperity, adding that the gross domestic product at constant prices until the third quarter of 2023 recorded growth of about 1.6% and this growth coincided with improvements in finan-

Alongside this summit, the "Startup Qatar" project was launched, with more than 250 startups registered.

He also announced the launch of the "Al Fanar" Arabic Artificial Intelligence project, which will primarily focus on collecting quality data in the Arabic language, contributing to enriching large linguistic models and preserving the Arab identity.

'Qatar will continue its efforts for Gaza ceasefire'

atar will continue its efforts to reach an agreement leading to the cessation of the Israeli war on the Gaza Strip, as long as there is an opportunity to achieve this goal, official spokesperson for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Dr Majid bin Mohamed al-Ansari, said yesterday.

During the weekly media briefing, he highlighted that this Qatari stance has been repeatedly affirmed, and it was reiterated by HE the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Mohamed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim al-Thani, during his speech at the opening session of the fourth edition of 'Qatar Economic Forum, Powered by Bloomberg?


Dr al-Ansari pointed out that from day one, Qatari negotiators have not ceased their efforts to explore and open all doors to reach an agreement, emphasising the



need to assess the seriousness of the parties involved in reaching an agreement to end the war, which has been the driving force for Qatar to evaluate its mediation efforts and clarify the points.

He explained that the mediation is ongoing, but Qatar will never accept its mediation being misrepresented or exploited for any political, electoral, or other internal purposes, stating that Qatar has chosen this path sincerely, demonstrated its commitment, and will continue its role as a mediator and work to bridge the gap between the negotiating parties until reaching peace.

HMC launches sterile compounding pharmacy at NCCCR

state-of-the-art sterile compounding pharmacy has been opened at Hamad Medical Corporation's (HMC) National Centre for Cancer Care and Research (NCCCR).

The new facility was officially opened at the NCCCR by Ali al-Janahi, acting assistant, managing director of HMC along with other dignitaries.

Sterile compounding involves preparing medications in an environment free from bacteria, viruses, or any other potentially infectious microorganisms. Sterile compounding is used for preparations that will

be administered through injections, including chemotherapy, antibiotics and others.

Dr Mohamed Salem al-Hassan, CEO and medical director of NC-CCR and chairman, Corporate Cancer Services at HMC said the new sterile compounding pharmacy will have a direct positive impact on patient care.

"This cutting-edge facility is another key part of NCCCR's advanced treatment options, further establishing its position as a leading cancer care centre in the region," Dr al-Hassan said.

"The facility is also equipped

with cutting-edge technologies and staffed by highly trained professionals to ensure the highest standards of safety and efficacy."

Dr Anas Hamad, director of Pharmacy Department at NCCCR said the new pharmacy is a unique set-up where only very few clean rooms in the entire Mena region have the same high standards.

"The pharmacy is designed with utmost precision and adherence to international standards, particularly the guidelines set by top regulatory bodies for chemotherapy compounding," Dr Hamad said. "It increases the department's capacity of chemotherapy production by 67% and IV medications production by 100% which is of great benefit to our patients, meaning they can get their medications faster and more conveniently."

The new unit adheres to the stringent standards set by the United States Pharmacopeia (USP), an independent, scientific nonprofit organisation focused on building trust in the supply of safe, quality medicines. The USP standards guarantees the quality and purity of the medications, significantly contributing to positive patient outcomes.

Qatar doing its best in Gaza mediation but fundamental differences persist: PM

E the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Moham-Led bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim al-Thani stressed that the best way to stop the ongoing fighting in the Gaza Strip, which Qatar is demanding, is reaching an agreement, putting an end to the atrocities committed against civilians, and negotiating an agreement to release the hostages, considering that achieving this would enable an agreement to be reached within days.

During the opening session of the Qatar Economic Forum, HE the Prime Minister indicated that there is uncertainty about how to stop the war on the Israeli side, which is not inclined to this option, adding that when the talk is about an agreement to reach a ceasefire, a lot of politics say that they would go on with the war. He stressed that Qatar would continue to work and pressure, along with partners to reach an agreement, provided that the warring parties help facilitate this as the issue is ultimately in their hands.

He pointed out that process is long and stressful, as some momentum has been observed over the past weeks, but unfortunately things have not moved in the appropriate direction. The situation is currently going through a state of stagnation, especially after what happened in Rafah.

He added that Qatar has not stopped its role as mediator despite facing many challenges in the past few weeks, which prompted Qatar to conduct a re-evaluation. Qatar did not want to be exploited as a mediator and wanted to make clear to everyone that its role is limited to mediation. Oatar is doing this and will continue to do so, saying that he believes Qatar has achieved great progress.

HE Sheikh Mohamed also noted that what makes the negotiation process difficult is the presence of fundamental differences. There is one side that wants to end the war and then talk about the hostages, and the other side wants to release the hostages and continue the war. As long as there is no point of understanding between the two sides, it's hard to reach a result, warning that what is happening in the Gaza Strip requires saying, "enough".

HE Sheikh Mohamed added that looking at the disaster in Gaza, most reports confirmed that reconstruction requires \$40-50bn and will continue until 2040. Regarding the Hamas movement's office in Doha, HE the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs indicated that the presence of a political office for the Hamas movement in Doha began in 2012 with the aim of creating a channel of communication between them, the Israelis, and Americans.

He pointed out that this channel has proved to be effective in light of the various conflicts from 2014 until today, explaining that this office has played a major role, including the release of hostages (109 hostages) thanks to Qatari mediation in the negotiations, which is the only hostages' release operation during the ongoing war and did not come as a result of pressure or military action.

Qatar's vision and point of view see the necessity of having access for all parties to resolve the conflict. He stressed that Qatar is not a party to the conflict, adding that

Qatar's principles and policies that support the Palestinians in implementing the two-state solution have not changed, and as long as Qatar has the ability, it will help, as it has done so between Afghanistan, the Taliban and the US, and between the various parties in Lebanon, Sudan, and others. This is at the core of Oatar's foreign policy (to build on mediation to help resolve and settle disputes between the parties and work to find a regional consensus).

