## Qatar attends ITU Council meeting

**Q**atar, represented by the Communications Regulatory Authority (CRA), is participating in the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) Council meeting, in Geneva, Switzerland, until June 14. The Qatari delegation is led by President of CRA Engineer Ahmad Abdulla Al-Muslemani.

CRA participates in the meeting as an observer member of the ITU Council, composed of 48 ITU member states, acts as the Union's governing body in the interval between ITU plenipotentiary conferences, which is held every four years.

The council meeting ensures that the union's activities, policies, and strategies fully respond to the rapidly evolving telecommunications environment. Also, it ensures

the smooth day-to-day running of the union, co-ordinating work programmes, approving budgets, and controlling finances and expenditure.

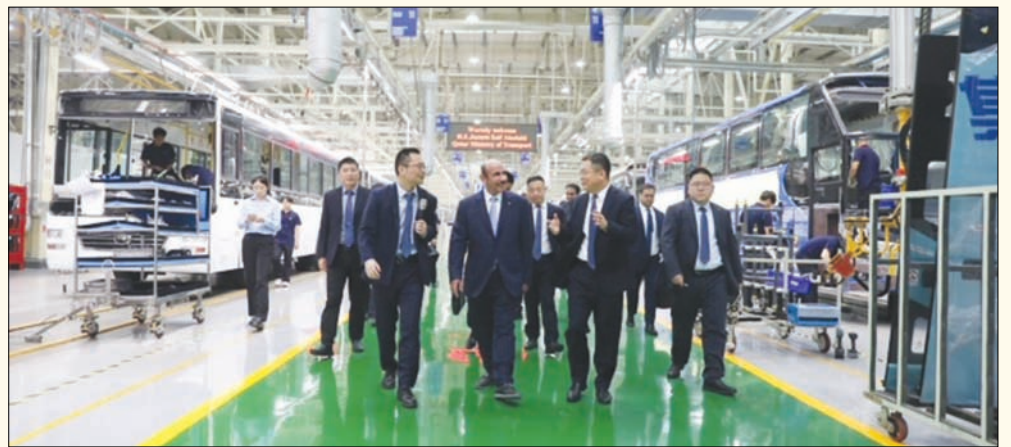
Key agenda items include discussions about the achievements of the strategic plan of the union for 2023-2024 and discussing the operational plans of the union 2025-2028.

During the meeting, CRA will deliver a comprehensive presentation on Qatar's preparations to host the Plenipotentiary Conference in 2026 (PP-26). Additionally, CRA has a booth featuring interactive content highlighting Qatar's readiness to welcome the participating delegations. The booth also offers visitors an opportunity to learn about Qatar's evolving Information and Communication Tech-

nology (ICT) sector. The Plenipotentiary Conference is the highest policy-making body of the ITU. This is the key event for the ITU Member States to determine the future role of the organisation and thereby the organisation's ability to influence the development of ICTs worldwide. Hosting this conference in Qatar will enhance opportunities for collaboration with stakeholders, contributing to attracting future investments and partnerships.

This, in turn, will enhance the growth of the ICT sector towards supporting Qatar National Vision 2030 and the Third Qatar National Development Strategy, which include providing world-class telecom services and improving the quality of life for citizens and residents. **(QNA)**

## Transport minister meets chief of Yutong

Following the meeting, HE the Minister of Transport visited some of Yutong e-bus factories and was briefed on the manufacturing processes and units, production lines, and some of the newest manufacturing technologies. HE al-Sulaiti also met with Tony Bao, Vice-President of Huawei, the leading global provider of information and communications technology (ICT) infrastructure, smart devices, as well as technology and smart solutions for infrastructure projects. During the meeting, they discussed bilateral co-operation between the two sides and

ways to enhance them, particularly in the areas of smart technologies on electric and self-driving public transit systems.

Following the meeting, HE the Minister of Transport, accompanied by Huawei officials, visited the Shenzhen Supercharging Station and was briefed on the ultrafast electric vehicle (EV) chargers that run on solar power.

He also toured the station's facilities and viewed the integrated technologies in use. Additionally, the minister was given a detailed presentation on intelligent automotive solutions and attended a test drive of Huawei's latest M9 vehicle module. **(QNA)**

plans. They also elect ITU's senior management team, the Member States of the ITU Council, and the members of the Radio Regulations Board.

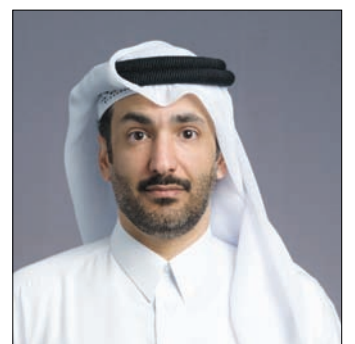

## Cabinet praises outcome of Amir’s visit to Greece, Cyprus

HE the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Mohamed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim al-Thani chaired the Cabinet’s weekly meeting at the Amiri Diwan yesterday. After the meeting, HE the Minister of Justice and Minister of State for Cabinet Affairs Ibrahim bin Ali al-Mohannadi issued the following statement: At the outset of the meeting, the Cabinet praised the outcomes of the official visit of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani to Cyprus and the state visit to Greece.

The Cabinet emphasised that the expanded and fruitful discussions that His Highness held with the leaders of the two friendly countries, focused on developing and strengthening bilateral co-operation with them in various fields, in addition to issues of common interest, most notably the developments in the Gaza Strip and the Palestinian territories.

These discussions reflected the extent of Qatar’s well-established relations and advanced investment partnerships with both Cyprus and Greece. The discussions also embodied the common

aspiration to advance the relations to expanded and broader horizons, as well as the common interest in everything that would serve the interests of peoples and enhance regional security and global peace.

The Cabinet congratulated Sheikh Sabah Khaled al-Hamad al-Mubarak al-Sabah on the occasion of his appointment as Kuwait’s Crown Prince, wishing him success, and the fraternal Kuwaiti people further progress and prosperity. After that, the Cabinet considered the topics on its agenda as follows:

First — the Cabinet was informed of the Shura Council’s approval of a draft law amending some provisions of the Qatar Financial Centre Law promulgated by Law No 7 of 2005.

Second — the Cabinet approved a draft decision of the Minister of Communications and Information Technology to extend the deadline for regularising the status of postal service providers subject to the provisions of Law No 15 of 2023 promulgating the Postal Services Regulation Law.

Third — the Cabinet approved the following:

1- Signing and ratifying the statute of the Organisation of Islamic Co-operation (OIC) Police Co-operation and Coordination Center.

