

Egyptians reacted with fury yesterday to US President Donald Trump's plan to displace Palestinians from Gaza to Egypt and Jordan, while downplaying his threat to cut aid to both countries if they refuse. Al-Ahram newspaper ran a front-page headline declaring "Egypt urges the world to end historical injustice against the Palestinian people", while the private daily Al-Masry Al-Youm wrote, "Palestinian anger: Gaza is not for sale". On X, the hashtag "on the shoe" - a common Egyptian phrase meaning "we could not care less" - began to trend in esponse to what many s attempt at intimidation. Page 12

The summit brings together over 30 heads of state and government, in addition to more than 80 international, regional, and global organisations, and 140 government delegations.


QNA delegation is led by HE the Director-General of Qatar News Agency, Ahmed bin Saeed al-Rumaihi, who is joining a distin-

and ambassadors accredited to the state, a number of senior officials and an elite of intellectuals.

Jassim Salman, General Supervisor of the seminar season, said in an introductory speech: "The 'Seminar Season' has become an annual platform to enhance indepth cultural and intellectual dialogue on the most prominent contemporary cultural and societal issues."

The event opened with a semi-

nar held at the Sheraton Hotel under the title "Arab Cultural Discourse in the West", in which Jack Lang, former French minister of culture, President of the Arab World Institute in Paris; and Iraqi writer Shawqi Abdul Amir, Director of the Arab World Institute in Paris; participated.

Lang praised the cultural and creative level in Qatar, and the cultural renaissance it is witnessing at all levels. Especially in terms of infrastructure, as it has many museums, libraries, and cultural institutions that consolidate the Qatari presence in the global cultural scene. In addition to the educational system the country

enjoys, and its expansion in establishing educational schools, including the "Voltaire" School, and its role in spreading the French language.

He spoke about the richness of the Arabic language, noting that it is one of the most spoken languages in the world, and one of the oldest living languages today, and is characterised by an exceptional linguistic wealth.

He stressed that Arabic had the merit of transferring sciences and knowledge, as it was a bridge between the ancient world, such as the Greek world, and the Western world, as a large part of Greek philosophy reached us through it,

as well as mathematics.

One of the features of Lang's interest in the Arabic language is his authorship of a book five years ago titled "The Arabic Language, the Treasure of France", attributing his choice of this title to the great influence of the Arabic language in France and its remarkable impact on society. Lang explained that a generation grew up in France that was raised on the Arabic language, as Arabic is the second language in France, after the mother tongue, and that there are millions who speak it in France.

Writer Shawqi Abdul Amir spoke about the challenges facing the Arabic language in the West. pointing out that there is a gap between the greatness of the Arabic language and our ability as individuals to communicate it to the

world in reality.

As there are, from his point of view, three main obstacles, which he called the past, orality, and stereotyping, calling for a discourse that focuses on origins and heritage but does not rely entirely on this legacy without actual re-

In addition to interest in documentation and recording, as the West does not easily accept oral discourse, calling for confronting the prevailing stereotype in the West about the Arab world.

Qatar strongly condemns bombing in Afghanistan

Qatar expressed yesterday its strong condemnation of the bombing that took place near a bank in Kunduz province in northern Afghanistan, resulting in deaths and injuries. In a statement, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs reiterated Qatar's firm position on the rejection of violence and terrorism, regardless of the motives and causes. The ministry expressed Qatar's condolences to the families of the victims, the caretaker government, and the people of Afghanistan, and wished a speedy recovery to the injured. (QNA)



QC supports half a million people in Bangladesh

atar Charity (QC), with the support of donors in Qatar, implemented 2,235 projects in Bangladesh in 2024, benefitting 548,167 people in the areas of water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH), relief, education, health, development, and economic empowerment.

QC implemented 1,930 WASH projects across 14 districts, benefiting 96,500 residents. These projects played a pivotal role in enhancing water access for communities suffering from contaminated water sources.

QC completed 216 mosque construction projects in 40 districts in 2024, benefiting 43,200 people. These mosques provide spaces for prayer and community gatherings, promoting unity and belonging among residents.

QC implemented 33 edu-



cational projects that include the construction of schools and Qur'an memorisation centres in 13 districts, benefiting 5,050 students.

Health projects were another focal area for QC in 2024. These efforts facilitated the treatment of congenital heart disease in 113 children from families financially unable to afford such life-saving treatments.

In the areas of social welfare, QC, through its Rofaqa, continues to sponsor 4,426 orphans in Bangladesh. QC also built five orphan care centres to benefit 1,000 children in various regions of the country.

QC also completed 40 housing projects across 18 districts, benefiting 238 individuals. QC implemented four income-generating

projects in two districts, providing farmland to empower 20 people financially.

QC provided seasonal aid to the most vulnerable during Ramadan, Eid, and winter. Through four projects, Ramadan aid, Zakat Al-Fitr, sacrificial meat, and Eid clothing were delivered to 68,620 people. QC also distributed winter clothing such as blankets, hoodies, and jackets to 11,000 sponsored orphans and their families

Qatar Charity's quick response to the devastating floods in the Noakhali district in 2024 delivered relief aid to 318,000 flood-affected individuals. Food packages and clean water were provided to families in their time of need. During 2025, QC is set to implement more than 2,000 projects across Bangladesh.

Qatar to create a permanent national pavilion in Giardini of La Biennale di Venezia

atar Museums (QM) has announced plans to build a permanent national pavilion in the historic Giardini della Biennale, which first opened to the public in 1895.

With this, Qatar will join 30 other nations that have permanent pavilions at the Giardini in Venice, Italy.

According to a QM statement, the announcement follows the signing of a Protocol of Co-operation between Qatar Museums and the Municipality of Venice in June 2024. The agreement aims to strengthen existing relations and enhance cultural, social, and economic collaboration between Qatar, Venice, and the Italian Republic.

Among the prominent modern architects featured are Raj Rewal (India), Nayyar Ali Dada (Pakistan), Abdel Wahed El Wakil (Egypt), and Minnette de Silva (Sri Lanka). Their contributions will be highlighted alongside works by contemporary designers and architects such as Marina Tabassum and Nabil Haque (Bangladesh), Sameep Padora and Vastu Shilpa (India), Daaz Studio (Iran), Abeer Seikaly (Jordan), Sumaya Dabbagh (UAE), Liz Diller (USA), New South Studio (France), and Meriem Shabani (Iran).