Regarding the situation in the Gaza Strip after the war, HE Sheikh Mohamed stressed that it is still too early to talk about this matter. He said that Qatar believes in a single Palestinian government responsible for the West Bank and Gaza. This Palestinian government must be formed by consensus among the Palestinians to lead the transitional process in the country, but the Israeli government's statements reject the existence of the Palestinian Authority.

He indicated that with the total destruction of the Strip without a vision for the role of the Palestinian Authority, the situation will be difficult not only for Qatar but for the entire world.

In this regard, HE the Prime Minister said that Qatar is working with its Arab partners, the Six-Party Committee, and the US to think about the best way until the day after the war so that it does not affect the Palestinians and the Palestinian cause, and does not undermine the Palestinian

Regarding Qatar's investment plans and areas in the coming period, HE Sheikh Mohamed stated that the sovereign wealth fund follows a diversification strategy, adding that the US has been a significant market in recent years, and Asia is also attracting major Qatari investments. He added that Qatar is looking to expand in emerging markets like Central Asia and Africa, while ensuring that investments are not high-risk and secure and offer guaranteed returns, especially considering these investments are for the benefit of future

He added that domestically, Qatar has aunched its Third National Development Strategy, which is considered the third phase of implementing Vision 2030. He emphasised that while Qatar focused on infrastructure in the past 25 years, the current phase is about building on past achievements, pointing out that the core of the third strategy is focusing on human capital, unleashing its potential, and opening opportunities for the private sector, allowing the government to step back or withdraw, transitioning to a regulatory role. He also noted that the government is working on creating an incentive programme to encourage the private sector and foreign investors, focusing on logistical affairs, tourism, information and communication technology, financial services, and other sectors.

He pointed out that essential sectors like healthcare and education witnessed significant progress in infrastructure investment, with room for improvement in the economic aspect of healthcare, research, and development.

Regarding investment in AI and semiconductors, the PM reaffirmed that AI requires massive investments in infrastructure and application, pointing out that Qatar is focusing on complementing the efforts of other countries, given ambitious projects in Saudi Arabia and the UAE. He explained that the focus is on improving core programs for AI utilisation or infrastructure-related aspects. (QNA)

Malaysian PM lauds Qatar, partners' mediation efforts for Gaza ceasefire

alaysian Prime Minister Dr Anwar Ibrahim lauded Qatar and other mediators for their concerted efforts towards securing a ceasefire and ending the conflict in Gaza, highlighting the need for lasting peace in the region.

Speaking at a session during the Qatar Economic Forum 2024, Powered by Bloomberg, Dr Ibrahim expressed his support for the mediation initiatives led by Qatar, the Arab League, the Organisation of Islamic Co-operation (OIC), and the international community.

He stressed the importance of readiness to achieve peace and urged respect for the decisions and recommendations put forth by neighbouring countries. "What is their strong request? To stop the continued aggression, atrocities against children, (and) women due to the bombardment of Gaza and that includes the settlements... illegal occupation. We are talking about colonisation.

"What was discussed in Ukraine was about colonisation, it is robbing, it's possession of other lands, that's all, and for that, I am sympathetic with them," said Ibrahim at the discussion, moderated by Bloomberg Television anchor Francine Lacqua.

Regarding Malaysia's diplomatic relations, the Malaysian Prime Minister reiterated his country's strong ties with China and the United States, noting the influx of investments from technology giants such as Microsoft, Google, and Nvidia. He cited Malaysia's

growing status as a semiconductor hub in the region in part due to American support.

He also outlined Malaysia's focus on digital transformation, energy transition, and artificial intelligence as key drivers of progress for the nation. He commended Malaysia's efforts in combating corruption, highlighting the impartial and independent work of the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission in upholding the rule of law.

About Malaysia's role in the post-war scenario in Gaza, Dr Ibrahim acknowledged the country's limitations as an emerging economy but asserted its commitment to assisting in any capacity possible. "We are a small country relatively struggling to survive as an emerging economy. That is why I maintain excellent relations with

Qatar, Saudi Arabia, the UAE, and Turkiye and get their sense on what to be done because it is our duty to do whatever is necessary given the limited of whatever capacity that we have," he said, underscoring the importance of consulting regional partners and aligning with the positions advocated by organisations like the OIC.

Addressing the challenges faced by Malaysia, Dr Ibrahim stressed the need to prioritise humanitarian values, compassion, and human dignity alongside economic and developmental agendas. The prime minister's remarks underscored Malaysia's commitment to regional stability, diplomatic engagement, and principled governance in navigating complex geopolitical challenges and promoting peace in conflict-afflicted regions like Gaza.

Qatar-US relations are flourishing at great levels: US ambassador

The economic relationship between the United States and Qatar is 'absolutely fabulous' providing great opportunities for both the nations, noted US ambassador Timmy Davis yesterday. Ambassador Davis was speaking to the media on the sidelines of the Qatar Economic Forum 2024 being held at Raffles and Fairmont Doha.

"It is not just because of what has already been done, but because of the opportunity in it what is going to come. I will lead a delegation of Qataris to Select USA, a forum where Qatari business leaders, Qatari government leaders would have opportunities to talk about how to invest in the United States. This relationship, I think can be a right model for the region. While Qatar is geographically smaller than some of the countries in the region, their ability to invest in the right



places and create the right partners, is second to none in the region," said Davis.

Answering a question from *Gulf Times*, Davis said that what Qatar wants to do, mirrors what they are best at. He explained: "Qatar has a burgeoning agriculture industry here. I know that is going to be part of how they want to invest in the

United States. In fact, I think agriculture is going to be a major topic for Qatar. They are obviously interested in technology. I have a trip planned to Silicon Valley in June that will include talking about opportunities in cybersecurity. AI is going to be a big deal and so I can see Qatar investing in those areas in the United States."

