US visa waiver is recognition for Qatar's policies

Qatar has once again demonstrated its growing global stature, becoming the first Arab country designated to enter the prestigious US Visa Waiver Programme (VWP). This landmark achievement was confirmed by US Secretary of Homeland Security Alejandro N. Mayorkas, in consultation with Secretary of State Antony J. Blinken, and also announced by the US embassy in Doha.

Starting no later than December 1, 2024, Qatari citizens will be able to apply for travel to the US for tourism or business purposes for up to 90 days without the need for a visa, using the Electronic System for Travel Authorization (ESTA). This development underscores the deepening of ties between Qatar and the US, but it also signifies far more: Qatar's evolving role as a reliable security partner, its growing influence in international diplomacy, and the broadening of its economic and cultural relations with the West.

In particular, this achievement is because of the wise leadership of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani in managing strategic relations and leading Qatar to these stages of progress and making the country an important player in international affairs. The US Visa Waiver Program is not simply a convenience for travellers, it reflects a country's trustworthiness as a global partner.

Entry into the VWP is a rigorous process, with strict eligibility criteria based on security, law enforcement cooperation, and reciprocal agreements. Qatar's inclusion in the VWP is a testament to its commitment to these principles, proving itself as a secure, dependable partner of the

PM attends Joint Ministerial Meeting between GCC countries and US



HE the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim al-Thani participated yesterday in a joint ministerial meeting of the Foreign Ministers of the Gulf Co-operation Council (GCC) countries with US Secretary of State Antony Blinken, on the sidelines of the 79th session of the United Nations General Assembly in New York. The meeting addressed co-operation relations between the GCC countries and the US and ways to support and enhance them, the latest developments in the Gaza Strip and the occupied Palestinian territories, updates in joint mediation efforts to end the war on the Strip, and ways to de-escalate in Lebanon, in addition to a number of topics of common concern. Cabinet lauds Amir's UN speech for highlighting Palestinian issue

The Cabinet yesterday commended the historic speech delivered by His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani on Tuesday during the opening session of the 79th session of the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA 79), which mainly addressed the Palestinian cause and the ongoing aggression and brutal war to which the brotherly Palestinian people are being subjected, amidst deliberate international inaction and Israeli insistence on forcing a fait accompli on the Palestinians and the world.

for the consequences of the current situation that the Palestinian people are undergoing – subjected to a systematic destructive war that has extended to Lebanon, the Cabinet said.

With his clear, strong and honest words, His Highness the Amir affirmed that the key to security is just peace, the Cabinet, lauding his call to stop the aggression on Cara and the war on Lebanon

Gaza and the war on Lebanon.

His Highness the Amir also stressed that Qatar will continue to make efforts with the partners until a permanent ceasefire is reached, prisoners and detainees are released, and the path of a just solution is taken in accordance with international legitimacy resolutions and the Arab Peace Initiative, emphasising that Qatar will continue its efforts until the Palestinian people obtain their legitimate rights, foremost of which

is their independent state with

East Jerusalem (Al-Quds) as its capital on the 1967 borders.

HE the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of State for Defence Affairs Dr Khalid bin Mohammed al-Attiyah chaired the Cabinet's regular meeting held at its seat at the Amiri Diwan yesterday.

US leads new effort to end hostilities in Lebanon, Gaza

he United States is spearheading a new diplomatic effort to end hostilities in both Gaza and Lebanon, linking the two conflicts as part of a single initiative, seven sources familiar with the initiative told Reuters.

Details are being discussed at the UN General Assembly in New York, according to two Lebanese officials, two Western diplomats, a source familiar with the thinking of the armed Lebanese group Hezbollah, a source in Washington and a further person briefed on the talks.

But as the effort gathered pace, Israel suggested it could add a ground incursion to its expanding campaign of strikes against Hezbollah. Three Israeli officials told Reuters that, although the US and France were working on ceasefire proposals, no significant progress had yet been made.

Nevertheless, it was the first attempt to link the two fronts in a US diplomatic push, the other seven sources said.