The exhibition is commissioned by HE Sheikha Al Mayassa bint Hamad bin Khalifa al-Thani and Qatar Museums and is organised by the future Art Mill Museum. It is curated by Aurélien Lemonier, Curator of Architecture at the Art Mill Museum, and Sean Anderson, Associate Professor at Cornell University, in collaboration with Virgile Alexandra (ONA)

Jordan king rejects Trump's Gaza takeover plan

rordan's King Abdullah II told Donald Trump yesterday that his country would take in some 000 sick children from war-torn Gaza but pushed back against the US president's plan to take over the Palestinian territory and send its population into exile.

"I reiterated Jordan's steadfast position against the displacement of Palestinians in Gaza and the West Bank. This is the unified Arab position. Rebuilding Gaza without displacing the Palestinians and addressing the dire humanitarian situation should be the priority for all," Abdullah said on social media after the talks.

However, he told Trump that Egypt was working on a plan for

how countries in the region could "work" with Trump on the proposal.

The Jordanian monarch also appeared to offer a sweetener to Trump, who had just the day before the visit floated the possibility of halting US aid to Jordan if it did not take refugees

"One of the things that we can do right away is take 2,000 children, cancer children who are in a very ill state. That is possible," Abdullah said as Trump welcomed him and Crown Prince Hussein in the Oval Office.

Trump replied that it was "really a beautiful gesture" and said he didn't know about it before the Jordanian monarch's arrival at the White House

The US leader stunned the world when he announced a proposal last week for the US to "take

over" Gaza, envisioning rebuilding the devastated territory into the "Riviera of the Middle East" but only after resettling Palestinians elsewhere, with no plan for them ever to return.

Abdullah urged patience and said that Egypt was coming up

with a response and that Arab nations would then discuss it at talks in Rivadh.

"Let's wait until the Egyptians can come and present it to the president and not get ahead of ourselves," Abdullah said.

Trump retreated from his pre-

vious talk of an aid halt to Jordan and Egypt, saying: "I don't have to threaten that. I do believe we're above that."

Trump however kept pushing his plan to "own" Gaza despite the fact that it is home to more than 2mn Palestinians, saying that it would be held under "US authority." "We don't have to buy. We're going to have Gaza,' Trump said.

"We're going to take it, we're going to hold it, we're going to cherish it." But Trump, who made his fortune as a real estate tycoon did however deny that he would seek to personally develop property in Gaza. "No. I've had a great career in real estate," he said.

The meeting came as the Gaza ceasefire appears increasingly fragile, after Trump warned on Monday that "all hell" would break out if Hamas fails to release all hostages by Saturday.

The Jordanian king and crown prince earlier met Trump's nasecurity adviser, Mike tional

King Abdullah is a key US ally but last week rejected "any attempts" to take control of the Palestinian territories and displace its people.

Egyptian President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi, who is expected to visit the White House later this week, urged yesterday the reconstruction of Gaza "without displacing Palestinians."

Jordan is also keenly aware of the economic pressure Trump could exercise. Every year, Jordan receives around \$750mn in economic assistance from Washington and another \$350mn in mili-

ith his Gaza home destroyed in Israel's military offensive, Shaban had intended to take his family on a break to Egypt once the Hamas-Israel ceasefire was firmly in place.

He changed his mind after US President Donald Trump announced plans to resettle Gaza's Palestinian residents and redevelop the enclave, and said they should not have the right to re-

The Tel Al-Hawa neighbourhood in Gaza City, where dozens of multi-storev buildings once stood, is now largely deserted. There is no running water or electricity and, like most buildings there, Shaqaleh's home is in ruins.

"We are horrified by the destruction, the repeated displacement and the death, and I wanted to leave so I can secure a safe and better future for my children until Trump said what he said," Shaqaleh, 47, told Reuters via a chat app.

"After Trump's remarks I cancelled the idea. I fear leaving and never being able to come back. This is my homeland." Palestinians fear that Trump's plan would enforce another Nakba, or Catastrophe, when they experienced mass expulsions in 1948 with the creation of Israel.

Under Trump's scheme, Gaza's about 2.2mn Palestinians would be resettled and the United States would take control and ownership of the coastal territory, redeveloping it into the "Riviera of the Mid-

"The idea of selling my home or

the piece of land I own to foreign companies to leave the homeland and never come back is completely rejected. I am deeply rooted in the soil of my homeland and will always be," Shaqaleh said.

Any suggestion that Palestinave Gaza – which they want to be part of an independent state also encompassing the West Bank with East Jerusalem as its capital - has been anathema to the Palestinian leadership for generations. Neighbouring Arab states have rejected it since the Gaza war began

After Hamas said on Monday it was suspending the release of Israeli hostages set out in the ceasefire deal due to alleged Israeli violations, Trump said the Palestinian Hamas group should release all those it still holds by noon on Saturday or he would propose cancelling the truce and "let hell break out".

"Hell worse than what we have already? Hell worse than killing?" said Jomaa Abu Kosh, a Palestinian from Rafah in southern Gaza, standing beside devastated

One woman, Samira al-Sabea, accused Israel of blocking aid deliveries, a charge denied by Israel. "We are humiliated, street dogs

are living a better life than us," she said. "And Trump wants to make Gaza hell? This will never hap-

pen." Israel began its assault on Gaza after the Hamas fighters stormed Israel in October 2023,. The operation has killed more than 48,000 Palestinians, by Gaza

authorities' counts, and obliterated much of the enclave. Some Gazans said Palestinian leaders must find a solution to

"We don't want to leave our country but also need a solution. Our leaders - Hamas, the PA (Palestinian Authority) and other factions - must find a solution," said a 40-year-old carpenter who gave his name as Jehad.

In the occupied Palestinians were also aghast at Trump's words.

"Does he own Gaza to ask people to leave it?" said Nader Imam. "Regarding Trump I only blame the American people. How can a country like this, a superpower, accept a person like Trump? His statements are savage."

"What will Trump do? There is no fear, we rely on God," said another West Bank resident, Mohammed Salah Tamimi.

The proposal shattered decades of US peace efforts built around a two-state solution and added pressure on neighbouring Egypt and Jordan to take in resettled Palestinians.

Both countries, who receive billions in aid from the United States, rejected the plan citing concerns for national security and their commitment to the two-state solution.

For Jordan, which borders the West Bank and has absorbed more Palestinians than any other state since Israel's creation, the plan is a nightmare.

Trump said he might withhold aid to Jordan and Egypt if they refused to co-operate. Jordan's King Abdullah is meeting Trump in Washington.

"Jordan can never accept resolving this issue at its expense," said Suleiman Saud, the chairman of the Palestine Committee in Jordan's House of Representatives. "Jordan is for Jordanians, and Palestine is for Palestinians?