Ambassador Davis noted that the US offers immense opportunities for Qatar. He remarked: "We have always said that 50 states in the United States offer 50 or more different opportunities. Different tax structures, different visions for their future, the idea of sub national diplomacy, investment in the heartland in areas that don't get a lot of attention present a great deal of opportunity for Qatar and its businessmen."

The envoy continued that he is quite excited and satisfied with the current economic relationship with Qatar and the United States and more excited about what is to come. As for the co-operation in the education sector, ambassador Dav-

is said that the US universities are doing an excellent service here in Qatar providing such a valuable service, not just for Qatar but for the region and beyond.

"The universities have done such a great service for people who could not have left Qatar to get an education in the United States. Having these six universities here, people come here from various parts of the world to these world-class universities. I find that absolutely heartening and remarkable. It says something about the ways we can absolutely work together"

He also recalled his recent conversation with Her Highness Sheikha Moza bint Nasser, chairperson of Qatar Foundation and how the vision of Her Highness is reshaping the education scenario in the country and the region. He also said that several US educational institutions have keen interest in collaborating with Qatar and several joint researches and collaborations are already underway between Oatar and the US institutes.

Polish president stresses support for expanding EU membership

olish President Andrzej Duda has affirmed his country's support for expanding the European Union, making Europe multinational and with equal rights, voicing his rejection of the idea of Europe turning into a federal system in terms of political union, however supporting the idea of economic union in Europe.

In a panel discussion within the Qatar Economic Forum, he said that the priorities of the Polish presidency for the European Union in the coming year will focus on strengthening ties between the bloc and the US, given the strategic nature of this bilateral co-operation, expressing Warsaw's support for other European countries to join the Union.

He highlight importance of Ukraine, Moldova and the Western Balkan countries joining the European Union, noting that immediately after the outbreak of war against Ukraine, Warsaw sent a letter to the European Commission demanding that Ukraine be accepted into the European Union, as there were great doubts about this matter at the time. In June of the same year, Ukraine was accepted

President Duda has also emphasised the need for the "free world" to work to support Ukraine to regain its lands, in a way that upholds the rule of international law

as a candidate to join the European Union, stressing the importance of this approach for the safety and security of Europe.

President Duda also stressed the need for the "free world" to work to support Ukraine to regain its lands, in a way that upholds the rule of international law and confronts any flagrant violation of international charters and agreements.

He pointed out that this is what the peace summit that will be held in Switzerland soon will focus on, in which the importance of the rule of law will be discussed, not only at the level of Eastern or Central Europe but also regionally and internation-

In another aspect of his speech at the session, he appreciated the American support for his country, pointing to the role of the US in enhancing the security of Eastern European and Baltic countries, and it is also considered the first donor country to Ukraine in its war with Russia.

Regarding the Russian-Ukrainian war, he warned that Russia is preparing for a new attack on Ukraine during the summer season, noting that he raised this issue during his last visit to Washington in March. where the current American administration confirmed its support for Europe, and this is what the next administration will do whether it was a Republican or a Democrat. Regarding whether Poland would be vulnerable to any Russian attack in the future, President Duda said that he did not say whether Poland would be the nex country, rather, he is doing his best to ensure that this

does not happen. He ruled out the occurrence of such a scenario for many reasons, but he did not hide the possibility of any change occurring in the Baltic countries, Finland, or even Poland and other countries that were in the eastern camp during the communist era, due to the current events between Moscow and Kyiv. Qatar renews appeal to **UNSC** to recommend UN membership for Palestine

atar has renewed its call for the UN Security Council to make a fair and appropriate decision by recommending full membership for the State of Palestine in the LIN.

This came in Qatar's statement delivered by HE the Permanent Representative of Qatar to the United Nations Sheikha Alya Ahmed bin Saif al-Thani during the resumed 10th emergency special session of the General Assembly under Agenda item 5 "Illegal Israeli actions in Occupied East Jerusalem and the rest of the Occupied Palestinian Territory" regarding the draft resolution admission of new members to the United Nations submitted by the Arab group at the UN headquarters in New York.

Her Excellency expressed Qatar's pride in the adoption of the historic draft resolution by an overwhelming majority of the General Assembly, which supports Palestine's right to full membership in the United Nations.

She expressed Qatar's gratitude to the countries that voted in favour of the draft resolution, affirming that Qatar's participation in adopting the draft resolution reflects its principled and longstanding position in support of the

Palestinian people and their just cause. Sheikha Alva stated that Oatar confirms that the State of Palestine meets the required criteria and conditions under Article 4 of the United Nations Charter; therefore, this decision represents a significant victory for the Palestinian brothers and provides a new opportunity for the Security Council to take a unified stance to recommend the

membership of the State of Palestine. This decision embodies the purposes

of the United Nations and international legitimacy resolutions, especially the principle of the right to self-determination, the principle of equal rights among people, and the principle of equality in sovereignty. Accepting the State of Palestine as a full member state is a crucial step toward achieving the two-state solution, which is a key entry point to a just and comprehensive political settlement of the Palestinian issue in accordance with international legitimacy, she added.

She explained that despite the importance of this achievement, the Israeli aggression continues in Gaza in clear defiance of international law, international humanitarian law, relevant Security Council and General Assem

bly resolutions, and the International Court of Justice. Qatar condemns, in the strongest terms, the Israeli occupation forces' bombing of Rafah, the invasion of the land crossing, and the threat to displace citizens from shelters and residences.

She called for urgent international action to prevent the invasion of the city and the commission of genocide as well as to provide full protection for civilians under international law and international humanitarian law.


She stressed that Qatar warns that forcing civilians to flee from the city, which has become the last refuge for hundreds of thousands of displaced people within Gaza, constitutes a serious violation of international laws and would exacerbate the worsening humanitarian crisis in the Strip.


Qatar affirms its commitment to continue mediation efforts in partnership with Egypt and the United States, hoping that sincere efforts will again result in an immediate and lasting ceasefire in Gaza, the release of prisoners and detainees, the continuous delivery of humanitarian aid, and the protection of civilians, paving the way for a serious political process leading to a just and comprehensive settlement of the Palestinian issue, she said.