2- A draft memorandum of under-

standing (MoU) between the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Qatar University, and the World Intellectual Property Organisation (WIPO).

3- A draft MoU regarding establishing a mechanism for political consultations on issues of common interest between the ministries of foreign affairs of Qatar and Moldova.

4- A draft MoU between the Foreign Ministry of Qatar and the Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade and Development of Canada regarding a mechanism for bilateral political consultations.

5- A draft MoU between the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Qatar and the Department of Foreign Affairs, Trade and Development of Canada, regarding development co-operation.

Fourth — the Cabinet reviewed the following matters and made appropriate decisions:

1- A report on incentives for the use of electric and hybrid cars in Qatar.

2- The annual report of the Qatar General Organisation for Standards and Metrology.

3- The semi-annual report of the Committee for the Regulation of Ownership and Use of Non-Qatari Property.

4- A report on the outcomes of participating in the Extraordinary General Assembly for the Islamic Organisation for Food Security (IOFS).

### Qatar hails Slovenian decision to recognise State of Palestine

Qatar welcomed the Slovenian Parliament’s ratification of the government’s decision to recognise the State of Palestine, and considered it an important step that reflects the growing support of the international community for the two-state solution towards achieving peace and stability in the region. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs expressed, in a statement yesterday, Qatar’s hope that more countries would recognise the State of Palestine and enhance efforts aimed at implementing the two-state solution. The ministry stressed that achieving comprehensive and just peace in the region is fully depending on the establishment of an independent Palestinian state on the 1967 borders, with East Jerusalem as its capital. **(QNA)**

## Shura participates in IPU session on role of youth in preventing conflicts

THE Shura Council yesterday participated in the 10th briefing session of the Empowering Young Parliamentarians series, organised by the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) via video communication. The briefing session was dedicated to the role of young parliamentarians in preventing conflicts and in building peace.

The Shura Council was represented at the session by its member Mohamed bin Omar al-Mannai. The session discussed the role of young parliamentarians in preventing conflicts and in building peace, through strategies for activating youth participation in peace processes and using legislative and parliamentary oversight tools.

The session also touched on the importance of the UN Security Council Resolution No 2250 (2015) and its impact on enhancing the role of youth in peace and security, in addition to reviewing the challenges and opportunities for its implementation. During the session, al-Mannai reviewed



the role of Qatar and its mediation efforts to support international peace and security, starting with its efforts in Afghanistan, through to its humanitarian initiatives to reunite Ukrainian

children. He stressed the need for the Youth Forum of the IPU to have an effective role in supporting peace and security, including stopping the aggression on Gaza. **(QNA)**

# QRCS launches new life-saving project for vulnerable people in Yemen



**Q**atar Red Crescent Society (QRCS) has launched a new integrated, life-saving health and nutrition response project for the poorest people in Yemen, to meet the emergency and essential needs of around 126,000 internally displaced people (IDPs) and locals in the inaccessible parts of Maqbanah district, Taiz Governorate.

With \$1mn funding from the UN Office for the Co-ordination of Humanitarian Affairs' (OCHA) Yemen Humanitarian Fund (YHF), the project includes a package of health and nutrition measures to improve primary, secondary and surgical health-care services, as well as to provide children and women with access to life-saving preventive and therapeutic nutrition services.

Moreover, the project involves



capacity-building for health workers at the target facilities, with training courses on nutritional counselling programmes, mass immunisation, infection control, and community management for acute malnutrition treatment.

The monthly staff remunerations are also provided.

In the outdoor aspect, mobile clinics are being deployed to re-

mote camps/areas lacking medical services, in order to provide primary healthcare services, especially reproductive health and paediatrics, promoting awareness-raising messages on healthy infant nutrition and infection prevention, and applying the referral system for patients in need of advanced medical care to the supported hospitals and health centres. **(QNA)**

## Education ministry unveils new curricula strategies for 2024-25

The Ministry of Education and Higher Education (MoEHE) unveiled fresh curricula strategies for the academic year 2024-25, in line with the Third National Development Strategy.

MoEHE's Assistant Undersecretary for Educational Affairs, Maha al-Ruwalli, said the new strategies seek to achieve an ideal balance between the academic, skill-based, social and psychological aspects of students according to their needs. She added the new plans stem from the commitment to providing education that meets the needs of students and enables them to acquire the skills and values that qualify them to face the challenges of the future. KG students will be offered free reading classes as part of their fun meeting classes along with increased sports activity. For elementary schools, students will have the opportunity to acquire further linguistic and artistic skills along with life skills that develop their motivation to learn. For the preparatory school students, further focus will be put on Arabic and English reading and writing classes with the inclusion of topics that meet students' interests and to develop their skills. Meanwhile, secondary school students will be required to submit graduation projects based on research and creative skills, as well as volunteering hours to develop their sense of social responsibility.

She said the Ministry of Labour collaborates closely with the Ministry of Education, and several other ministries, private sector companies, and institutions. Their aim is to support the education of citizens who aspire to work in the private sector, empowering them to acquire knowledge and



develop skills. This effort seeks to enhance education indicators linked to the knowledge economy, in addition to preparing a highly efficient national workforce that effectively contributes to increasing private sector productivity, entrepreneurship, and driving the economic development of the country.

Acting Assistant Undersecretary for Higher Education Affairs Dr Harib Mohamed al-Jabri, outlined during the workshop the general objectives of the updated governmental scholarship plan. These objectives include economic growth through investment in human capital and the quality of education outcomes, highlighting the role of the private sector in this context.

He emphasised that one of the objectives of the new governmental scholarship plan is to ensure equal opportunities, diversity, inclusivity, and talent development. He affirmed that governmental scholarships provide an opportunity for all Qatari students to obtain a government-sponsored scholarship provided they meet the necessary and required conditions.

Al-Jabri discussed, in a related

context, the three main scholarship programmes. These include the internal scholarship programme for 10 universities within Qatar, part of the Education City universities, the external scholarship programme for the top 300 universities according to rankings based on fields and specialisations, allowing students to choose a university that suits their desired field of study.

In a related context, al-Jabri addressed the three major programmes; Internship Programme for 10 universities within Qatar within the city's educational universities, the exterior of the top 300 universities according to the classification of pathways and disciplines, allowing the student to choose the university that suits him according to the specialisation he desires. In addition, the Amiri Emission Programme for the Top 24 Universities by the World's General Classification of External Remission with conditions required for each of them, noting that the government broadcasts were previously limited to outstanding students' rights, while it now includes talented professionals in disciplines such as sport, art and innovation. ## Qatar committed to protecting local environment: minister

HE the Minister of Environment and Climate Change Dr Abdullah bin Abdulaziz bin Turki al-Subaie affirmed Qatar's interest in the local environment and its commitment to protecting and preserving it through all state means, adding that Qatar's terrestrial and marine environments are a national heritage that must be protected, and is the responsibility of every member of Qatari society.