Egyptians furious over Trump's plan to displace Palestinians

gyptians reacted with fury yesterday to US President Donald Trump's plan to displace Palestinians from Gaza to Egypt and Jordan, while downplaying his threat to cut aid to both countries if they

The state-owned Al-Ahram newspaper ran a front-page headline declaring "Egypt urges the world to end historical injustice against the Palestinian people", while the private daily Al-Masry Al-Youm wrote, "Palestinian anger: Gaza is not for

On X, the hashtag "on the shoe" – a common Egyptian phrase meaning "we could not care less" - began to trend in response to what many saw as an attempt at intimidation.

On Monday, a strongly worded statement from Egypt's foreign ministry rejected "any compromise" that could infringe on Palestinians' rights, including to remain on their land

The statement followed a meeting in Washington between Egypt's foreign minister Badr Abdelatty and his US counterpart Marco Rubio.

During a phone call with the

Danish prime minister yesterday, President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi said that the establishment of a Palestinian state is "the only guarantee for achieving lasting peace" in the region.

The Egyptian leader also called for the reconstruction of Gaza "without displacing" its residents, according to a statement from his office. Trump, speaking on Monday,

said the US could "conceivably" halt assistance to Egypt and Jordan unless they agree to take in Palestinians from Gaza - a proposal Cairo and Amman have repeatedly rejected.

The US provides its regional ally Egypt with around \$1.3bn in military aid annually, making it one of the country's largest foreign donors. According to US government

data, Egypt received roughly \$1.5bn in both military and economic assistance from the US last year. Hussein Haridi, a former dip-

lomat and assistant foreign minister, downplayed the significance of US aid, arguing that it would not sway Egypt on Gaza.

"This small amount (about \$200mn) in economic aid will not affect the Egyptian economy," Haridi told AFP.

"Regardless of its impact, we

will not bow to Trump's threats," he said.

Haridi also said that Trump had little understanding of "the true character of Egyptians" and the country's historical role in defending Arab interests and in particular the Palestinian cause.

"We do not care about Trump's threats. Egypt is fully prepared to confront them and these threats will backfire on US interests in the region."

"This is not just Sisi's stance or the Egyptian government's stance - it is the stance of the Egyptian people," he added.

Gamal Bayoumi, a former diplomat and assistant foreign minister, meanwhile, told AFP that Egypt has made its stance clear: any attempt to force Palestinians out of Gaza "will be considered an act of war".

Bayoumi added that Egypt was well prepared for any measures Washington might take, including a potential halt to financial

assistance. Among ordinary Egyptians, the Trump plan provoked out-

Since early in the Gaza war, officials and lawmakers in Egypt have repeatedly warned against any attempts to alter the region's demographics, seeing it as a national security threat.

South Sudan's Kiir replaces two vice-presidents, spy chief

outh Sudan's President Salva Kiir has dismissed his intelligence chief and two of the country's vice-presidents, replacing one of his closest allies with a senior adviser whom analysts believe Kiir may be readying to succeed him.

South Sudan has been formally at peace since a 2018 deal ended a five-year civil war in which hundreds of thousands of people died.

But the country remains in the grip of a humanitarian crisis because of sporadic violence, food insecurity, poor healthcare and extreme weather. In several decrees announced

by newsreaders on the state broadcaster late on Monday. Kiir removed long-serving Vice-President James Wani

Igga and promoted in his place Benjamin Bol Mel, a close adviser seen as having growing influence over decision-making in the government. Bol Mel, a businessman designated on the United States' sanctions list for his links to construction firms accused of money-laundering, will head the economic portfolio of ministries.

"All indicators around Bol Mel show... that Bol is the only power to reckon with within South Sudan," Abraham Kuol Nyuon, Professor of Political Science at the University of Juba, told Reuters.

"It seems to me the president might have a plan for him as somebody who (has) had an interest in trying to promote the interest of the president," he added.

Reuters was not immediately able to seek comment from Bol Mel.

Wani Igga's deputy press secretary said the outgoing vice-president wished all the best to those taking over and continuing with nationbuilding.

Kiir, who is 73, also replaced his National Security Service (NSS) chief, Akec Tong Aleu, with Charles Chiek Mayo, who will serve on an acting basis until a permanent replacement is found.

South Sudan has five vicepresidents, with Kiir's longtime rival and opposition leader Riek Machar serving as first vicepresident.

National elections have been delayed twice as disagreements between Kiir and Machar - who led opposing sides in the civil war - have complicated the implementation of the peace process. Abrupt changes to senior posts have been frequent in recent years.

At least \$53bn needed to rebuild Gaza, UN estimates

ore than \$53bn will be required to rebuild ■Gaza and end the "humanitarian catastrophe" that has gripped the war-ravaged territory, including \$20bn in the first three years alone, the UN said yesterday.

The global body said in a report that a "political and security framework" must also be put in place so that recovery and rebuilding can begin, and a ground-

work can be laid for a political process to quickly end the Israeli occupation "and establish a viable two-State solution." Much of Gaza - including schools, hospitals and other civic infrastructure has been reduced to rubble by a withering Israeli military offensive following an unprecedented Hamas storming of Israel in October 2023.

"The interim assessment offers an early indication of the enormous scale of recovery and reconstruction needs in the Gaza Strip," UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres said in the document, cautioning that it was not a full assessment.

"The report estimates the recovery and reconstruction needs in the short, medium and long term across the Gaza Strip at \$53.142bn. Of these, the nearterm needs in the first three years are estimated to be around \$20.568bn," he added.

In a resolution adopted in December calling for an immediate and unconditional ceasefire in Gaza, the UN General Assembly had asked Guterres to provide an assessment of the territory's needs within two months

Cholera outbreak kills more than 100 in Angola: ministry

cholera outbreak in Angola has killed at least 108 people since the start of the year, the Ahealth ministry said yesterday, with deaths on the rise in the last few days.

The resource-rich African nation has struggled with high poverty rates and poor sanitation despite its oil wealth. There have been 3,147 confirmed cases of the disease since January 7, the health ministry said, nearly half of them in the capital Luanda.

The age range of those affected is between two and 100, it said. At least 48 people have died in Luanda and 43 in

Bengo, a province neighbouring the capital.

Cholera is an acute intestinal infection that spreads through food and water contaminated with the bacterium vibrio cholerae, often from faeces.



UK's migrant care workers face widespread exploitation: survey

any foreign workers in Britain's social care sector have paid thousands of pounds in fraudulent fees to get a job, live in overcrowded housing and earn less than the minimum wage, a survey by trade

union UNISON showed yester-

The survey of more than 3,000 people who arrived on health and care worker visas showed nearly a quarter had paid money to a care provider or a recruitment agency in return for the promise of a job.