She reiterated Qatar's steadfast and historical stance in support of the resilience of the Palestinian people and their just cause, in accordance with international legitimacy resolutions and within the framework of the Arab Peace Initiative, which guarantees the establishment of an independent Palestinian state on the 1967 borders with East Jerusalem as its capital. Transport ministry conducts survey for Qatar Bicycle Master Plan update

he Ministry of Transport has conducted a large-scale field survey as part of Stage 2 of the project of updating the Qatar Bicycle Master Plan (OBMP).

The MoT, according to a statement, takes into consideration that the Third Qatar National Development Strategy (NDS3) prioritises a high quality of life by benefiting from Qatar's advanced transportation infrastructure by increasing utilisation and efficiency and accelerating the transition to more sustainable mobility options.

This effort is also aligned with the pillars of the Qatar National Vision (QNV 2030) and the initiatives outlined in the Transportation Master Plan for Qatar (TMPQ 2050)

To ensure inclusivity, a diverse range of male and female participants, both Qataris and residents from all age groups from all areas across Qatar, were surveyed with a particular focus on the most densely populated areas. Interviews were held at 147 diverse locations across the country.

The purpose was to gather information and feedback on people's current and future needs as well as challenges and preferences related to micromobility options like bicycles and e-scooters, how often people use them to get to work or to access public transit facilities, or just for sport and leisure



in addition to the average travel time and distance cut. One more purpose was to diagnose the key barriers and motivators.

The survey showed that the bicycle is the preferred mode of transportation for 89% of all respondents and trip purposes were primarily functional (33.4%) to get to work or for delivery purposes, versus 66.6% for non-functional aspects such as exercise and lei-

Average travel time varied according to the purpose, with work/school trips averaging 13 minutes, exercise/leisure trips averaging 30 minutes, service/delivery trips averaging eight minutes, and accessing metro/bus trips averaging 10 minutes.

Barriers cited the most by micromobility vehicle users surveyed included lack of tracks/separation from traffic on intersections and insufficient services needed near such tracks such as charging stations, parking spaces, drinking water and restrooms.

Some other respondents said making such devices available for sharing for free or at low-cost rental can help encourage the use of bikes and micromobility devices. The findings of this survey are crucial to the ongoing updating of the QBMP, particularly with finalising the remaining phases of the plan to move forward with putting the initiatives, developing future infrastructure projects, and setting policies and systems to promote and improve the use of micromobility devices, bringing us closer to a future where sustainable transportation options are accessible and convenient for all with seamless integration into Qatar's transportation network.

Shura deputy Speaker underscores Qatar's efforts to empower women

E the Shura Council Deputy Speaker Dr Hamda bint Hassan al-Sulaiti has affirmed Qatar's significant interest and efforts to empowering women, considering them a model to be followed globally.

Speaking at the Asia Women's Forum 2024 in Samarkand, Uzbekistan, HE Dr Hamda bint Hassan al-Sulaiti said Qatar manifests its interest in women's rights through granting them equal opportunities in education and employment, in addition to empowering them to take up leadership positions, with Qatari women having a strong presence in the decision-making arena in the Shura Council, and the fields of education, health, communications, information technology, tourism, corporate boards and banks, the diplomatic corps, and in international organisations.

During a session on eliminating all forms of violence against women and children in Asia, she emphasised Qatar's commitment to protecting women's rights and countering violence against them, highlighting Qatar's pioneering measures in this respect, adding that Qatar has been proactive in adopting policies to protect women, despite the fact that this phenomenon is not widespread in the country.

HE the Shura Council deputy Speaker pointed to the efforts of adopting legislations to protect women from all forms of violence, establishing institutions dedicated to women and family affairs, and promoting respect and appreciation for women and their role in society in educational curricula, while making reference to the prophetic guidance and Islamic teachings that emphasise caring for and respecting women.

In the same context, Her Excellency noted Article 34 of Qatar's Permanent Constitution on equality before the law, protecting women from discrimination, and providing them with equal opportunities and enhancing their role in community development.

She also shed light on the Qatar Foundation for Social Work and the work of its various centres each of which are dedicated to a target group or issue, including family affairs, orphans, the elderly, and people with disabilities. She noted the issuance of the Family Law, which regulates litigation procedures in family courts, stressing that Qatar continues to review legislation to improve the protection of women. Her Excellency underscored that Qatar's approach

with regards to women's issues tackles them within the context of family and societal issues, and not in isolation, which leads the state to adopt a comprehensive approach, complimenting efforts towards real progress for women.

HE the Shura Council deputy Speaker pointed out that despite international efforts to combat violence against women, conflict zones such as Palestine continue to pose significant challenges for women, as their rights undergo systematic violation under occupation, with little to no action on the part of the international community.

The Shura Council deputy Speaker referred to the violations of the rights of women and children that are taking place in the Gaza Strip and the occupied Palestinian territories for more than 220 days, and of being deprived of their most basic rights and experiencing violence and killing by the hundreds on a daily-basis at the hands of the Israeli occupation's soldiers and settlers.

Sidra Medicine to open Qatar's first-ever paediatric HSCT programme

idra Medicine, has announced the late 2024 opening of the first-ever paediatric haematopoietic stem cell transplant (HSCT) programme in Qatar, in partnership with Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP).

The HSCT programme at Sidra Medicine will treat patients with various blood diseases and cancers including sickle cell disease, thalassemia, leukaemia, lymphoma, solid tumours. It will also be used for the treatment of primary immune deficiencies, metabolic diseases, and certain genetic and autoimmune disorders.

Sidra Medicine is the only hospital in Qatar to provide paediatric haematology and oncology care for children and young people with cancer and blood disor-

The hospital sees approximately 70 to 100 cases of childhood cancer cases every year, with leukaemia, central nervous system tumours and lymphoma amongst the most common.