The deal would include the eventual release of Israeli hostages seized by the Palestinian resistance group Hamas.

Gaza massacre toll 41,495

The health ministry in Hamas-run Gaza said yesterday that at least 41,495 people have been killed in the war between Israel and the Palestinian militants, now in its 12th month. According to the ministry, 96,006 people have been wounded in the Gaza Strip since the war began on October 7.

Spotlight on provision of higher education access for Afghan refugees

E the Minister of State for International Co-operation Lolwah bint Rashid AlKhater participated in an event highlighting the achievements of international partners in providing access to higher education for Afghan refugees.

Through the action of the QFFD and EAA together with the Afghan Future Fund and the Institute of International Education, educational opportunities have been provided to outstanding students in Afghanistan, many of whom have faced threats to their safety, she noted.

She said that the Qatar Scholarship for Afghans Project (QSAP) is a shining example of this collective effort. Through this initiative, 250 displaced Afghan students have received scholarships to pursue their undergraduate and graduate studies at more than 40 prestigious universities in the US, she added, pointing out that this scholarship is more than just access to education, as it symbolizes hope, opportunity and determination to build a brighter future.

"Our collaboration with the US, through the Department of State, has been of particular importance," HE AlKhater said, adding Qatar and the US have worked tirelessly together to protect the right of Afghan women and girls

to education, and their joint efforts have not only provided scholarships but also strengthened academic advising, leadership development and created safe and supportive spaces where Afghan students can thrive.

HE AlKhater continued by saying that this partnership highlights the values that both Qatar and the US share, namely that education is not a privilege but rather a basic human right, especially for those who are marginalized, stressing that Qatar has always been committed to supporting the broader educational infrastructure in Afghanistan and building the capabilities of the future of the next generation there.

During the event, participants

shed light on co-operation between Oatar and the United States of America to support educational opportunities for Afghan youth and the unified efforts to promote education in Afghanistan, and discussed the current situation facing Afghan youth, especially females, regarding higher education and the successes, challenges and lessons learned in implementing the QSAP 1 project, in addition to formalising new partnerships and projects in response to the ongoing need for Afghan youth to access education.

The Cabinet also acknowledged the outcomes of the official visit of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani to Canada on Sept 17-18. The Cabinet affirmed that the constructive discussions held between the Amir and Canada's Prime Minister Justin Trudeau, have moved the relations between the two countries to a new stage and strengthened their common aspiration to advance them and develop their bilateral co-operation in various fields for

the benefit of their friendly peoples, especially in light of the memorandum of understanding (MoU) in the field of development co-operation and the framework agreement for international co-operation in the field of education and development, which were signed on the sidelines of His Highness' visit. 



Amir's 'Power does not nullify rights' statement reflects conscience of the region's peoples: envoy

Turkiye's ambassador to Qatar, Dr Mustafa Goksu, praised the speech delivered by His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani during the opening session of the 79th United Nations General Assembly, held yesterday at the UN headquarters in New

Ambassador Goksu stressed that His Highness the Amir's words resonate with the sentiments of the region's peoples, particularly on the Palestinian cause. He highlighted His Highness the Amir's statement, "Power does not nullify rights", and His Highness the Amir's

emphasis that "the end of occupation and the Palestinian people's right to self-determination is not a favour or a gift from anvone".

Goksu further stressed the alignment of Turkive's vision with what was expressed in His Highness the Amir's speech, particularly regarding the assertion that the Israeli aggression on the Palestinian people in Gaza is "the most brutal" and that the failure to intervene to stop this aggression represents a significant international failure



Police Academy sets up virtual training rooms for cadets

The Police Academy has added four virtual training rooms while incorporating the latest innovations in the teaching and training of cadets.

Lt Col Fahad Saeed al-Subaie, deputy chairman of the Police Academy and director of the Police College, told local Arabic daily Arrayah that virtual training aims to simulate the police reality in practical life.

"The aim of establishing these rooms is to combine theoretical study and practical application within the academy's halls instead of candidates moving to actual training sites in various police locations outside the academy," he said.