Some had paid more than £20,000 (\$24,700) in return for

a job, the survey showed. In one case a single mother sold all her belongings and borrowed from relatives to pay £5,000, only to find no work when she arrived in Britain

Nearly a third of all care workers in England are migrants, many having arrived from countries such as Nigeria, Zimbabwe, India and the Philippines to fill thou-

sands of vacancies after Britain left the European Union and to meet the healthcare demands of an ageing population.

Charities and unions say Britain's post-Brexit system of allowing companies to sponsor workers to receive a visa empowers unscrupulous employers who can use the threat of deportation to abuse workers.

The investigative agency for labour exploitation, the Gangmasters and Labour Abuse Authority, has said cases of modern slavery, debt bondage and financial exploitation are on the rise in the care sector. The government in November set out stronger sanctions to tackle the

These shocking findings

highlight widespread exploitation of migrant care workers," UNISON general secretary Christina McAnea said.

Some workers were effectively being employed as indentured labour, and the system must change, she said.

"This would help prevent exploitation and drive up standards across the care sector."

Dhaka seeks full power supply restoration from Adani plant

angladesh has asked Adani
Power to fully resume supplies from its 1,600-megawatt plant in India, a Bangladesh official said, after more than three months of reduced sales with supplies halved due to low winter demand and payment disputes.

Adani, which signed a 25-year contract under former prime minister Sheikh Hasina in 2017, has been supplying power from its \$2bn plant in India's Jharkhand state. The plant, with two units each of 800 megawatts capacity, sells exclusively to Bangladesh.

The Indian company halved supply to Bangladesh on October 31 due to payment delays as the country battled a foreign exchange shortage. This led to the shutdown of one unit on November 1, resulting in the plant operating at about 42% capacity.

Subsequently, Bangladesh told Adani to keep supplying only half the power.

The state-run Bangladesh Power Development Board (BPDB) said it had been paying \$85mn a month to Adani to clear outstanding dues and has now told the company to resume supply from the second

"As per our requirement today, they have planned to synchronise the second unit, but due to the high vibration, it didn't happen," BPDB chairperson Md. Rezaul Karim told Reuters, referring to some technical problems that stopped the unit from restarting on Monday.

"Right now, we are making a payment of \$85mn per month. We are trying to pay more, and our intention is to reduce the overdue. Now there is no big issue with Adani."

BPDB and Adani officials were due to meet virtually yesterday following another meeting recently to work out various issues between them, said a source with direct knowledge of the matter who did not want to be named as he was not authorised to talk to the media.

An Adani Power spokesperson did not immediately respond to a request for comment. In December, an Adani source said BPDB owed the company about \$900mn, while Karim said at the time the amount was only about \$650mn.

The pricing dispute revolves around how power tariffs are calculated, with the 2017 agreement pricing off an average of two indexes. Adani's power costs Bangladesh about 55% more than the average of all Indian power sold to Dhaka, Reuters has reported.

A Bangladesh court has ordered an examination of the contract with Adani by a committee of experts, with results expected this month. This could potentially lead to contract renegotiations.

France in talks to buy India rocket launcher system

rance is in advanced talks with India to buy a multi-barrel rocket launcher system, a top Indian official said, a potential deal that would be the first time India's second-largest arms supplier buys weapons from New Delhi.

India is the world's biggest arms importer, but has been trying to boost local production to meet its defence requirements and has been steadily raising its defence exports.

The domestically made Pinaka rocket system with a range of up to 90km was demonstrated to a French delegation in India around three months ago and was found to be satisfactory, a second official said, speaking on condition of anonymity.

"France is in active talks for Pinaka," Ummalaneni Raja Babu, the director general of missiles and strategic systems at India's Defence Research and Development Organisation, said on the sidelines of the Aero India aero-

space exhibition in the southern city of Bengaluru.

"A deal has not been reached yet, but the talks are continuing," said Babu.

Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi embarked on a visit to France on Monday to co-chair an artificial intelligence (AI) summit in Paris with French President Emmanuel Macron and both leaders held bilateral talks yesterday.

It was not immediately clear if the rocket system featured in the talks, and India's foreign ministry did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

France's embassy in India did not immediately respond to a request for comment outside of business hours.

France was India's secondlargest arms supplier after Russia between 2019 and 2023, according to the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute.

The Pinaka rocket launcher system, used by the Indian army and deployed in the 1999 war between India and Pakistan, is also being enhanced with longer ranges, Babu said.

Bangladesh govt aims to hold polls by December

Bangladesh is working towards holding general elections by December, the party of former prime minister Khaleda Zia said after some of its officials held a meeting with Muhammad Yunus, the chief adviser to the interim government. The country has been in charge of a caretaker government led by Nobel Peace laureate Yunus since August, when mass protests forced then prime minister Sheikh Hasina to resign and flee to neighbouring India. Khaleda's Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) and rival Hasina's Awami League have governed Bangladesh for most of the past three decades. The BNP expects Yunus to soon announce a roadmap for general elections, its secretary general, Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir, told reporters. "We have once again pressed them on this matter." he said. "He (Yunus) told us that they are working to hold the election by December."

India's southern state of Karnataka has received investment proposals worth nearly Rs10tn (\$115.31bn), a government spokesperson said, as the country tries to bolster its manufacturing sector and generate jobs in a slowing economy.

The proposed investments would focus on areas such as renewable energy, steel, semiconductors and automobiles, the spokesperson said at the 'Invest Karnataka' event yesterday.

To be sure, not all proposals have been confirmed and the government has not provided a timeline for these investments.

The state government aims to implement at least 70% of proposals, up from 40% to 50% af-

ter the event's 2022 edition, the New Indian Express newspaper reported last week, citing a state minister.

Companies that have pledged investments included India's Mahindra and Mahindra and JSW Group, Germany's Bosch, Japan's Toyota Motor and Taiwan-based Foxconn.

Karnataka, which includes the IT hub of Bengaluru, is among the top contributors to India's economy and is a major exporter of software, IT services and manufactured goods.

The investment commitments also come amid New Delhi's push to boost domestic manufacturing and reduce imports as it looks to take advantage of Sino-US tensions that have led companies such as Apple to diversify their manufacturing operations away from China

New Zealand rethinks opposition to deep-sea mining

ew Zealand is considering withdrawing its support for an international ban on deep-sea mining, the country's resources minister said yesterday.

Resources Minister Said yesterday.
Resources Minister Shane Jones said opposition to the fledgling industry was rooted in "shrill" environmental alarmism and "luxury beliefs" that ignored the need for

economic growth.