HSCT (also referred to as Bone Marrow Transplant - BMT) is often used to treat critically ill patients with cancer, non-malignant blood disorders and metabolic and genetic conditions.

The procedure entails replacing a child's diseased or damaged bone marrow cells with their own healthy stem cells, or that of a do-



To initiate the launch of the HSCT programme at Sidra Medicine, a memorandum of understanding was signed by Sidra Medicine and CHOP's Cellular Therapy and Transplant Section

CHOP's CTTS will offer Sidra Medicine its HSCT/BMT expertise, provide a robust education plan for the hospital's clinical staff, and assess patient readiness

for HSCT treatment protocols. 
"I was keen to have the novel translated into English to increase its popularity," he said. "It will also be translated into French, Spanish, and Persian in future."

"Another story is about a migrant from Syria to Germany which I did report on as a journalist - and it is based on a true story," Osama explained.

"Another story is about a young Egyptian man who migrated to the US, and his experience is completely different from that of the Syrian man's," she said. "Then there is a story about migration between Zanzibar and the Gulf countries."

"Most of the protagonists' names begin with the letter 'N', and all the stories are based on duodrama between a man and a woman," Osama said. "I hope that it will be appreciated by the readers."

Women and children at least 56% of Gaza war dead: UN

Jerusalem

Tomen and children make up at least 56% of the thousands killed in the Gaza war, the UN said vesterday. amid controversy over the toll based on numbers from the health ministry in Gaza.

The United Nations was clarifying a fresh breakdown of the death toll in Gaza, after Israel slammed the world body for "parroting... Hamas's propaganda messages".

Due to a lack of access, UN agencies have since the beginning of the Gaza war on October 7 relied on death tolls provided by the health ministry in the Hamas-run territory.

This has drawn criticism from Israel, but the United Nations says the ministry's tolls before the war were deemed reliable, and that it will strive to verify the figures "when conditions permit".

The ministry said yesterday that

at least 35,173 people have been killed in the territory due to Israeli military operations since the war erupted.

Gaza authorities have consistently said women and children make up a large majority of those killed in the Palestinian territory.

A fresh breakdown was provided by the health ministry and published by the UN last week.

The ministry said that as of April 30 it had fully identified nearly 25,000 of those killed, with identification elements missing for the remainder of the nearly 10,000 others who had died.

Of those fully identified, it said 40% were men, 20% women and 32% children, while another eight percent were elderly - a category not broken down by gender.

WHO spokesman Christian Lindmeier yesterday said the new breakdown as "the most comprehensive" provided to date.

He told reporters in Geneva that by applying the same ratio to the unidentified and assuming women represent half of the elderly, it could be expected that at least "56% women and children" were among the more than 35,000 dead.

And that did not take into consideration the likelihood that more women and children were likely to be among the thousands believed to still be under the rubble "because they are the ones typically staying at home" he said.

So from a "minimum statistical calculation", he said, "you come to 60% women and children".

Jens Laerke, a spokesman for the UN humanitarian agency OCHA, said the new breakdown did not contradict previous estimates that women and children made up more than two thirds of those killed.

What had been provided by the health ministry now was simply "more detail about a sub-section of the overall tally of 35,000 deaths", he

UN says informed Israel of vehicle fatally hit in Gaza

Geneva

The United Nations yesterday said it had informed the Israeli authorities of the movements of a vehicle carrying UN staff which was hit in southern Gaza, killing an Indian.

One UN security services member was killed and another wounded in the attack on Monday, the United Nations said, marking the first death of a UN international employee in the Palestinian territory since the war began more than seven months ago.

The employee killed was an Indian national, UN spokesman Rolando Gomez told a media briefing.

"We are deeply saddened by the loss of Col Waibhav Kale, working for the UN Department of Safety and Security (DSS) in Gaza," India's mission to the UN in New York confirmed on X.

"Our deepest condolences are with the family during this difficult time."

A second UN DSS staff member who was in the vehicle at the time was wounded in the attack, Gomez said, adding that the two had been travelling to the European Hospital in Rafah when their vehicle was hit.

"The UN informs Israeli authorities of the movement of all of our convoys. That has been the case in any theatre of operation. This is a standard operating procedure," said Gomez.

"This was the case on Monday morning, so we have informed them. And it was a clearly marked UN vehicle." He added: "This is a sheer il-

lustration that there's really nowhere safe in Gaza at the mo-

When asked about the attack, the Israeli military sent a

statement apparently drafted on Monday saying that the DSS had informed it of the hit.

"An initial inquiry conducted indicates that the vehicle was hit in an area declared an active combat zone," the military said, maintaining that it had "not been made aware of the route of the vehicle".

"The incident is under review," it said, without attributing responsibility for the strike.

Gomez said UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres had called for a full investigation.

"Of course we want accountability. This is the ultimate aim of this investigation. International humanitarian workers are not targets, so such attacks must end." he said.

The US, Israel's main ally, backed calls for a probe, with state department spokesman Vedant Patel calling the strike 'incredibly disturbing."

"UN and humanitarian workers must be protected, and they need to be able to continue their life-saving work," Patel told reporters in Washington. "We join calls for a full investi-

gation into this incident," he said. While Monday's marked the first time a UN international employee has been killed in the Gaza war, a large number of local staff have been

The UN agency for Palestinian refugees, UNRWA, alone has lost 188 of its 13,000 Gaza staff, according to UN figures.

"No one is safe in Gaza, including aid workers," UNRWA chief Philippe Lazzarini said on X, formerly Twitter.

ESG under fire amid backlash and regulatory crackdown

The focus on environmental, social and governance (ESG) is part of a wider strategy known as sustainable investing. Broadly, the goals are to achieve societal impact, align with personal values or manage risks. But a boom in the use of ESG factors in the financial world has fed scepticism that the approach is nothing more than a marketing gimmick, fuelling a backlash and regulatory crackdown.

US fund managers have suffered their worst-ever quarter for ESGfocused products as the pace of client redemptions intensified.