This came in a statement on the occasion of the World Environment Day, in which he said that protecting the environment is a priority for Qatar, evident in the country's plans, strategies, programmes, and initiatives that are underway to realise its vision of developing and enriching the local environment. This is in accordance with the Third National Development Strategy and the Qatar National Environment and Climate Change Strategy.

HE the Minister said that this year's theme 'Land Restoration, Desertification, and Drought Resilience' sheds light on the planet's urgent need for careful attention, especially against the backdrop of current climate change repercussions of increasing desertification, excessive deforestation, and rainfall scarcity.

He highlighted Qatar's efforts

to expand its green areas in recent years through inaugurating new parks, planting trees, and preserving natural terrestrial and coastal vegetation. HE Dr al-Subaie noted the completion of the 'Plant a Million Trees' initiative in 2022 and the launch of the Plant 10mn Trees initiative to be realised by 2030, pointing to the state's focus on enhancing water efficiency in afforestation through the use of technology and water reuse, for the sake of sustainability.

He added that the ministry has numerous environmental projects and strategies in place to be implemented in the coming period, focusing on biodiversity, natural and terrestrial environments, along with continuing

with the afforestation initiatives.

He pointed out that the state has designated 27% of its terrestrial area as natural reserves, along with 2% marine reserves.

HE al-Subaie said that within the framework of preserving biodiversity, the ministry has launched a project to protect endangered sea turtles, which increased their number to about 50,000 turtles, as well as launched projects to protect dugongs and whale sharks, along with creating a local biodiversity database to keep record and to monitor, in addition to maintaining a balance between environmental, social, and human development in order to ensure a sustainable future.

He said the Qatar National Vision 2030 underscores the importance of balancing developmental needs with environmental protection through establishing effective and advanced environmental institutions to raise public awareness about environmental protection issues and to promote the use of environmentally friendly technologies, highlighting the ministry's keenness to spread environmental awareness, including the World Environment Day, and to support institutions and individuals alike in service of this cause. (QNA)

## Sheikh Hamad Award receives 280 nominations

The Sheikh Hamad Award for Translation and International Understanding announced the initial screening process for the nominations submitted for the award in its tenth edition for 2024, which amounted to 280 nominations from 35 countries around the globe, with the participation of individuals and institutions concerned with translation.

Official Spokesperson and Media Adviser for the Award Dr Hanan al-Fayyad said that in 2024, the committee received 195 nominations from 17 Arab countries, and 85 nominations from 18 non-Arab countries.

The number of nominations in the single book category reached 209 nominations, distributed among 164 individuals and 45 institutions. The number of nominations in the achievement category reached 71, distributed among 38 individuals and 33 institutions. The nominated works include various fields of human

sciences, most notably: literature, Islamic studies, philosophy, social sciences, political science, and history. In the award's tenth edition, the French language was selected as the main language (along with English) in the single books category after it was selected in 2017. In achievement category, Balochi, Tatar, Hungarian, and Yoruba were selected as sub-languages, in addition to the two main languages.

These languages are selected in order to stimulate translation efforts from and into the Arabic language in the countries that speak these languages, and to encourage the continuity of acculturation between the societies of these countries and the Arab societies, al-Fayyad said. Launched in 2015, the Sheikh Hamad Award for Translation and International Understanding seeks to honour translators and to acknowledge their role in strengthening the bonds of friendship and co-operation among people, nations. 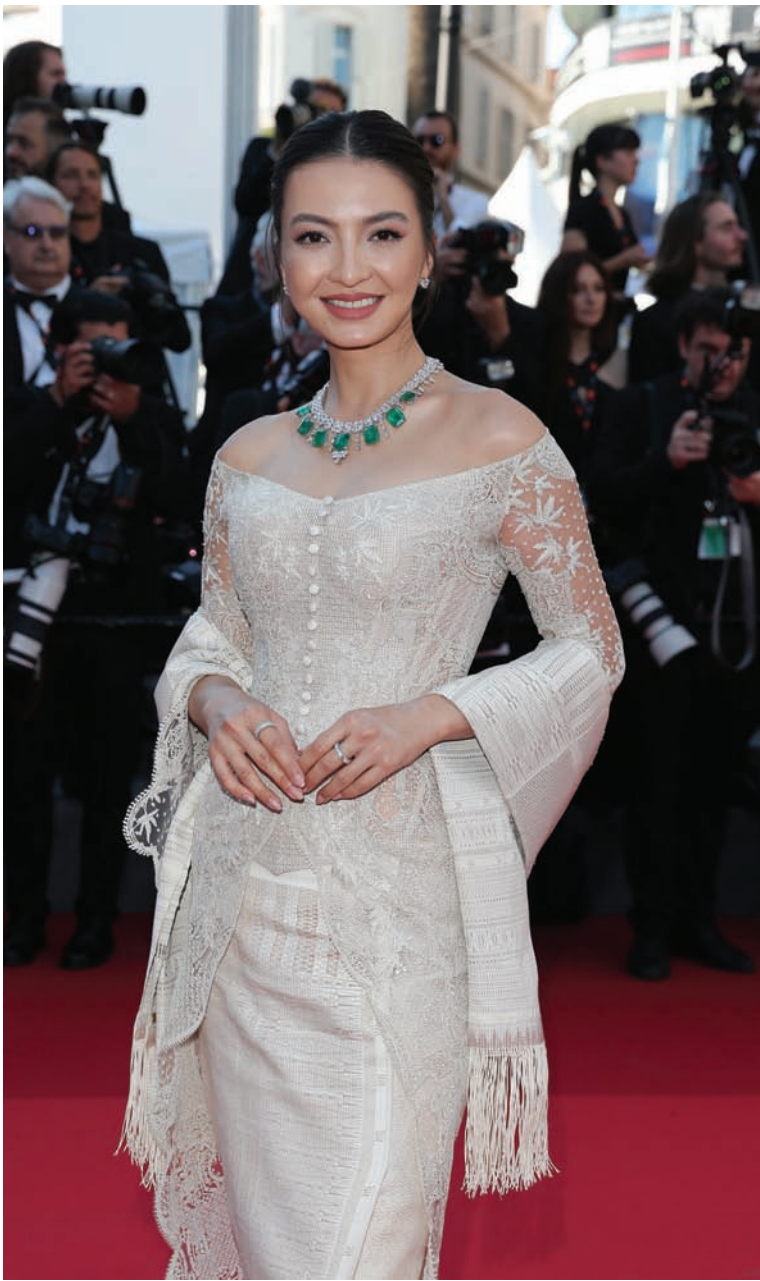

## WISH to launch report on ethical management of AI in healthcare

The World Innovation Summit for Health (WISH), an initiative of Qatar Foundation has announced it will publish a report on the Ethics of AI in healthcare, exploring some of the most widely adopted practices of AI in healthcare and emphasising the associated ethical challenges.