A total of 130 students including 100 Qataris and 30 candidates from Arab countries will join the academy on September 28 in the 11th batch.

The new students will begin the first foundational period (recruitment period) which ex-



tends for 50 days, to transfer the student from civilian life to military life gradually.

The training period will have a strict plan, through which the candidates learn military discipline and organisational skills.

Col al-Subaie said the academy will also receive the third batch of students from the Police Sciences Diploma at the Police Institute.

A total of 100 students including 55 from the 11th batch at the Ras Laffan Emergency and Safe-



ty College will join the academy.

These candidates include cadets from outside Qatar. For the first time, cadets from non-Arab countries will join the academy for studies. The students will undergo the first foundational period of 50 days.

The training will be in two stages that include military training in infantry, weapons, physical fitness and shooting, in addition to introductory lectures on military discipline, military service law and practical subjects in first aid.

After completing the foundational period, the trainees will join the academic programme, which includes police and legal subjects, and subjects in general requirements such as Arabic and English, computers and Oatar history.




In this context, HE the Minister of Social Development and Family called on the international community to shoulder its humanitarian responsibilities and work to build a future of lasting peace and justice.



rab and international media outlets highlighted the inclusive speech of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani at the opening session of the 79th United Nations General Assembly (UNGA 79), which was held in New York on Tuesday.

The speech of His Highness the Amir was met with great resonance and welcome in the Palestinian street which is following Qatar's tireless efforts to stop the Israeli aggression against them.

In this context, a report by the Turkish TRT Arabic TV highlighted the call of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani to stop the Israeli war on the Gaza Strip and southern Lebanon, stressing in his speech before the UNGA that Oatar will continue to make efforts until a new agreement is reached for ceasefire in Gaza.

For its part, the Turkiye News Agency said in a report that during his speech before the UNGA, His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani called to stop the aggression on the Gaza Strip and southern Lebanon. The report that came under the title "Amir of Qatar addresses the world before the United Nations: Stop the aggression on Gaza, stop the war on Lebanon," noted that the most prominent part of His Highness the Amir's speech was that he considered the aggression that the Palestinian people are being subjected to in Gaza is the most barbaric and heinous. The agency added that His Highness the Amir stressed that the failure to intervene to stop the aggression in Gaza is a major scandal, noting that His Highness stressed that there are those who are tempted by the possibility of marginalising the Palestinian cause, but the Palestinian cause is resistant to marginalisation. His Highness the Amir believed that the Palestinian cause would remain lingering in place, except in two cases, either the end of the occupation, or the disappearance of the Palestinian people.

In turn, Anadolu Agency of Turkiye said in a report that in his speech before the UNGA, His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani said that Oatar's mediation to reach a ceasefire in Gaza will continue despite the Israeli accusations.

Anadolu added that His Highness the Amir emphasised that Ismail Haniyeh was not only the political leader of Hamas but also the first elected Palestinian prime minister, calling for an end to the Israeli war on the Gaza Strip and southern Lebanon.

The agency noted the reaction of His Highness the Amir to the explosions of wireless communication devices in Lebanon and quoted His Highness as saying: "Apart from committing a major crime by rigging wireless communication devices and exploding them simultaneously across thousands of people with total disregard for their identity or location, Israel is currently waging a war on Lebanon and no one knows to what extent this war could escalate."

The agency also pointed out His Highness the Amir's description of the Israeli war on Gaza as "a crime of genocide by means of using the most sophisticated weapons against a people besieged in a detention camp where there is no escape from the barrage of aerial

The agency quoted His Highness the Amir as stressing: "We will continue to exert efforts with our partners until reaching a permanent ceasefire, securing the release of prisoners and detainees, taking the path of a just solution in accordance with the resolutions of international legitimacy and the Arab Peace Initiative, and enabling the Palestinian people to obtain all their legitimate rights, foremost of which is their independent state with East Jerusalem as its capital on the 1967 borders."