Client withdrawals from US funds targeting ESG goals reached \$8.8bn in the first three months of 2024, according to Morningstar Inc. That stood in stark contrast to the roughly \$11bn of inflows into ESG funds in Europe, where sustainable investing regulations are far

It's also the latest sign that US investors are turning their backs on the investment strategy, which has been targeted by high-profile Republicans.

At the same time, many core ESG industries such as wind and solar have suffered setbacks, leading to poor returns and further alienating many investors

across the globe affect green policies that are likely to impact ESG investment strategies In the US, Donald Trump and President Joe Biden are polling neck-

green policies a bigger foothold in the bloc's legislature.

ESG was developed about two decades ago by United Nations officials working with the finance industry. They argued that weighing key ESG risks, such as climate change, worker disputes and litigation stemming from poor corporate governance, helps protect investments.

As time passed, the ESG label has been slapped on investments that run the gamut from owning greenenergy stocks to things like funds that track benchmark bond indexes containing oil

companies or assets in nations such as Russia. According to Morningstar, ESG and sustainability labelled funds had almost \$3tn of assets at the end of 2023.

ESG risks have become all the more prominent as extreme weather events and worker strikes have hurt automakers, insurers and travel

companies. At the same time, in the US, some state officials have derided ESG efforts as "woke", claiming they prioritise liberal values at the expense

of financial returns. It didn't also help ESG's cause that Russia's invasion of Ukraine drove up oil stocks in 2022. While ESG funds recovered in 2023, they

mostly underperformed market benchmarks. For example in Europe, which has the biggest market, ESG-related funds rose about 16% on average, compared with the 24% gain of the MSCI World Index and the 16% return of the STOXX Europe 600

European and US regulators have now started to clamp down on firms they said were exaggerating their ESG bona fides.

In September, the US Securities and Exchange Commission adopted a rule that requires that 80% of a fund's investments be in line with its stated focus. Revisions to European Union rules led fund managers to $\,$ strip the top ESG tag from about €200bn (\$215bn) of client funds from July 2022 to March 2023.

Some investors and academics complain that sustainable investing's impact has amounted to far less than its supporters

Detractors also say the idea that sustainable investing alone is enough to address complex problems is being shown to be wrong and that more government intervention is needed to address societal issues such as minimum wages and rising greenhouse gas emissions.

Broadly, global sustainable investments are estimated to range between \$35tn and \$40tn. Amid mounting concern that only a fraction of such assets are bona

fide ESG investing, there are calls for tougher regulations to stamp out the false claims by fund managers.

India's solar power subsidies for homes face scepticism

akshmi Narayan was one of the first to see the light: in 2020 the engineer put solar panels on his roof in India's Bhopal city, becoming a clean energy pioneer because of his desire to help his country move away from planetheating fossil fuels.

"I understand the importance of renewable energy and thought that everyone should adopt it," said Narayan, 60, whose action inspired many others to do the same in the capital of Madhya Pradesh state in central India.

Now, a new government cheme — unveiled before v began in nationwide elections in April – aims to encourage more people to install solar panels on their roofs as part of India's commitment to triple renewable capacity by 2030.

The new programme, launched in February, provides Rs75bn (\$9bn) in subsidies to install grid-connected rooftop solar systems on around 10mn homes, allowing consumers to reduce their electricity bills when the sun shines and sell extra units to the grid to earn some money.

It is expected to create 30 gigawatts (GW) of solar capacity in homes, leading to a reduction of 720mn tonnes of CO2 equivalent planet-heating emissions over the 25-year lifespan of the rooftop systems.

"I want three things. Every household's power bill should be zero; we should sell surplus electricity and earn money; and I want to make India self-reliant in the energy sector as we transition to the era of electric vehicles," Prime Minister Narendra Modi said in a televised interview in late April.

The process, which was previously complicated and fragmented, has been simplified with the creation of a one-

stop online portal to smooth applications and facilitate installations. Subsidies are deposited directly into people's bank accounts. India overtook Japan to

become the third-largest solar power generator in 2023, providing 5.9% of global growth in solar, a report by think tank Ember said on May 8. But Ember noted that wind,

solar and other low-carbon sources are not yet growing fast enough to meet India's rising electricity demand.

The new rooftop solar programme is meant to boost that growth but Narayan's experience offers a cautionary

will provide answers to a lot of the bureaucratic headaches that used to bedevil the process but, in his experience, the bigger challenge is getting the electricity distribution companies, or DISCOMs, on board.

A December 2023 study by the Centre for Science and Environment (CSE), a Delhibased think-tank, said DISCOMs were supposed to provide seamless access and connectivity for rooftop solar systems to the national grid but that this was sometimes "in direct conflict with business interests of the companies".

Narayan said that although he saved up to Rs250,000 (\$2,996) in electricity bills over three years thanks to his 6 kilowatt (KW) solar system, selling excess electricity to the grid proved to be problematic with debt-ridden DISCOMs proving ineffective partners.

"The electricity distribution company charges me 8 rupees for each unit that I consume from the grid, but for the surplus solar electricity that I sell back to the grid, they pay me Rs1.5 per unit. How is that fair?"

And he said that the distribution

company added a fixed charge of Rs500 to his monthly bill after he installed the panels.

"They said that this is the minimum amount we will charge you even if your bill is zero," he said, adding that he got no answer when he enquired about the reason for the new tariff.

The pledge to cut electricity bills by boosting the solar power sector was a key election promise from Modi's ruling Bharatiya Janata Party and reflects India's long-term commitment to boost renewables.

In 2015, India promised to install 40GW of rooftop solar capacity by 2022 but progress has been slow. By the end of 2023, it had only installed 11GW, including 3GW in homes with the rest in commercial or industrial properties.

That original commitment has now been revised to 100GW of rooftop solar installations by 2026. 40GW of which would come from the residential sector alone.

Energy experts say India's solar drive is hampered by fears of DISCOMs losing income, a shortage of skilled workers to make, install and service solar panels, and the proliferation of substandard products.