The report will be published ahead of WISH 2024, which takes place on November 13-14 at the Qatar National Convention Centre, and will form the basis of discussions at the November event around the ethical implications of an increase in the use of AI in healthcare.

While ethical considerations in general will feature in the report, particular emphasis will be given to exploring the relationship between AI and healthcare from an Islamic perspective.

Dr Mohamed Ghaly, professor of Islam and Biomedical Ethics and head of the Research Centre for Islamic

Legislation and Ethics, at Hamad Bin Khalifa University (HBKU) will act as lead author of the report.

Dr Ghaly said: "Both secular and religious moral traditions need to grapple with serious ethical challenges surrounding the use of AI in healthcare, including unequal access to this technology, privacy and data protection, obtaining informed consent, and how these elements would relate to the long-held set of values and etiquettes governing the patient-physician relationship."

Maha El Akoum, manager, Policy and Content at WISH, said: "As adoption of AI in healthcare continues at pace, how we regulate it to ensure medical practice remains ethical and equitable becomes crucial. WISH is therefore taking a leading role, working with our colleagues at HBKU, to address this pressing issue, which is essential to fostering trust and ensuring ethical integrity."

President Zelensky's visit marked the 31st anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between the two countries in 1993. The two sides exchanged ambassadors in November 2000.

In March 2009, the first political consultations were held between the foreign ministries of the two countries in Kyiv, prior to opening Qatar's embassy in Ukraine,

on August 16, 2013. Credentials of the first Qatari ambassador were received by the Ukrainian President on September 13, 2013.

The visit represented a new milestone of the evolving relationships between the two nations to further broaden their horizons. The visit also underscores the rock-solid bilateral relationship, along with the political and diplomatic role Qatar plays at the regional and global levels.

The Qatar-Ukraine bilateral relationship is underscored by an array of agreements and memorandums of understanding that echo their desire to strengthen co-operation in a variety of fields, particularly in the economic field, infrastructure, energy security, food security, tourism, sports, education, and others.

Shared visits by officials of the two nations had a profound impact on the evolution of ties in multiple fields.

Qatar-Ukraine relations were enhanced further during the official talks His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani held with President Zelensky in Doha in April 2021. The talks culminated in the signing of a number of deals and MoUs between the governments of the two countries. This largely contributed to lending impetus to the Qatar-Ukraine relations and broadening their horizons.

President Zelensky hailed the trade and economic co-operation between the two countries, describing it as the groundwork for bilateral relationship.

In an interview with Qatar News Agency (QNA) on the occasion of the official visit to Qatar at that time, Zelensky highlighted that notwithstanding the circumstances the world had passed through due to Covid-19 pandemic, the trade exchange between Qatar and Ukraine reached high levels in 2020, worth \$150mn. He emphasised that this figure represented double the bilateral trade in 2018.

The Ukrainian president noted the concession project obtained by Qatari company QTerminals at Ukraine's Olvia Port, describing the partnership as incredible. He considered QTerminals as one of the most important players in the Ukrainian market.

Zelensky stated his priority was to systematically improve the investment climate and create best conditions for foreign investors in Ukraine. And for this purpose, Ukraine is reforming legislation and implementing ambitious national programmes.

Qatar has accomplished a plethora of crucial objectives with Ukraine on their bilateral agenda, particularly at the political and economic levels, such as the launch of direct flights between Doha and Kyiv, creating a system of visa cancellation requirements

and establishing a joint government committee for economic, trade and technological co-operation.

Since the early days of the Russian-Ukrainian conflict, Qatar has been bound by the UN charter and the fundamental precepts of international law, including the commitments under the charter to settle international disputes through peaceful means, and uphold the sovereignty, independence and territorial integrity of states as expressed by His Highness the Amir during the phone call he received from President Zelensky in February 2022.

As part of Qatar's humanitarian endeavours to alleviate the consequences of war on the Ukrainian people, HE the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Mohamed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim al-Thani announced, during his visit to Ukraine in July 2023, that His Highness the Amir gave directive to announce a pledge of \$100mn in humanitarian aid for Ukraine.

HE the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs pointed out that the declared amount would be directed to rehabilitate health and educational infrastructure, in addition to providing drinking water, humanitarian services and allo-

cating 50 university scholarships, during 2023-2024, to Ukrainian students to study in Qatar.

Besides its supportive position for peaceful solution for the crisis, Qatar has played a critical humanitarian role throughout this crisis and had separately hosted a Ukrainian delegation last April, led by Ukrainian Parliament Commissioner for Human Rights Dmytro Lubinets, alongside a delegation from the Russian Federation, led by Presidential Commissioner for Children's Rights Maria Lvova Belova. This was part of Qatar's unwavering mediation efforts to reunify families separated by the current conflict.

In the past months, Qatar succeeded in organising four reunification processes for Ukrainian children with their families in Ukraine, as part of Qatar's ongoing mediation efforts to reunify separated families due to the Russian-Ukrainian conflict.

Last April, Qatar announced the arrival of 20 Russian and Ukrainian families in Doha under an integrated programme that aimed to provide healthcare and an overall support for these families and their children.

Qatar's Ministry of Foreign Affairs highlighted that the programme helps promote health recovery and stability through focusing on psychological, physical, and social health for each family member, enabling families to rebuild their life confidently and safely. The programme is implemented in partnership with repre-

sentatives of Russia and Ukraine.

Last April, Qatar's Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Office of the Ukrainian Parliament Commissioner for Human Rights jointly announced a partnership that would promote well-being and safety in Ukraine. Qatar announced a \$3mn aid to support the critical operation undertaken by the Office of the Ukrainian Parliament Commissioner for Human Rights.

As outlined in the joint statement, the funding aims to back initiatives that aim to improve the life of children and Ukrainians affected by the armed conflict and the entire population through strengthening the possibility of receiving social and economic support.

In the context of its supportive position for achieving peace and stability in Ukraine, Qatar participated in the Ukraine Recovery Conference held in London, in June 2023, with the participation of officials from roughly 60 states and leaders of major international companies.

The conference was intended to help Ukraine recover through fostering the private sector's role and building an economy capable of adapting to changes.