In turn, the French newspaper Le Parisien said that during his speech, His Highness the Amir considered that "The blatant aggression that befalls the Palestinian people in the Gaza Strip today is the most extensive in breaching human values."

The newspaper pointed out that His Highness said: "This is not a

war within the international relations' well-known and common concept of war, but rather a crime of genocide."

In the same context, Arab News newspaper of Saudi Arabia said His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani described from the UNGA's podium in New York, that the war waged by Israel on the Gaza Strip as a "genocide".

Under the title "Amir of Oatar: What is happening in Gaza is a 'crime of genocide'... We will continue our efforts until reaching a ceasefire," the Asharq news website said, reporting parts from His Highness the Amir's speech, including the Amir saying the aggression on Palestinian people in the Gaza Strip today is the most barbaric and His Highness' emphasis that "There is no Israeli partner for peace during the current government's tenure."

Al Sharq website also noted that His Highness voiced his support for the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees (UNRWA), stressing the

continuation of mediation efforts until a ceasefire is reached in Gaza.

The Italian media paid significant attention to His Highness the Amir's speech, led by the Italian news agency ANSA, as well as the newspapers Fatto Quotidiano, the Giornale di Brescia, and the Espansione TV website, which all reported what was stated in the speech, noting His Highness the Amir's statement on the plight of Palestinians

Egyptian Al Qahera News TV and Nile TV broadcasted the full speech of His Highness the Amir at the UNGA's opening session live on air.

In an interview with Qatar News Agency (QNA), two political analysts praised His Highness the Amir's inclusive speech, stressing that His Highness' speech came at an important and sensitive time, was comprehensive, and expressed what is happening in the Palestinian reality.

In this context, political analyst Dr Fayez Abu Shamala said that His Highness the Amir was accurate in describing the Palestinian situation, reflected the Palestinian reality in his speech, and held the international community responsible. He added that His Highness the Amir directly condemned the occupation, holding it responsible for the destruction and devastation that befell Gaza.

Abu Shamala indicated that His Highness the Amir's speech represents what is going on in the conscience of the Palestinian people who want to stop the aggression, but at the same time do not want to give up their rights.

Professor of Strategic Studies Dr Ibrahim Habib saw that His Highness the Amir's speech focused on the necessity of a just and comprehensive solution to the Palestinian issue, and clearly highlighted that there is no real Israeli peace partner, contrary to what the United States was saying, and what Israel claims that there is no Palestinian partner for peace.

Dr Habib emphasised that the speech was influential for a leader who speaks on behalf of the nation. (QNA)

Shura general secretariat organises AI workshop

The General Secretariat of the Shura Council, in co-operation with the General Secretariat of the Gulf Co-operation Council (GCC), organised yesterday a workshop for the Secretaries-General of the Shura, representatives and national councils in the GCC countries under the title 'Transformations in the work of GCC legislative councils in light of artificial intelligence: opportuni ties and challenges.'

Attended by the secretariesgeneral, members of the GCC legislative councils, the GCC General Secretariat, and the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU), the workshop came within the framework of the Gulf councils' ongoing efforts to enhance the optimal use of modern technology, especially artificial intelligence (AI), in supporting legislative work. A group of experts and AI and cybersecurity specialists presented the workshop.

In his opening speech, HE the Secretary-General of the Shura Council Nayef bin Mohammed al-Mahmoud stressed the significance of the workshop and its role in highlighting the transformations the world is witnessing thanks to artificial intelligence.

He noted that the GCC countries, especially Qatar, have developed ambitious national strategies aimed at adopting AI in various sectors, including the legislative sector, which can benefit from these technologies to increase efficiency and improve performance.

He pointed out the vital role of legislative councils in enacting laws and legislation that ensure the optimal and safe use of this



technology, with a focus on protecting societies from potential risks such as data manipulation and privacy.

The secretary-general added that the use of AI in legislative councils opens up broad prospects for enhancing and accelerating legislative processes, as well as improving the accuracy of procedures and reducing administrative burdens. He stressed the need to keep pace with this development with legislation that ensures the responsible use of AI and limits its negative aspects, which may include cybercrimes and data manipulation.