New Zealand backed a ban on deep-sea mining under former progressive prime minister Jacinda Ardern in 2022, citing the risk of

"irreversible" damage in poorly understood ecosystems.

However Jones, a senior minister in the governing centre-right coalition, said officials were rethinking that stance.

"We're talking about this with our foreign affairs minister," he said.

"We can't deny ourselves the option where critical minerals have an increasingly critical role to play. "We can't afford these luxury

beliefs that have been imposed

upon us."

Companies stand to earn billions of dollars by scraping the ocean floor for polymetallic nodules that are loaded with manganese, cobalt,

copper and nickel - metals used to build batteries for electric vehicles.

But the industry faces sharp criticism from scientists and environmental advocates, who fear new techniques could wreak havoc in poorly understood ecosystems.

"I personally think that seabed mining has become the last green trophy, so people are tossing around the most absurd, untested theories," Jones said.

"And I'm not going to back down

from these shrill voices."

Jones was unruffled by suggestions a pro-mining stance could weaken support among New Zealand's climate-threatened Pacific Island neighbours.

"I understand there's a lot of theatre and posturing that happens when small island nations go to international fora,"

he said.
"We've imposed upon ourselves an ideological corset, which we can no longer afford to wear."

Deep-sea mining is one of the few issues on which Pacific Island nations are divided.

nations are divided.

Nauru and Tonga are pushing for deep-sea mining in international waters, while Palau, Samoa and Fiji

are staunchly opposed.
Canada-based The Metals
Company has been working with
the Nauru government in the hope
of starting mining by 2026.

Harvard-educated Jones recently unveiled a pro-mining agenda differing wildly from the environmentally friendly policies of Ardern's former government.

Under Jones, the isolated island nation will look to dig up everything from critical minerals to coal and iron-rich sands at the bottom of the sea.

New Zealand's desire to scoop up this sand differs from deep-sea mining, which targets polymetallic lumps nestled in much deeper

waters.

"We think that the seabed is a legitimate part of our broader primary sector economy," Jones

"It would seem odd that we were mining minerals in our own oceanic environment but we are telling others not to do it."

New Zealand has long traded on a "clean green" image that highlights its rolling pastures, untouched rainforests and pristine waterways.

Ardern was lauded during her term as a climate hero when she banned offshore gas exploration in

However the current government has already moved to unwind that ban, with Jones occasionally voicing the "drill, baby, drill" mantra favoured by US President

Donald Trump.

Tariffs, trade wars risk stoking world inflation

A Bank of America survey of global fund managers in January showed the re-emergence of global consumer price growth as a key theme for 2025. The World Bank predicted slowing inflation but still warned that it "could prove to be more persistent than expected."

US, European and Japanese inflation expectations have jumped significantly since Donald Trump emerged as favourite to win US

And for the US in particular, analysts are openly starting to reassess inflation prospects.

On Feb 4, Morgan Stanley scrapped its forecast for a Federal Reserve interest rate reduction in March, with its Chief US Economist Michael Gapen saying "on-again-off-again tariff uncertainty should raise the hurdle for Fed cuts."

That followed Chair Jerome Powell's remarks recently that officials aren't in a rush to lower borrowing costs as policymakers pause easing to see further progress on inflation.

The potential for increased tariffs complicates that outlook. The more President Trump threatens tariffs on the US's trading partners, the more the worry of another inflation wave troubles global economists.

Stubborn consumer price growth was bothering much of the world even before he entered the White House.

Multiple economies now face latent inflation pressures, either domestic or external.

In the US, a resilient labour market is keeping the Fed on alert as Trump's policies and threats drive bond yields higher. Elsewhere, dollar strength is haunting emerging markets such as Indonesia.

One thing is clear: The Fed will take its time to assess the impact of Trump's policies.

Across the Atlantic, the extent of any trade response may be key if Trump unleashes tariffs policymakers h downplayed them as a price driver in either direction.

European Central Bank President Christine Lagarde has argued she isn't "overly concerned" about importing inflation and Bank of **England Governor Andrew** Bailey has said tariff effects aren't straightforward to predict.

But consumers and professional forecasters

are less sanguine than policymakers, raising their 2025 inflation outlook in ECB surveys. And a Bloomberg poll showed a majority of economists is now more concerned about price pressures exceeding 2% in the medium term.

Even in Asia, where prices are largely back within target ranges,

South Korea's consumer inflation accelerated in January on the back of higher energy and food prices.

In Japan — where the return of price increases is welcome after decades battling deflation - nominal wages rose at the fastest pace in nearly three decades in December, supporting the Bank of Japan's latest rate hike decision and keeping the bank on track for further tightening steps.

Trump substantially raised tariffs on steel and aluminium imports on Monday to a flat 25% "without exceptions or exemptions." The tariffs will apply to millions of tonnes of steel and aluminium imports from Canada, Brazil, Mexico, South Korea and other countries that had been entering the US duty free under the carve-

But US tariffs are an "evolving story" and it is too early to assess their impact on the world economy, International Monetary Fund Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva said yesterday. The outlook for inflation was hard to predict, she suggested.

While there's still a lot of uncertainty around US tariff levels, their timing and potential retaliation, it's clear that it'll not only pressure prices but also weaken growth globally.

A few weeks ago, the Bank for International Settlements even warned of stagflation, a relatively rare mix of persistent high inflation, weak labour markets and tepid growth.

US inflation showed scant signs of downward momentum at the start of the year, while healthy $\bar{\rm j}{\rm ob}$ growth undergirded the economy, backing the Fed's stance to hold the line on interest rates for now Moreover, proposed policies from the Trump administration risk keeping inflation elevated.

Technofeudalism is war's handmaiden

ne West is on a war footing. The German government is working on an app that helps people locate their nearest bunker. A 32-page pamphlet entitled If Crisis or War Comes was published in Sweden, and a similar one was downloaded countless times in Finland. Venerable newspapers publish wargame scenarios where Russia, with China's backing, invades Norway's arctic islands.

In the European Union, top officials argue that the key to unlocking Europe's chronically low level of investment is its arms industry. US President Donald Trump casually talks about taking over Greenland and the Panama Canal. To top it all off, a storm is gathering over Taiwan, the Philippines, and the South China Sea.

Trump and his political opponents disagree on almost everything. But one thing they do agree on is that America is caught in what Harvard University's Graham Allison calls the Thucydides Trap - the fate of a hegemon confronted by a rising power, China. Meanwhile, the West is running the risk of falling into the Oedipus trap: exacerbating a crisis with actions intended to prevent it - just as Oedipus ended up killing Laius, his father, only because Laius took harsh measures aimed at thwarting the Delphic prophecy that he would be killed by his son. Either of these traps could trigger a catastrophic war.