In December 2022, Qatar participated in "In solidarity with the Ukrainian People" conference organised by France in partnership with Ukraine to remobilise support for Ukraine and provide and immediate assistance for the Ukrainian people. (QNA)

# QC provides safe drinking water in Bangladesh

Qatar Charity has implemented many water purification projects in Bangladesh.

# QU researchers uncover potential treatment for diabetic retinopathy

Researchers at the College of Nursing, Qatar University (QU), in collaboration with peers from King Khalid University, Saudi Arabia, and Zarqa Private University, Jordan, have made a discovery that could transform the treatment of diabetic retinopathy. Their study reveals that a natural compound found in tomatoes, Esculeoside A (ESA), shows promise in preventing the retinal damage that often leads to blindness in diabetes patients. Diabetic retinopathy, caused by high blood sugar and lipid levels damaging the retina, remains a leading cause of vision loss in people with diabetes. Published in the Elsevier journal *Biomedicine & Pharmacotherapy*,

the study demonstrates that ESA can significantly reduce retinal damage in diabetic rats by lowering oxidative stress, inflammation, and cell death through the activation of the Nrf2 pathway. This discovery suggests ESA could play a crucial role in halting the progression of diabetic retinopathy. Dr Mahmoud al-Khateeb, a lecturer of pre-clinical affairs at the College of Nursing at QU, and the study's corresponding author, heralded the findings as a beacon of hope for diabetic patients worldwide. "In our shared endeavour, we have cast a beacon of hope for diabetic patients worldwide. The discovery

of ESA's potential in guarding against diabetic retinopathy marks a pivotal moment in medical research," Dr al-Khateeb said. The study involved type-1 diabetic rats treated with ESA, which showed significant improvements in retinal health without altering blood sugar or lipid levels. Researchers employed meticulous biochemical analyses, histological examinations, and advanced molecular techniques to uncover ESA's mechanisms. Unlike existing treatments, which often come with high costs and significant side effects, ESA offers a natural, potentially safer alternative. Despite the promising initial findings, further research is necessary to fully understand

ESA's mechanisms and efficacy across different stages of diabetic eye disease. The researchers plan to conduct advanced laboratory tests and clinical trials to ensure ESA's safety and effectiveness in humans. Dr Hisham al-Shaikhli, assistant professor at the College of Nursing at QU, and co-principal investigator of the study, emphasised the importance of ongoing research stating, "As we explore the potential of ESA, we know there is much we do not understand. We need to study it more in labs. We are so committed to learning more through careful clinical trials to make sure ESA is safe and effective for real-world use."

Sheinbaum unlikely to repeat mentor's Trump 'bromance'

Claudia Sheinbaum's landslide win gives her an unprecedented mandate in Mexico, but success in handling the country's key ally and trading partner the United States hinges on how she can navigate the relationship and a possible clash if Donald Trump returns to the White House, according to former diplomats and analysts. A climate scientist who will become Mexico's first female president, Sheinbaum is closely aligned with Mexico's outgoing President Andres Manuel Lopez Obrador. He has not always seen eye to eye with Washington but found surprising common ground with Trump in his first term despite tensions on trade and migration.

The smooth ties between the two populists is unlikely to be replicated with Sheinbaum, analysts and ex-diplomats said, given her more reserved and disciplined style.

"I don't think she will have the type of bromance that Lopez Obrador had with Donald Trump," said Arturo Sarukhan, who was Mexico's ambassador to the United States from 2007 to 2013.

That could make things more difficult if the US Republican candidate defeats President Joe Biden in the November election. Polls show Trump leading in some battleground states.

But Sheinbaum will be all too aware that her promises to expand welfare programmes and continue the policies that have helped her party lift millions of Mexicans out of poverty depend on having a stable and growing economy; and that requires the United States.

In 2023, Mexico surpassed China to become the United States' largest trading partner, and some 80% of Mexico exports are to the United States.

"The economy of Mexico largely depends on the United States," said Mexican political analyst Viri Rios.

"So part of her mandate is to keep a solid trade relationship because the best jobs in Mexico come from the export-oriented economy."

A review of the US-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA) is set for 2026 and will be a massive test to

the relationship under Sheinbaum especially under a protectionist Trump administration, even though the pact itself is the product of a renegotiation that he orchestrated and boasted of during his first term. Kenneth Smith Ramos, Mexico's former chief negotiator for the USMCA, said there will be a number of sticking points, including energy policy and a small but growing Chinese investment in strategic sectors in Mexico.

"I can perfectly imagine a second Trump presidency where President Trump comes to Mexico and says, OK, you have to decide, do you side with the US or are you with China?" he said.

In addition to trade politics, Washington pressures the Mexican government to crack down on drug production and trafficking – especially of fentanyl – and on the movement of migrants north to the US border. Mexico, in return, wants the United States to stop guns from being smuggled south into Mexico.

"The interesting thing is how all these issues work together," said Christopher Landau, who served as US ambassador to Mexico during the Trump presidency.

"Assuming Trump wins, I think a day one issue is going to be the border and migration. So if Mexico is co-operative on that, that's certainly going to earn a lot of goodwill on the trade side," he said.

But it is not just under Trump that migration flows have become a bilateral bargaining chip. Biden, for example, signed an executive order on Tuesday that could allow authorities to stop receiving asylum requests and deny entrance to migrants once a daily threshold is exceeded, a policy that would result in migrants from around the world who cross the southern US border being returned to Mexico.

The announcement of such an executive order only days after Mexico's election shows how Mexico has been strong-armed by both Democratic and Republican US administrations into enforcing US policy south of the border, advocates and analysts say.

Still, the pressure on Mexico to ramp up detentions and deportations of migrants would likely increase under a second Trump term. Trump and other Republicans have also escalated their rhetoric about mobilising troops or firing missiles to combat Mexico's drug cartels – moves the Mexican government would vehemently oppose as a matter of national sovereignty.

And beyond personality styles and entrenched politics, there's the more simple fact that Sheinbaum will be Mexico's first woman president – a widely celebrated achievement that might nevertheless complicate her relationship with Trump.