At the beginning of the workshop, Director of National Cyber Governance and Assurance Affairs at Qatar National Cyber Security Agency (NCSA), engineer Dana Yousef al-Abdulla gave a brief presentation on AI and its challenges, discussing the expected impact of AI on the work

of legislative councils. Professor of Digital Humanities at Hamad Bin Khalifa University Dr George Mikros presented a paper titled "The use of AI and information technology to enrich the performance of GCC legislative councils", while Director of Cyber Security Strategies and Policies at NCSA engineer Abdulrahman Mohammed al-Shafi discussed in his paper the impact of AI on the protection of privacy and digital rights. Shura Council member Dr

Ahmed bin Hamad al-Mohannadi discussed in his paper the role of legislative councils in legislating laws related to AI, while Dr Khalid Mubarak al-Kuwari, a faculty member

at Hamad Bin Khalifa University, presented his paper under the title "Laws required to regulate the use of AI in the work of legislative councils."

The workshop concluded with valuable interventions by the members and the secretariesgeneral of the GCC legislative councils. (QNA)

Achieving peace through strength in Ukraine

Russian President Vladimir Putin denies Ukraine's right to sovereignty, having invaded it twice since 2014. Thankfully, his efforts to subjugate the country have been thwarted by the courage of the Ukrainian people

After two and a half years of fiercely defending their homeland, it has become abundantly clear that Ukrainians will never submit to Russian tyranny. But despite their resilience, Putin's brutal war of aggression continues. If Ukraine's allies fail to show the necessary resolve, the conflict could drag on for years, undermining European stability.

Moreover, an increasingly militaristic Russia threatens not only Ukraine but the entire world, with potentially catastrophic consequences. Russia's war has already sent shockwaves around the world, driving up energy and food prices and jeopardising nuclear safety. By violating fundamental principles of international law, Russia has destabilised the global order.

To promote peace, Ukraine's allies must make Putin understand that he cannot dictate the terms of how the war will end. They can do this by building global support for a peace agreement rooted in the fundamental principles of international law, strengthening Ukraine's position on the battlefield, providing long-term security guarantees, and outlining a clear path to Nato accession.

While Putin aims to prolong the war, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky is actively pursuing a sustainable peace. This summer, he

gathered representatives from more than 90 countries in Switzerland to rally support for his ten-point peace formula, which calls for strengthening nuclear safety and addressing the conflict's environmental repercussions, in addition to full Russian withdrawal.

Global pressure will be critical to reaching an agreement, but enduring peace also requires strong security guarantees. Given that Russia has repeatedly shown its disregard for international law and basic human rights by violating treaties and committing widesprea war crimes, peace cannot rest on Putin's promises alone. The outcome of the war will depend on Ukraine's ability to defend itself.

The immediate priority is to improve Ukraine's position on the battlefield. As Russian missiles and drones continue to kill civilians across the country, with most attacks launched from Russian territory, Ukraine has every right to deploy long-range weapons to hit these targets and enter Russia to prevent further assaults. Limiting its ability to do so is essentially asking it to fight with one arm tied behind its back. Ukrainian forces have consistently shown they can use Westernsupplied weapons effectively and responsibly. It is time for allies to lift any remaining restrictions on the types of weapons delivered and how they can be used.

But along with immediate support, Ukraine's allies must commit to providing it with military equipment and financial resources for as long as needed. Ukraine has already received long-term security guarantees from more than 30 countries as part of the Kyiv Security Compact, which we co-authored. Now is the time to prove that these guarantees have teeth. In the coming months, our efforts will focus on ensuring that the guarantees deliver on their promise. This involves monitoring their implementation, assessing evolving threats, and highlighting the ways Ukraine's security needs align with Europe's broader defence strategy.

Preventing Putin from winning the peace will require more than security guarantees. Ukraine's allies should expand their support by taking steps like training Ukrainian forces within the country and deploying civilian contractors or specialised military teams to repair damaged equipment on-site. Neighbouring allies could establish an extended air-defence shield over Western Ukraine to intercept incoming Russian missiles and drones, thereby saving civilian lives and enabling Ukraine to redeploy its air-defence systems to the front lines.