Meanwhile, we are increasingly dominated by cloud capital - a new form of capital consisting of networked machines running algorithms that we train to know us well enough to alter what we want and then sell it to us outside any actual market. Unlike diesel engines and industrial robots, which are manufactured means of production, cloud capital produces an exorbitant capacity to modify our behaviour, bestowing unprecedented power on its owners - our technofeudal masters. This reinforces the Thucydides and Oedipus traps in four distinct ways.



First, especially when augmented with artificialintelligence capabilities, cloud capital lowers the threshold for deploying weapons of mass, albeit targeted, destruction. It is far cheaper to send a swarm of micro-drones, equipped with AI facial recognition, into urban areas to take out prespecified targets autonomously than it is to deploy heavy bombers. It is also easier for presidents and prime ministers to muster the moral conviction to give the order. That is why the capitalisation of a cloud capital-intensive company like Palantir has surpassed that of a legacy behemoth like Lockheed Martin.

Second, to deliver maximum revenues, the cloud capital powering our social media is optimised to maximise engagement, a goal most easily achieved by getting us heated, angry, and abusive toward one another. The poisoning of public debates that results from this business model erodes the democratic institutions which hitherto had some capacity to restrain our more bellicose politicians and generals.

Third, cloud capital has weakened Europe to the point where it can no longer play the moderating role that it once played during the Cold War. This is because most cloud capital is concentrated in the US and China. As high concentrations of cloud capital have become a prerequisite for substantial economic and political power, Europe has slid into relative irrelevance.

Fourth, in China, cloud capital has created a real challenger to America's near-monopoly of the international payments system, which historically has given US governments the leeway to sanction any country or person they choose. This is far more significant than any animosity within the US caused by the emergence of DeepSeek, the Chinese AI firm whose most recent offering led to losses of \$1tn in US stock markets.

China's chief challenge stems from a deep asymmetry vis-àvis the US that has nothing to do with technology: Wall Street treats Silicon Valley as a potential usurper of its financial revenues, a tussle in which it can count on the support of the Federal Reserve.

In contrast, China's financial sector, central bank, and largest tech firms are working in unison, resulting in a seamless, freeto-use, private-public digital payments system that the West cannot match.

Although it currently resembles a pristine multilane freeway that few outside the country use, the Chinese payments system poses a serious long-term threat to the global monopoly of the dollardenominated payments system and gives the Chinese government and its allies options that alleviate the fear of US sanctions. In a never-ending cycle of negative reinforcement, that newfound confidence fuels America's eagerness to "get tough" on China.

War is in the air more than peace these days. This reflects not only the salience of well-known strategic traps, but also the rise of technofeudal power, which is driving us into them. - Project

The burden of knowledge: A double-edged sword

he famous saying by Islamic scholar Ibn Qayyim, "If you do not know, it is a disaster. But if you know and do nothing, the disaster is even greater," encapsulates a timeless truth about the human condition.

Ignorance can be a formidable challenge, often leading to misjudgments and errors. However, the true catastrophe arises when individuals possess knowledge yet deliberately ignore or misuse it. This principle extends beyond personal ethics, influencing societal norms. leadership, and governance. Knowledge, rather than being a privilege alone, is a responsibility that must be upheld with

In Hamlet, William Shakespeare wrote, "There is nothing either good or bad, but thinking makes it so." This echoes the dilemma of knowledge - what one does with it defines its ultimate impact. Simply knowing the truth is insufficient; wisdom lies in the application of that truth.

Ignorance, in itself, is not a crime. Many people are unaware of laws, ethics, or moral obligations, but they have the opportunity to seek knowledge. ask questions, and educate themselves. As Thomas Gray famously wrote in his poem Ode on a Distant Prospect of Eton College, "Where ignorance is bliss, 'tis folly to be wise." While this phrase is often misinterpreted as an endorsement of ignorance, in reality, it highlights the innocence of unawareness before one encounters life's harsh realities. The real issue arises when

ignorance is wilful - when individuals choose to turn a blind eye to knowledge out of laziness, fear of responsibility, or self-interest. This transforms



ignorance from a temporary gap in understanding into a conscious rejection of truth. In such cases, ignorance is not merely a lack of awareness but a self-inflicted

failure to engage with reality.
If ignorance is a problem, then possessing knowledge without acting upon it is a catastrophe of far greater magnitude. To know what is right and yet ignore it is not just negligence; it is a betrayal of wisdom. This failure can manifest at multiple levels. On a personal level, many individuals recognise their mistakes yet persist in them. Rationalisation, self-deception, or sheer complacency prevent them from making the necessary changes. As T.S. Eliot once wrote, "We do not dare to disturb the universe." The fear of consequences often stops people from taking corrective action, turning knowledge into

an unbearable burden rather than a tool for growth. On a social level, societies crumble when individuals and institutions knowingly tolerate wrongdoing. Silence in the face of injustice erodes trust, allowing corruption to flourish. Edmund Burke's famous words, "The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for good men to do nothing," highlight this exact dilemma. Those who recognise societal problems yet remain passive enable the very injustices they decry.

On a political level, the most dangerous form of neglected knowledge is seen in leadership and governance. Leaders who understand the challenges faced by their people but refuse to act effectively betray their duty. As George Orwell pointed out in 1984, "The further a society drifts

from the truth, the more it will hate those who speak it." When truth is inconvenient, it is often ignored or distorted, leading to crises that could have been prevented.

To overcome the "greater disaster" of neglected knowledge, three fundamental steps must be taken. First, accepting responsibility is essential, as knowledge is not merely an asset but an obligation. Those who are aware of the truth must take ownership of their role in shaping a better world, whether at an individual, societal, or governmental level. Second, applying knowledge in practice is crucial, as true wisdom comes from action, not just awareness. As Leonardo da Vinci once said. "Knowing is not enough; we must apply. Willing is not enough; we must do." Knowledge must be transformed into meaningful change rather than remaining theoretical.

Third, spreading knowledge is key to diminishing ignorance, as insight should not be confined to elite circles but made accessible to all. As Mark Twain famously quipped, "A person who won't read has no advantage over one who can't read." Knowledge is only powerful when it is utilised. shared, and acted upon.

Ibn Qayvim's wisdom remains as relevant today as it was centuries ago: ignorance is a problem, but knowing the truth and failing to act is an even greater disaster. It is a call to action urging individuals to rise above complacency, take responsibility, and ensure that knowledge serves its true purpose.