"Claudia Sheinbaum is a scientist, a political leader and she self-identifies as a feminist," said Gema Kloppe-Santamaria, Assistant Professor of Latin American History at George Washington University. "All of these qualifications make her a potential candidate to irritate Trump, if he is elected." – Reuters

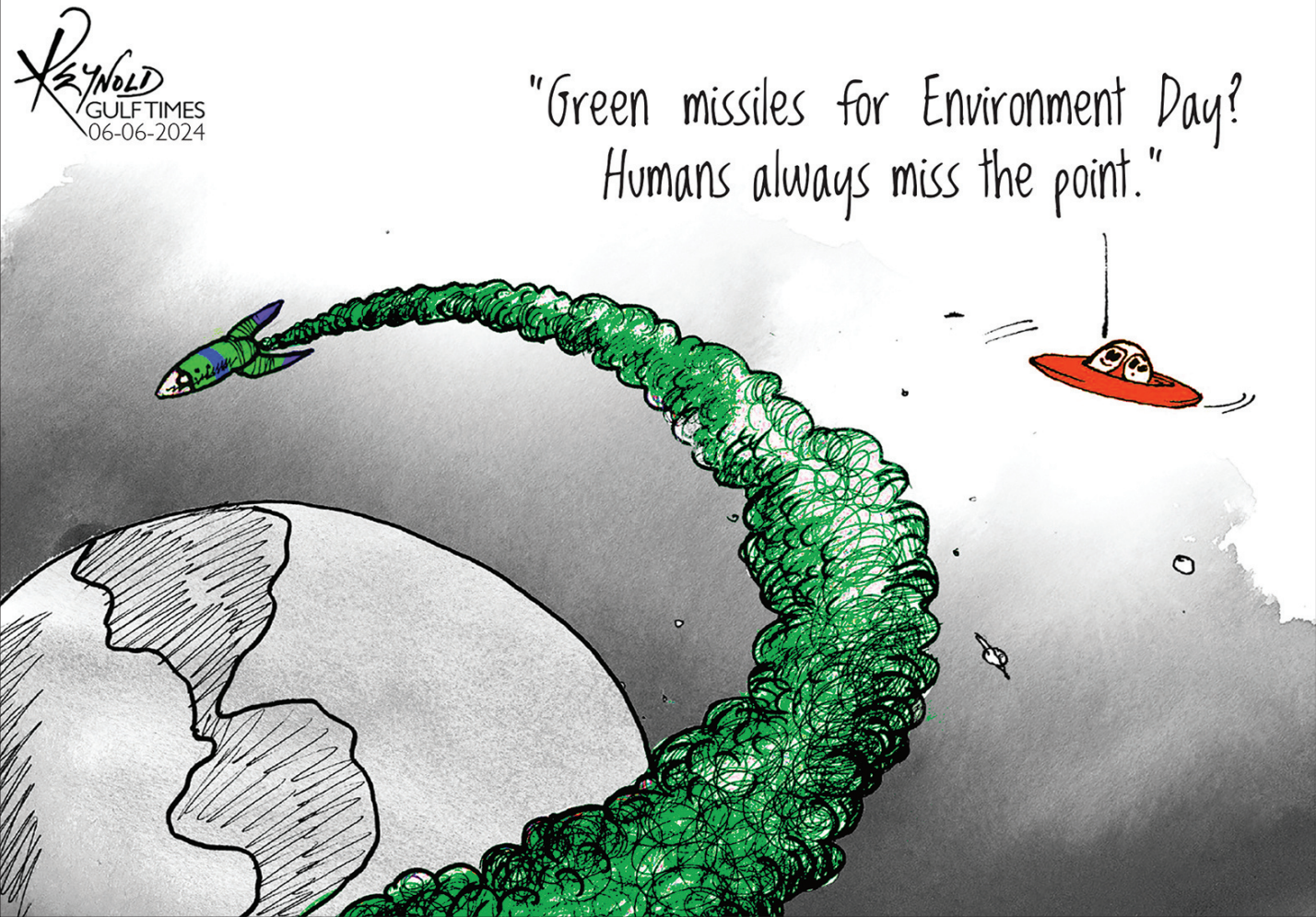

The high cost of GPT-4o

With the launch of GPT-4o, OpenAI has once again shown itself to be the world's most innovative artificial-intelligence company. This new multimodal AI tool – which seamlessly integrates text, voice, and visual capabilities – is significantly faster than previous models, greatly enhancing the user experience. But perhaps the most attractive feature of GPT-4o is that it is free – or so it seems.

One does not have to pay a subscription fee to use GPT-4o. Instead, users pay with their data. Like a black hole, GPT-4o increases in mass by sucking up any and all material that gets too close, accumulating every piece of information that users enter, whether in the form of text, audio files, or images.

GPT-4o gobbles up not only users' own information but also third-party data that are revealed during interactions with the AI service. Let's assume you are seeking a summary of a New York Times article's content. You take a screenshot and share it with GPT-4o, which reads the screenshot and generates the requested summary within seconds. For you, the interaction is over. But OpenAI is now in possession of all the copyrighted material from the screenshot you provided, and it can use that information to train and enhance its model.

OpenAI is not alone. In the past year, many firms – including Microsoft, Meta, Google, and X – have quietly updated their privacy policies in ways that potentially allow them to collect user data and apply it to train generative AI models. Though leading AI companies have already faced

numerous lawsuits in the United States over their unauthorised use of copyrighted content for this purpose, their appetite for data remains as voracious as ever. After all, the more they obtain, the better they can make their models.

The problem for leading AI firms is that high-quality training data has become increasingly scarce. In late 2021, OpenAI was so desperate for more data that it reportedly transcribed over a million hours of YouTube videos, violating the platform's rules. (Google, YouTube's parent company, has not pursued legal action against OpenAI, possibly to avoid accountability for its own harvesting of YouTube videos, the copyrights for which are owned by their creators.)

With GPT-4o, OpenAI is trying a different approach, leveraging a large and growing user base – drawn in by the promise of free service – to crowdsource massive amounts of multimodal data. This approach mirrors a well-

known tech-platform business model: charge users nothing for services, from search engines to social media, while profiting from app tracking and data harvesting – what Harvard professor Shoshana Zuboff famously called "surveillance capitalism."

To be sure, users can prohibit OpenAI from using their "chats" with GPT-4o for model training. But the obvious way to do this – on ChatGPT's settings page – automatically turns off the user's chat history, causing users to lose access to their past conversations. There is no discernable reason why these two functions should be linked, other than to discourage users from opting out of model training.

If users want to opt out of model training without losing their chat history, they must, first, figure out that there is another way, as OpenAI highlights only the first option. They must then navigate through OpenAI's privacy portal – a multi-step process. Simply put,

OpenAI has made sure that opting out carries significant transaction costs, in the hopes that users will not do it.

Even if users consent to the use of their data for AI training, consent alone would not guard against copyright infringement, because users are providing data that they may not actually own. Their interactions with GPT-4o thus have spillover effects on the creators of the content being shared – what economists call "externalities." In this sense, consent means little.