Danish Ali, who has installed a 4KW solar system on his roof in Lucknow in northern India, said another problem arose from the fact that the grid-connected solar systems cannot deliver power during outages unless they have a separate battery to operate them.

"In areas where there are long power cuts, grid-connected systems will not work because they do not provide any power back-up," the 50-year-old said.

Ali has to endure up to two hours of power outages a few times a week during peak summer months when temperatures regularly rise above 40C (104F).

He said that adding a battery to the grid-connected system could solve the problem, but the

government subsidy does not cover the installation of such hybrid systems.

Shreya Mishra, CEO of Mumbai-based SolarSquare Energy, which installs solar panels and is one of India's largest rooftop solar companies, said the industry could be on the brink of a boom; in 2023, 150,000 rooftop systems were installed and there are plans to target 2.5mn houses this year, she said.

"The programme has turned rooftop solar into a dinner table conversation that has turbocharged the consumer interest," she said.

But more training is needed for workers in these new green jobs and domestic manufacture of solar panels must also be rampe up, she added.

The government says the new solar programme will create around 1.7mn direct jobs across various sectors, including manufacturing, logistics, sales, installation, operation, maintenance, and other services.

An expert with a solar consultancy, who did not wish to be named, said that the relatively limited growth of home solar systems had already caused friction with DISCOMs.

"Imagine millions of homes being hooked up to the grid and injecting their excess electricity in a system that is already facing so many technical losses." the expert said, referring to losses caused by, for example, damage to transmission lines or electricity theft.

For Narayan, solving distribution issues will be central to encouraging more people to switch to solar and install panels on their rooftops.

"If the government can enable people to truly earn some money, not for show but justified money, with these rooftop systems, it will be a hit among customers. Who would not want it?" he said. -Thomson Reuters Foundation

280 citizens recruited for Russia-Ukraine war: Sri Lanka

Around 280 Sri Lankans have been recruited to fight on both sides of Russia's war in Ukraine. officials tasked with investigating its citizens' involvement in the conflict said yesterday. Complaints began pouring in from relatives after the defence ministry set up a special unit last week to collect information on those who had travelled to both countries to join the war effort. "We have received complaints from approximately 280 family members," public security minister Tiran Alles told AFP. Most had been recruited for the Russian army and duped with promises of high salaries and falsely told they would be given non-combat roles, lawmaker Gamini Waleboda told parliament on Monday.

There was no official count of how many Sri Lankans may have died in the conflict.

Sri Lanka has repeatedly warned its citizens against travelling to Russia or Ukraine to join the fighting.

But there are no restrictions on Sri Lankans travelling abroad and large numbers have left the island nation in the wake of an unprecedented economic crisis in mid-2022. A notice on the defence ministry website published since the taskforce was established asked relatives to "provide information about retired Sri Lankan military personnel who have joined the Russia-Ukraine war". Police have arrested two retired army officers, including a major general, for illegally acting as recruiting agents for Russian

mercenary firms. Sri Lanka's South Asian neighbours India and Nepal have also confirmed that numerous citizens of those countries had been recruited to fight alongside the Russian army over the past year. More than two years since Russia's invasion began, tens of thousands of its soldiers have been killed in Ukraine, and Moscow has been on a global quest for more troops. Russia's army held off a muchhyped Ukrainian counteroffensive last year, and it has since made gains on the front lines as Kyiv struggles with ammunition

and manpower shortages.

Swiss nursery lets robot do the talking

Sat in a circle on the nursery floor, a group of Swiss three-year-olds ask a robot called Nao questions about giraffes and broccoli. By the time these children become adults, interacting with robots may well be as commonplace as using a smartphone, experts believe.

So one Lausanne creche has decided to give them a head start.

Nao has been a regular visitor at the Nanosphere nursery on the campus of the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology university since the New Year. He is what is called an "interactive learning companion" rather than a substitute teacher.

As the children were dropped off, Nao — who is only 58cm (less than two feet) tall — stood on a bench to greet them at eye level. "Hello, my name is Nao. I'm happy to be at the Nanosphere today," he said, in a child-like high-pitched voice.

"I left my planet some time ago to come and meet you. I look forward to getting to know you and being able to talk with you in the weeks ahead."

Some children walked straight past, some waved, pointed, touched his hand or simply gazed at him transfixed.

gazed at him transfixed.
"What will the children's future be like? Will

they have to work with robots? Very probably yes," Olivier Delamadeleine, director-general of the Educalis group of nurseries and primary schools in Lausanne, told AFP.

"So as we are in a place of learning it is important to get them familiarised early so that they're used to working with robots," he added.

Back in the class, teacher Eve L'Eplattenier and the 14 children sat in a circle on the floor with Nao in the middle.

"He's going to come and explain things to you," she said.

"Do you like broccoli? It's very good for your health," the robot said.

L'Eplattenier picked him up and put him on a table. She said Nao would not grow any taller as children do.

The children gathered excitedly around, some jockeying for space.

"No squabbling!" Nao told them. Prompted by their teacher, the children tried

to catch him out with questions such as, "I am an animal with a trunk. What am I?" When he got it right, they giggled.

Gabriel Paffi, a Master's student in robotics, sat in the corner feeding Nao his answers. He programmed the robot and is working on how to adapt it for a nursery's needs.

"The goal is to make it automated so that he no longer needs me to move around and respond to the children," Paffi said.

The first Nao robots hit the market in 2008. Now on generation six, the brand is owned by the Germany-based United Robotics Group and more than 15,000 units have been sold. The plan is for this Nao to spend several years in the Educalis nurseries as his capacities expand.

L'Eplattenier said the children are thrilled when Nao turns up, and have bonded with their diminutive friend.

"They are curious to see what he will say, what he will do," she said.

"He's a companion with little tips and bits of advice. "I think he will quickly position himself as the little know-it-all of the group." As for the parents, they too are keen to see

how Nao will settle in.
"I think it's a good way to help the children progress with new technologies," said Guillaume Quentin.