The challenge is not merely to learn, but to embody that learning in daily life. As Victor Hugo wrote in Les Misérables, "To know is nothing at all; to imagine is everything." Yet, beyond imagination, what truly matters is courage – the courage to act upon knowledge and use it for the

Italy arrests 130 in raid against Sicilian mafia

round 130 people were arrested yesterday in a large-scale sting against Lthe Sicilian mafia in Palermo, indicating that it has remained a significant criminal force despite setbacks in recent

"Cosa Nostra", the mafia syndicate based in and around Palermo, terrorised Italy in the 1980s and 1990s, but has since been overtaken as Europe's most powerful mob by the Calabrian 'Ndrangheta.

The suspects apprehended yesterday

were charged with various crimes, including drug trafficking, attempted murder, extortion, illegal online gambling and illegal possession of firearms, Carabinieri police said in a statement.

Additional arrest warrants were issued for 33 suspects who were already in prison for other crimes.

Investigations revealed that Palermo's mafia families co-ordinate their activities across the city and its province, like they used to in the golden days of Cosa Nostra, especially as regards drug trafficking, po-

They said inner city families had regained authority compared to the years in which they were dominated by a faction from Corleone - a town outside Palermo that was the birthplace of notorious bosses Toto Riina and Bernardo Provenzano.

Modern-day bosses use modern technology to conduct their business, using encrypted mobile phones that are smuggled into prisons to allow jailed bosses to continue exercising their command, investigators said.

Despite being weakened by law enforcement activities, Cosa Nostra continues to attract young people, the Carabinieri said, noting that they documented one instance of a new recruit given "mafia lessons" by an older associate.

The would-be mentor gave the young man "specific instructions, inviting him to take as an example his conduct towards people to be subjected to extortion, and advising him on how to relate with mafia leaders", the police statement said.

Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni, writing on X, hailed yesterday's arrests as inflicting "a very hard blow to Cosa Nostra", and giving a clear signal that "the fight against the mafia has not stopped and will

Within its territory, the Mafia "exercises constant control", police said.

As in decades past, they demand "pizzo", or protection money, from businesses,

and force traders to use their products, often at inflated prices.

In one example, investigators revealed how a clan took control of distributing mussels and other seafood to restaurants in two seaside villages.

While Cosa Nostra bosses these days try to resolve disputes peacefully to avoid attracting attention, weapons were found in yesterday's blitz, police said, while reporting incidents of brutal beatings.

The investigation also revealed a wide network of informants, with a clerk in the Palermo prosecutors office arrested in November last year, accused of passing on

Ex-Trump aide Bannon pleads guilty in US border wall fraud case

onservative firebrand Steve Bannon (pictured), a former adviser to US President Donald Trump, pleaded guilty yesterday to defrauding donors who gave money to a private scheme to build a wall on the US-Mexico border.

Bannon, 71, entered a guilty plea to New York state charges in a Manhattan court in an agreement with prosecutors that

spared him prison time. Bannon was indicted in 2022 for his role in a project called "We Build the Wall", which involved private fundraising of more than \$15mn to help build the southern border barrier championed by

He had been scheduled to go on trial in March, facing five felony counts of money laundering, conspiracy and other charges.

Bannon, one of the masterminds behind Trump's 2016 presidential campaign, also faced federal charges over the border wall scheme but received a pardon at the end of the Republican's first term in the White

House right-wing ideologue pleaded guilty to a single state charge yesterday of involvement in a "scheme to defraud in the first degree" and was given a three-year conditional discharge, which does not involve

jail time or restitution. As part of his sentence, Bannon is barred from serving on a New York nonprofit for three or selling donor data obtained as part of the scheme.

Bannon served nearly four months in federal prison in Connecticut last year after being convicted of contempt of Con-He was sent to jail for defying

a subpoena to testify before the congressional panel investigating the January 6, 2021 attack on



the US Capitol by Trump supporters.

On the day of the Capitol riot, as thousands of Trump supporters overran the seat of Congress to block certification of Democrat Joe Biden's election victory, Bannon spoke by telephone with the then-president.

Congressional investigators had wanted to question Bannon

but he declined to speak to them. Bannon served in the White House during Trump's first term as his chief strategist, but he left after seven months, reportedly due to conflicts with other top

Though he no longer works officially for Trump, he has remained a vocal backer of the Republican president, mainly through his podcast The War

Bannon is one of several Trump associates who have received jail time.

Former Trump economic adviser Peter Navarro also served a four-month prison term last year for defying a congressional subpoena to testify about the events of January 6, 2021.

Others include former Trump legal fixer turned whistleblower Michael Cohen and the chief financial officer of the Trump Organisation, Allen Weisselberg.

Trump was convicted in New York in May of last year of falhush money to an adult entertainment actor.

Trump was also charged with conspiring to overturn the results of the 2020 election and with mishandling classified documents but the cases were dropped after he won November's presidential election.

Trump cannot pardon Bannon on state level charges.

Trump blasts judges, fuelling fear of constitutional clash

S President Donald Trump slammed "highly political judges" yesterday as his new administration veered closer to a constitutional clash with the courts over his plans to radically overhaul the government and amass power in the White House.

With the Republican Party controlling Congress and completely loyal to Trump, the billionaire president has largely ignored the legislature as he carries out his unprecedented policies.

However, he has faced growing pushback from the courts since taking office three weeks ago, with US media outlets reporting 11 orders issued against the administration - five of them on Monday alone - from dozens of federal

As the courts and Trump appeared increasingly to be on a collision course, he lashed out on

Truth Social. "Billions of Dollars of FRAUD, WASTE, AND ABUSE, has already been found in the investigation of our incompetently run Government. Now certain activists and highly political judges want us to slow down, or stop," Trump posted. "Losing this momentum will be very detrimental to finding the TRUTH, which is turning out to be a disaster for those involved in running our Government. Much left to find. No Excuses!!!"

Trump first ran up against the judiciary over an attempt to freeze \$3tn in federal grants and loans, a deferred resignation programme

for government workers, and a plan to transfer transgender in-

mates to men's prisons. He has also clashed with judges over his abolition of birthright citizenship for children born to undocumented immigrants, sending Venezuelan migrants to Guantanamo Bay, funding cuts to the National Institutes of firing of the government's ethics watchdog and placing workers from the US Agency for International Development (USAID) on

Injunctions have been placed on each of these actions.

However, concerns are mounting that Trump could ultimately defy the rulings, prompting a fullblown constitutional crisis.