While OpenAI's crowdsourcing activities could lead to copyright violations, holding the company – or others like it – accountable will be no easy feat. AI-generated output rarely looks like the data that informed it, which makes it difficult for copyright holders to know for certain whether their content was used in model training. Moreover, a firm might be able to claim ignorance: users provided the content during interactions with its services, so how can the company know where they got it from?

Creators and publishers have employed a number of methods to keep their content from being sucked into the AI-training blackhole. Some have introduced technological solutions to block data scraping. Others have updated their terms of service to prohibit the use of their content for AI training. Last month, Sony Music – one of the world's largest record labels – sent letters to more than 700 generative-AI companies and streaming platforms, warning them not to use its content without explicit authorisation.

But as long as OpenAI can exploit the "user-provided" loophole, such efforts will be in vain. The only credible way to address GPT-4o's externality problem is for regulators to limit AI firms' ability to collect and use the data their users share.

# Putin vows to pay back West in same coin

**Says allowing Ukraine to target Russia with their arms is a serious, dangerous step**

Russian President Vladimir Putin yesterday criticised the West's delivery of long-range weapons to Ukraine, arguing Moscow could arm other countries with similar weapons to attack Western targets.

The comment — which Putin made at a rare press conference with foreign news outlets — came after several Western countries including the United States gave Ukraine the green light to strike targets inside Russia, a move Moscow has called a grave miscalculation.

“If someone thinks it is possible to supply such weapons to a warzone to attack our territory and create problems for us, why don't we have the right to supply weapons of the same class to regions of the world where there will be strikes on sensitive facilities of those (Western) countries,” Putin said.

“That is, the response can be asymmetric. We will think about it,” he told reporters.

“Delivering arms to a warzone is always bad. Even more so if

those who are delivering are not just delivering weapons but also controlling them. This is a very serious and very dangerous step,” Putin said.

The Russian leader singled out Germany, saying that when the first German-supplied tanks “appeared on Ukrainian soil, it provoked a moral and ethical shock in Russia” because of the legacy of World War II.

Referring to German authorities, he said: “When they say that there will be more missiles which will hit targets on Russian territory, this definitively destroys Russian-German relations.”

Sitting opposite representatives from news outlets includ-

ing AFP, Putin repeated that his country “did not start the war against Ukraine”, instead blaming a pro-Western revolution in 2014. “Everyone thinks that Russia started the war in Ukraine. I would like to emphasise that nobody in the West, in Europe, wants to remember how this tragedy started,” Putin said.

He declined to give the number of Russia's battlefield losses in the more than two-year conflict, saying only that Ukraine's were five times higher.

“I can tell you that as a rule, no-one talks about it,” Putin said, when asked why Russia had not yet disclosed a figure.

“If we talk about irrecoverable

President Vladimir Putin said yesterday that Russia did not care who the next US president was, as this would probably not change anything for Moscow, but he said the US court system was clearly being used in a political battle against Donald Trump. “For us, we do not think the end result holds much significance. We will work with any president the American people elect.” Calling incumbent Joe Biden a predictable old school politician, he said Moscow would not meddle in domestic US politics, something it has been repeatedly accused of in the past by US intelligence services.

Trump's previous presidency had damaged US-Russia relations, he said, and it was hard to say whether it would be any different this time round if he won the November vote.

“We have never had any special ties with Mr Trump, but the fact remains that as president he started imposing massive sanctions on Russia, he withdrew from the treaty on intermediate and shorter-range missiles,” said Putin. “To say — I am speaking quite sincerely — that we believe that after the elections something will change towards Russia in American policy, I would not say so. We don't think so. We think that nothing really serious will happen.”

Putin did not however rule out a policy shift if, as he put it, Washington began looking to its own national interests.

“No-one in the US is interested in Ukraine, they are interested in the greatness of the United States, which is fighting not for Ukraine and the Ukrainian people, but for its own greatness.”

“But if the future administration will change its goal-setting vector, and will see the meaning of its existence, its work in strengthening the US from within, strengthening the economy, finances, building good relations in the world...then something may change.”

The Russian leader said it was clear however that the US judicial system had been harnessed by Trump's political rivals to try to damage his electoral chances, a strategy Putin said did not appear to be working.

“They are burning themselves from the inside, their state, their political system ... It is obvious all over the world that the prosecution of Trump, especially in court on charges that were formed on the basis of events that happened years ago, without direct proof, is simply using the judicial system in an internal political struggle,” said Putin.

**‘Total destruction of civilian population in Gaza’**

Russian President Vladimir Putin condemned the conflict in Gaza as a “total destruction of the civilian population”, as Israel's military pounded central Gaza with heavy air strikes yesterday. “What is happening now in Gaza in response to the terrorist attack on Israel, does not resemble a war. It is a kind of total destruction of the civilian population,” Putin told representatives of foreign news outlets, including AFP.

losses, the ratio is one to five,” he said.

The issue of military casualties is extremely sensitive in Russia, where all criticism of the conflict is banned and “spreading false information” about the army carries a maximum 15 year jail sentence.

When asked about the killing of AFP video journalist Arman Soladin in Ukraine last year, likely as a result of Russian rocket fire, Putin indicated Moscow was ready to help investigate.

“We will do everything in our power,” he said.

“We are ready to do this work. I do not know how it could be done in practice since this person died in a warzone.”

## Slovak PM eyes return to work after shooting

Slovak Prime Minister Robert Fico said yesterday he might return to work later this month and also accused the opposition of showing hatred and aggressiveness towards his party, in his first public comments since a May 15 assassination attempt.

Fico is recovering at home after being shot four times at close range when he greeted supporters at a government meeting in the central Slovak town of Handlova. The attack left him in serious condition in hospital and needing hours of surgery. In a video message posted on Facebook, Fico called his attacker an opposition activist, saying there was no reason to believe the shooting was the act of a “lone lunatic”.

He said he felt no hatred toward the attacker and would not seek damages.

“On May 15, a Slovak opposition activist tried to assassinate me in Handlova because of my political views,” Fico said in the video, adding medical staff had prevented the worst.

“If everything goes optimally, I could gradually return to work at the turn of June and July.”

Dressed in a button-down shirt with rolled sleeves and filmed from the waist up sitting in a black leather office chair, Fico looked in good health. His attacker, identified by prosecutors as 71-year old Juraj C, was detained on the spot after the attack and charged with attempted premeditated murder.

## Amanda Knox re-convicted of slander over murder accusation

An Italian court found American Amanda Knox guilty of slander yesterday and handed her a three-year jail sentence in a case related to the murder of her British flatmate in 2007.