Each of these steps will undoubtedly strengthen Ukraine's position in any future negotiations. But ultimately, the only way to ensure long-term peace and security in Europe is to bring Ukraine into Nato. Leaving Ukraine in the grey zone between Russia and the Alliance would only invite more instability, aggression, and violence. Nato leaders must act decisively and offer Ukraine a path to membership. While this does not mean that Ukraine will join overnight, such a commitment would send a strong message to Putin that his war will not prevent its eventual accession.

Faced with Putin's heavily militarised and increasingly revanchist Russia, Ukraine and its allies must embrace the ancient Roman maxim si vis pacem, para bellum ("If you want peace, prepare for war"). Over the past two and a half years, the Ukrainian people have demonstrated an unwavering determination to defend their freedom. But to achieve lasting peace, the international community must muster the courage and strength to support and maintain it. - Project Syndicate

Crypto policy needs to empower builders

he cryptocurrency industry is going all in on November's US presidential election, channelling hundreds of millions of dollars to promote candidates who may support sensible regulation. But for all the investment - the sector tops all others as a source of funds this cycle - it remains unclear how either candidate would approach the issue and prioritise builders over speculators.

Casual observers may have heard that former president Donald Trump, the Republican candidate, has taken up the cause. Addressing a recent Bitcoin conference, he promised to make the United States the "crypto capital of the planet," create a Bitcoin strategic reserve, and embrace stablecoins. The crowd ate it up. Yet Trump's brand of boosterism underscores the sector's biggest challenge; for too long those who want to use the technology for financial speculation have dominated policy debates, while those who actually want to build something with it are sidelined.

Vice-President Kamala Harris, the Democratic nominee, has largely remained silent on the topic, but now has an opportunity to offer a more thoughtful and progressive approach to financial innovation. Crypto policy, like AI policy, is fundamentally about innovation and national competitiveness. To establish the US as a leader in this strategic sector, the next administration must first replace the current lineup of hostile financial regulators, led by Securities and Exchange Commission Chairman Gary Gensler, who has consistently rejected meaningful dialogue with the industry.

But installing regulators who are more sympathetic to the quick-profit mentality would hardly be an improvement. Crypto's greatest strength - its ability to incentivise the construction of open networks - is also its biggest liability. As in the nineteenthcentury railroad mania, cryptocurrencies have fuelled the creation of valuable new infrastructure, but they have also been exploited by reckless actors to perpetrate scams and fraud - Sam Bankman-Fried being a prime example of someone who knew how to play the game within the existing, imperfect regulatory framework.

Businesses engaging purely in speculation, or even outright scams, benefit the most from the current regulatory chaos. Worse, many

who have proactively advocated regulation or tried to collaborate with regulators have faced enforcement actions, resulting in a loss of access to essential banking services.

Regulators often lack incentives to adapt existing rules to new technologies, and incumbents often give them reason to defend the status quo. In crypto, accountability for criminality has come too late or not at all, leaving consumers burned. In the absence of regulatory clarity, market participants with established businesses or a need for banking services often shy away from exploring the technology, regardless of its potential. The result is a system that rewards recklessness and fraud while discouraging innovators seeking to improve payments, reform the financial sector, protect data privacy, or address market concentration in Big Tech.

Thoughtful crypto regulation will require more than Trump's pandering. This is an issue that goes beyond crypto. If the US is to lead in AI, defence, and other fields, it needs rules that recognise how much value these innovation intensive sectors' can bring to the broader economy, not least by restoring competition. This is a complex undertaking. Success will require much more than courting Bitcoin maximalists and simply allowing stablecoins

Consider Trump's proposal for the US government to hold Bitcoin as a strategic asset. It is obvious that this would benefit Bitcoin's price, but not how it would serve the national interest. Instead, the federal government should recognise blockchain-based networks as critical infrastructure, akin to 5G.