When it was time for Nao to "fly back into space", each child in turn shuffled towards him to say goodbye and give him a wave. He replied to each by name.

"I love you. I will come back soon," he told

Pakistan unveils plan to sell state firms

akistan will privatise all state-owned enterprises, with the exception of strategic entities, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said yesterday, broadening its initial plans to sell only loss-making state firms to shore up its shaky finances.

The announcement came after Sharif headed a review meeting of the privatisation process of loss-making state enterprises (SOEs), according to a statement from his office, which discussed a roadmap for privatisation from 2024

"All of the state-owned enterprises will be privatised whether they are in profit or in losses," Sharif said, adding that offloading the companies would save taxpayers' money.

The statement didn't clarify which sectors would be deemed strategic and non-strategic.

The announcement came a day after an International Monetary Fund mission opened talks in Islamabad for a new long-term Extended Fund Facility, following Pakistan's completion of a \$3bn standby arrangement last month, which averted a sovereign debt default last summer.

Privatisation of loss-making SOEs has long been on the IMF's list of recommendations for Pakistan, which is struggling with a high fiscal shortfall and a huge external financing gap. Foreign exchange reserves are hardly enough to meet a couple of months of controlled imports.

The IMF says SOEs in Pakistan hold sizeable assets in comparison with most Middle East countries, at 44 percent of GDP in 2019, yet their share of employment in the economy is relatively low. It estimates almost half of the SOEs operated at a loss in 2019.

Past privatisation drives have been patchy, mainly due to a lack of political will, market watchers say.

Modi files candidacy for election in Hindu holy city

heering crowds greeted Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi yesterday as he submitted his candidacy for a Hindu holy city's parliamentary seat in a general election his party is strongly favoured to win.

Modi remains roundly popular in India, in large part due to his cultivated image as an aggressive champion of the country's majority faith.

Varanasi is the spiritual capital of Hinduism, where devotees from around India come to cremate deceased loved ones by the Ganges river, and the premier has represented the city since sweeping to power a decade ago.

US to back Ukraine until security 'guaranteed'

he United States will back Ukraine until its security is "guaranteed", US Secretary of State Antony Blinken said on a trip to Kyiv yesterday, hours after Russian forces claimed further advances in the northeastern Kharkiv region.

Blinken's visit comes just weeks after the US Congress finally approved a \$61bn financial aid package for Ukraine following months of political wrangling, unlocking much-needed arms for the country's outgunned troops.

"We're with you today. And we will stay by your side, until Ukraine's security, sovereignty, and ability to choose its own path is guaranteed," Blinken said in a speech.

"The assistance is now on its way. Some of it has already arrived. More will be arriving," he had told Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky during a meeting earlier.

"That's going to make a real difference against the ongoing Russian aggression on the battlefield," he said. Zelensky thanked Washington for the aid, which he said was "crucial" — but stressed it was "important to get it as quickly as possible".

"We need a noticeable acceleration of supplies. Now too much time passes between the announcement of packages and the actual appearance of weapons on the frontline," he said in an evening address.

Zelensky said air defence was the "biggest problem" for Ukraine and requested two Patriot batteries for the Kharkiv region, where Russian forces have been advancing and pounding villages along the border since Friday.

Blinken was on his fourth visit to Kyiv since Russia invaded Ukraine in February 2022.

After meeting Zelensky, he met Ukrainian Foreign Minister Dmytro Kuleba in Veterano, a pizzeria set up by a military veteran in the city centre.

North Korea 'laundered \$147.5mn in stolen crypto'

said in a statement.

North Korea laundered \$147.5mn through virtual currency platform Tornado Cash in March after stealing it last year from a cryptocurrency exchange, according to confidential work by United Nations sanctions monitors seen by Reuters yesterday. The monitors told a UN Security Council sanctions committee in a document submitted on Friday that they had been investigating 97 suspected North Korean

cyberattacks on cryptocurrency companies between 2017 and 2024, valued at some \$3.6bn. That included an attack late last year where \$147.5mn was stolen from HTX cryptocurrency exchange before being laundered in March this year, the monitors told the committee, citing information from crypto analytics firm PeckShield and blockchain research firm Elliptic. In 2024 alone, the monitors said they had been looking at "11

cryptocurrency thefts ... valued at \$54.7mn," adding that many of those "may have been conducted by DPRK IT workers inadvertently hired by small crypto-related companies."

The monitors said that according to U.N. member states and private companies, North Korean IT workers operating abroad generate "substantial income for the country." North Korea has been under UN sanctions since 2006.

Record 76mn displaced worldwide, says monitor

Conflict in Gaza and Sudan pushed the number of internally displaced people (IDPs) worldwide to a record 75.9mn at the end of 2023, an NGO monitor said yesterday. The Internal Displacement Monitoring Centre (IDMC) said the figure was a new end-ofyear numerical high, with the number of people displaced within their own borders having increased by more than 50% in the last five years. The figure was up from 71.1mn at the end of 2022. While refugees are those who have fled abroad, internal displacement refers to the

forced movement of people within the country in which they live.

In its annual Global Report
on Internal Displacement, the
IDMC said that 68.3mn people
worldwide were displaced by
conflict and violence, and 7.7mn
by disasters.

by disasters.

Over the past five years, the number of IDPs resulting from conflict has increased by 22.6mn, with the two biggest increases in 2022 and 2023. At 9.1mn, Sudan has the highest number of IDPs recorded for a single country since records began in 2008, the monitor said.

Court acquits Polanski in defamation trial

A French court yesterday acquitted French-Polish filmmaker Roman Polanski of defaming British actor Charlotte Lewis after she accused him of raping her when she was a teenager. Polanski, 90, was not in court for the verdict at the Paris criminal court. Lewis told the court in March that she became the victim of a "smear campaign" that "nearly destroyed" her life after she spoke up about abuse that took place in the 1980s. "He raped me," the 56-year-old actor told the court, explaining it had taken her time to put a name on the incident that occurred in Paris when she was 16.