Knox, who spent four years in jail for the killing of British student Meredith Kercher before the conviction was annulled in 2015, had returned to Italy hoping to clear her name in the last legal case against her over the affair.

However, the appeals court in Florence yesterday returned the same verdict as Knox received in an earlier case for wrongly accusing Congolese bar owner Patrick Lumumba of killing Kercher.

Knox, who was in court with her husband Christopher Robinson, is set to appeal against the verdict to Italy's highest court. The sentence will have no practical impact as it is covered by the time Knox spent in prison. “Amanda is very upset ... from the outcome of this hearing, she was looking to have a final point of all this, 17 years now, judicial procedure,” lawyer Carlo Dalla Vedova said.

Knox, who is now 36 and campaigns for social justice and has her own podcast, made no comment as she left the court.

## PM Modi set to take oath for a third time

Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's National Democratic Alliance (NDA) formally named him yesterday to lead a new coalition government for a third straight term, a day after it regained power with a surprisingly slim majority.

Modi, a populist who has dominated Indian politics since 2014, will for the first time head a government dependent on the support of regional allies whose loyalties have wavered over time, which could complicate the new cabinet's reform agenda.

A day after the humbling election outcome for his Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), following a strong performance by the opposition 'INDIA' bloc, Modi's 15 alliance partners met at his New Delhi residence and named him as their leader.

The BJP-led NDA won 293 seats in the 543-member lower house of parliament, more than the simple majority of 272 seats needed to form a government. The INDIA alliance led by Rahul Gandhi's centrist Congress party won 230 seats, more than forecast.

Modi was set to meet President Droupadi Murmu tomorrow to present his claim to form a government and the swearing-in could take place over the weekend, an NDA leader said on condition of anonymity because he was not authorised to speak to the media.

Separately, leaders of the INDIA alliance that comprises over two dozen parties also met at the residence of Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge in Delhi.

“The INDIA bloc will continue

to fight against the fascist rule of the BJP, led by Modi,” Kharge told reporters following the meeting. “We will take appropriate steps at the appropriate time to realise the people's desire not to be ruled by the BJP's government.”

Modi's BJP won 240 seats on its own, trimming its 2019 tally by over 60 seats, mostly in rural areas, which investors say could impact land and labour reforms that they had expected would unlock value and growth.

Ratings agency Fitch said: “Despite the slimmer majority, we do expect broad policy continuity to persist, with the government retaining its focus on its capex push, ease of doing business measures, and gradual fiscal consolidation.”

Newspapers said Modi's aura had dimmed, with the Indian Express's banner headline reading: “India gives NDA a third term, Modi a message.”

The BJP lost heavily in two bellwether states, its northern stronghold of Uttar Pradesh, which has 80 seats, and the

western state of Maharashtra, which sends 48 members to the decision-making lower house of parliament.

The Congress alone won 99 seats nationally, almost double the 52 it won in 2019 — a surprise jump that is expected to boost Gandhi's standing.

In the later stages of the election campaign Modi had sought to renew his appeal to India's Hindu-majority, accusing the opposition of favouring minority Muslims.

But without a majority of its own, some policies of his BJP, such as common personal laws for all religions, opposed by some Muslims, will likely be put on the back burner, as Modi's regional allies are seen more accommodating towards minorities.

Modi's own victory in his seat of Varanasi, located in Uttar Pradesh and considered one of the holiest cities for Hindus, was subdued, with his margin of victory down from nearly 500,000 votes in 2019 to a little more than 150,000.

## Starliner launches first crew to space station

Boeing yesterday launched its very first astronauts bound for the International Space Station aboard a Starliner capsule, which joins a select club of spacecraft to carry humans beyond Earth. The third time turned out to be the charm for the aerospace giant, after two previous bids to fly were aborted with the crew strapped in and ready to go.

Astronauts Butch Wilmore and Suni Williams, both of whom have two previous spaceflights under their belts, blasted off at 10:52am atop a United Launch Alliance Atlas V rocket from the Cape Canaveral Space Force Station in Florida. Their Starliner, named “Calyпсо” after famed oceanographer Jacques Cousteau's ship, is now chasing the ISS in orbit. It should rendezvous with the research lab at 12:15pm Sunday to begin a roughly one-week stay.

“Suni and I are honoured to share this dream of spaceflight with each and every one of you,” Wilmore, who is commander of the test flight, said just before liftoff. “Let's put some fire in this rocket, and let's push it to the heavens.”

Starliner becomes just the sixth type of US-built spaceship to fly NASA astronauts, following the Mercury, Gemini and Apollo programmes in the 1960s and 1970s, the Space Shuttle from 1981 to 2011, and SpaceX's Crew Dragon from 2020. “This is another milestone in this extraordinary history of NASA,” the space agency's chief Bill Nelson told reporters.

“And I want to give my personal congratulations to the whole team that went through a lot of trial and tribulation. But they had perseverance. And that's what we do at NASA, we don't launch until it's right.”

## French artist takes own life after wife's death

French artist Ben (**pictured**), best known for his slogans in handwriting against a black background, has died aged 88, taking his own life just hours after the death of his wife with whom he had been married 60 years, his family said yesterday. His wife Annie suffered a stroke on Monday evening, and died yesterday, the couple's two children, Eva and Francois, said in a statement.

“Unwilling and unable to live without her, Ben killed himself a few hours later at their home” in Saint-Pancrace, a district of the French Mediterranean city of Nice. “The world of culture has lost a legend,” Culture Minister Rachida Dati said, hailing a “goldsmith of language” with “humorous, sometimes satirical writing” and whose “art will continue to make France shine throughout the world.”

“On our children's pencil cases,



on so many everyday objects and even in our imaginations, Ben had left his mark, made of freedom and poetry, of apparent lightness and overwhelming depth,” added President Emmanuel Macron in a statement.

Police vehicles remained stationed all day yesterday outside the artist's residence in Nice while a forensics investigator and a public prosecutor arrived at midday for

the investigation into the causes of death, an AFP journalist said. The precise cause of death was not immediately clear.

Born in Naples in 1935 as Benjamin Vautier to a Franco-Swiss family, Ben co-founded the so-called Nice school of artists with fellow luminaries based in the Cote d'Azur including Yves Klein. His “writings” — phrases often drawn in white paint on a black background — seem at first glance to have been dreamed up by a schoolboy. But they shake up the established notions of contemporary art with phrases like “What is the use of art?”, “Is the new always new?”, “What are you doing here?”, or “My biggest worry is me”.

Ben defended the presence of art in everyday life and his works have been reproduced on school bags, pencil cases and notebooks and also adorn tram stops in Nice.