Nor should the government blindly support domestic Bitcoin mining without encouraging methods that leverage renewables and stranded energy, or provide reinforcement for an increasingly fragile grid (as seen in Texas). Regulation should consider how Bitcoin mining and chip manufacturing could contribute to national security while ensuring minimal environmental impact.

In his Nashville speech, Trump accused the Biden administration of targeting crypto businesses' relationships with their banks. But the real problem is a regulatory and supervisory environment that makes it difficult for banks to engage safely with crypto. Many banks recognise that digital payments and assets will play a major role in the financial system. Yet they have been hampered by unreasonable rules like Staff Accounting Bulletin No. 121 (SAB 121), which imposes punitive accounting standards on enterprises that cannot privately explore exceptions with SEC staff.

Trump also pledged to embrace stablecoins to reinforce dollar dominance. But, again, this issue is more complex than it may seem. To prevent the market from becoming as concentrated as the credit-card industry already is, the US needs to foster a competitive environment for stablecoin issuance. The dominant use case should not be dollarisation, as this goal could weaken capital controls, destabilise emerging economies, and undermine sanctions. Instead, legislation should ensure that stablecoins become a safe means of payment enabling instant, global transactions.

Achieving this vision demands a robust compliance framework. Current stablecoin issuers either don't know or don't want to know if their digital dollars are held by sanctioned countries or criminals. But this dangerous blind spot is a major hurdle for mainstream adoption. The onus is on crypto entrepreneurs to develop innovative solutions that address identity and compliance challenges, but progress in these areas has been limited so far. New rules need to strengthen the incentives for the private sector $% \left(\mathbf{r}\right) =\mathbf{r}^{\prime }$ to do the hard work.

At the end of the day, policymakers in Washington must come together and draft new rules, rather than trying to squeeze crypto use cases into laws from nearly a century ago. And the industry, for its part, needs to tackle the many problems that traditional financial services and crypto leaders have long ignored. A thoughtful crypto policy would prioritise builders over speculators. Envoy says Vietnam keen to enhance relations with Qatar

vietnam-Qatar ties are set for further growth with an exchange of high-ranking delegations expected over the coming months, Vietnamese ambassador Nguyen Huy Hiep said yesterday.

"As the new ambassador, I prioritise strengthening bilateral relations in all sectors, from political and economic co-operation to labour, cultural, tourism, education, energy, investment, while unlocking co-operation potential in areas such as green energy, digital transformation,

and the Halal industry," he explained.

The envoy pointed out that Vietnam and Qatar also exchanged mutual support at international forums and organisations. The bilateral trade volume varies from around \$400mn to \$500mn from year to year. "However, there are still many potentials and areas of co-operation awaiting actions from both sides to be unlocked, to further benefit the people of the two countries," he explained

The Vietnam ambassador stressed that cultural co-operation is a key area. In December 2020, the Ministry of Interior of Vietnam and the then Ministry

of Culture and Sports in Qatar signed a memorandum of understanding on information exchange between state management agencies on youth. "This has laid a foundation to develop co-operative programmes throughout 2021-2025."

Every year, Qatar offers Vietnam four Arabic language scholarships at Qatar University. Katara, Bait Al Sulaiti, and the Qatar National Library, has regularly supported and created conditions to help the Vietnam embassy in Qatar organise exchange activities and to promote Vietnamese culture.

New travel rule for Qataris to US soon: MoFA

Qatari passport holders travelling to the US of America (US) for tourism and business purposes will be able soon to apply for a 90-day non-extendable travel authorisation, an official source in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA)'s Department of Consular Affairs said. The move is pursuant to Qatar's accession to the US Visa Waiver Programme (VWP). Qatari nationals can apply for a two-year travel

authorisation via esta.cbp.dhs.gov or the mobile application (ESTA Mobile) through the IOS app store or Google Play store. The authorisations are valid for two years

The travel authorisation is deemed void upon the expiration of the passport, the source said, adding that the implementation and requirements of the VWP will be announced in due course. **(ONA)**

Temporary closure of Corniche tunnel