Trump's harshest critics say that horse has already bolted after a federal judge was forced to upbraid the White House on Monday for failing to comply with his order

to end the federal funding freeze. Vice-President J D Vance has fuelled speculation over a coming clash, claiming in a social media post on Sunday that judges lack authority to "control the executive's legitimate power".

In fact the US constitu federal judges the right to rule on cases involving the president as part of their oversight role of the other branches of government. Vance's comments - which

came after a judge blocked tech billionaire Elon Musk's so-called "Department of Government Efficiency" (DOGE) from accessing Americans' personal data - earned him a rebuke from legal scholars and political opponents.

"If you believe any of the multiple federal courts that have ruled against you so far are exceeding their statutory or Constitutional authority, your recourse is to appeal," Liz Cheney, a former Republican lawmaker and vocal Trump critic, replied. "You don't get to rage-quit the Republic just because you are losing. That's tyr-

The DOGE injunction also came under attack from Musk, who complained of a "corrupt judge protecting corruption" and proposed that 1% of the federal judiciary be fired every year.

In an X post yesterday, Musk claimed that "democracy in America is being destroyed by judicial

coup". However, critics characterise the deluge of criticism from the world's richest man, the US president and the vice-president as a co-ordinated assault on the rule

"This is not just a musing from a dude with some various ideas," tech commentator and veteran Musk watcher Kara Swisher said of the Spacex and Tesla chief executive. "The next step is to hollow out the judiciary and also not follow their rulings, which been against Musk's efforts. This is a very obvious coup, for those not paying attention."

The criticism has not halted the frenetic pace of the White House under Trump, who has signed more than 75 executive orders and other edicts, outpacing recent predecessors.

On Monday he boosted tariffs on steel and aluminium imports, announced a crackdown on paper straws and abolished the minting of pennies.

Pakistan's forcing ministry lieved to be missing, Pakistan's foreign ministry said yesterday. Thirty-seven people survived the accident, according to authori-

The ministry first reported the accident on Monday. It said that 63 Pakistanis had been onboard the vessel and 10 are still missing, according to unconfirmed reports.

"So far 16 dead bodies have been recovered and their Pakistani nationalities established on the basis of their passports," a spokesperson for Pakistan's foreign ministry said in a statement. "There are 37 sur-

vivors, including one in hospital and 33 in police custody? A team from Pakistan's embassy in Tripoli visited the coastal city of Zawiya to meet with local officials and those from Zawiya hospital. "The embassy in Tripoli is in the process of gathering further information and maintaining contact with the local authorities," the

statement added. Each year thousands of Pakistanis pay large sums to traffickers to launch risky and illegal journeys to Europe, where they hope to find work and send funds to support families back home.

Pakistanis are frequently among those drowned on crammed boats which sink on the Mediterranean Sea separating North Africa from Europe - the world's deadliest migrant route.

An official from the Federal Investigation Agency, speaking anonymously to AFP in 2023, estimated Pakistanis attempt 40,000 illegal trips every year.

In June that year the Mediterranean witnessed one of its worst migrant shipwrecks when a rusty and overloaded trawler sank overnight. It was carrying more than 750 people – up to 350 of them Pakistanis according to Islamabad - but only 82 bodies were ever recovered. -

Zelensky ready to swap Kyiv-held land in Russia for Ukrainian territories

resident Volodymyr Zelensky said that he would offer to swap land Ukrainian troops control in Russia's Kursk region in exchange for a return of Ukrainian territories Russia currently occupies if negotiations took place.

"We will swap one territory for another," he said in an interview with Britain's Guardian newspaper published yesterday.

proaches its third anniversary. Ukraine staged a surprise offensive into the Kursk region of western Russia last August and still holds part of the initially captured territory, although its size has dwindled in the course of Russian counter-attacks.

Kyiv officials say the Kursk operation was meant to protect border regions and that captured land could be used as a bargaining chip in any peace negotiations, whose prospects have risen since Donald Trump returned as US president.

Zelensky has repeatedly stressed that any plan to end the war in Ukraine should provide for security guarantees from allies to ensure no future Russian aggression is possible. - Reuters

Hegseth orders US Army to restore name of Fort Bragg

Defence Secretary Pete Hegseth has renamed the Army base Fort Liberty back to its original name of Fort Bragg, according to a Department of Defence statement, undoing a 2023 name change driven by racial justice protests.

The base, among the world's largest military installations, had been renamed Fort Liberty as part of an effort to rechristen bases named for Confederate officers.

The move to shed Confederate names for military bases came in the wake of nationwide protests after the 2020 death of George Floyd, a black man killed by police in Minneapolis, Minnesota. "That's right, Bragg is back!"

Hegseth posted on social media site X after signing the order. "I direct the army to change the name of Fort Liberty North Carolina to Fort Bragg North

President Donald Trump had said during a campaign stop last year in North Carolina that he wanted to change the base's name back to Fort Bragg, according to local media reports.

Congress in 2021 passed legislation forbidding the naming of bases after anyone who voluntarily served or held leadership in the Confederate States of America, the breakaway republic of Southern states that fought against the US in the Civil War in the 19th Century.

Established in 1918, the North Carolina base was originally named for General Braxton Bragg, who served in the Confederate Army during the Civil War. It houses the Airborne and

Special Operations Forces and is home to 57,000 troops, according to its website.

Hegseth sidestepped Congress's provision banning Confederate names by officially renaming Fort Bragg after Private First Class Roland Bragg, who "served with great distinction during World War II", according the memo ordering the name change.

The renaming of Fort Bragg honours all US soldiers who have trained to fight and win US wars, Hegseth wrote in his memo, "and is in keeping with the installation's esteemed and storied history".

The Trump administration has taken aim at other name changes implemented under Democratic presidents, including reverting the name of Denali. America's highest peak, to its former moniker Mt McKinlev.

In 2015, then-president Barack Obama officially recognised the Alaska mountain as Denali, the name used by Alaska Natives for centuries.

"Freezing support for mine and explosive ordnance disposal not only slows down current activities. It will delay and, in the worst case scenario, could reverse the enormous progress that the world, led by the United States, has made to combat these beastly weapons," Raymond Johansen, Norsk Folkehjelp's secretarygeneral, said in the statement.

Trump has unleashed a flurry of executive orders aimed at slashing federal spending, including shutting down the US Agency for International Development (USAID).

Trump said on Sunday that there was "hundreds of millions of dollars of money that's going to places where it shouldn't be going".

Norsk Folkehjelp had employed some 3,200 people and operated in 21 countries, but shut down some operations in January when new US Secretary of State Marco Rubio ordered a freeze on all US aid, except to Israel and Egypt. - AFP
