Amir hosts Iftar banquet for diplomats, MoFA officials

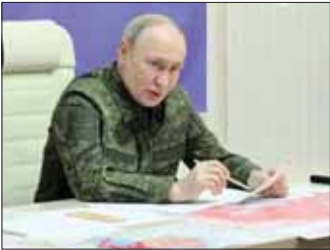

US negotiators head to Moscow for Ukraine ceasefire talks

US President Donald Trump said yesterday that negotiators are headed to Russia "right now" for talks on a possible ceasefire with Ukraine, after Kyiv agreed to a 30-day truce. Trump did not give further details, but the White House later said that his special envoy Steve Witkoff was going to Moscow later this week. "People are going to Russia right now as we speak. And hopefully we can get a ceasefire from Russia," Trump told reporters in the Oval Office during a meeting with Ireland's prime minister. "And if we do, I think that would be 80% of the way to getting this horrible bloodbath finished." Ukraine gave the nod on Tuesday to a US-backed plan for a 30-day ceasefire at talks in Saudi Arabia - although President Volodymyr Zelensky says he still does not trust Russia.

The Kremlin said earlier that it was still waiting for Washington to inform it about the details of the proposal. Trump would not say when he would next speak to his Russian counterpart Vladimir Putin, but added that "I hope he's going to have a ceasefire." "It's up to Russia now," said Trump. "I've gotten some positive messages, but a positive message means nothing. This is a very serious situation, it could start World War Three."

lifa Shaheen al-Marar, Secretary-General of the Executive Committee of the Palestine Liberation Organisation Hussein al-Sheikh, and US President's Envoy to the Middle East Steve Witkoff.

The Arab foreign ministers presented the Gaza reconstruction plan, which was approved at

the Arab Summit held in Cairo on March 4, 2025. They also agreed with the US envoy to continue consultations and co-ordination on this plan as a basis for the reconstruction efforts in the Strip. The Arab ministers emphasised the importance of consolidating the ceasefire in Gaza and the occupied Palestinian territories, stressing the need for genuine efforts to achieve a just and comprehensive peace based on the two-state solution, ensuring the fulfilment of the Palestinian people's aspirations of freedom and independence. The Arab ministers reiterated their commitment to maintaining dialogue to reinforce the ceasefire and to work jointly to establish security, stability, and peace in the region.

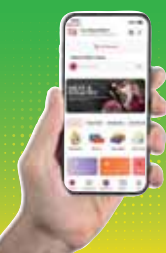

Amir sends cables of congratulations to Mauritius president

Qatar slams systematic, deliberate destruction of food system in Gaza

Qatar has strongly condemned the systematic and deliberate destruction of the food system in the Gaza Strip by the Israeli occupation forces in addition to their use of blockade and starvation policies as a weapon in their total genocide war against the Palestinians.

Qatar called on the international community to take all necessary actions to protect the Palestinian people and ensure accountability for all those responsible for the crimes and grave violations committed against them. This came in a statement delivered by Hessa Essa Rashid al-Khater, third consular affairs researcher at the Department of Arab Affairs of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, during the interactive dialogue with Special Rapporteur on the right to food, within the framework of the fifty-eighth session of the Human Rights Council in Geneva.

Al-Khater noted that challenges continue to hinder the enjoyment of the right to food, including fam-



ine and malnutrition, environmental pollution, loss of biodiversity, and climate change, as well as the volatility of food prices exacerbated by conflicts or crises that have negatively impacted the realisation of this right.

She highlighted Qatar's hosting of the International Conference on Food Justice from a Human Rights Perspective last year, during which

the Doha Declaration on Food Justice was issued.

The declaration called for the establishment of just, healthy, and sustainable food systems based on upholding human dignity, protecting the most vulnerable, adopting ecological agriculture, and establishing fair and stable markets that do not prioritise growth and profit over human rights. **(QNA)**

CRA launches public consultation on draft SCLS offer

The Communications Regulatory Authority (CRA) has launched a public consultation on the Standard Offer for Access to Submarine Cable Landing Stations (SCLS) in Qatar and the related guidelines. This is a second round of consultation building on stakeholders insights and feedback received through the initial consultation on "CRA Reference Offer for Access to Submarine Cable Landing Station International Connectivity Services". Based on industry feedback and concerns, CRA has refined the draft SCLS offer (now referred to

as a Standard Offer for Access) and related guidelines to enhance competition and improve access to international connectivity services across all SCLS. The revised documents include the minimum mandatory requirements for the Standard Offer of Access (SOA) to SCLS to be submitted by the SCLS Owners and the process for developing an Access Agreement between the SCLS Owner and the Other Licensed Service Providers. This consultation is part of CRAs ongoing work to enhance Information and Communication

Technology (ICT) sector regulatory framework aiming at fostering market competition and growth through improved access to international connectivity services across all SCLS. This initiative reflects CRAs commitment to promote a regulatory environment that supports competitiveness, transparency, and efficiency in the telecommunications sector, in line with Qatar National Vision 2030 and the Digital Agenda 2030. CRA invites all stakeholders to submit their feedback on the public consultation by Mar. 23, 2025. **(QNA)**

Cabinet nod for draft on real estate registry

HE the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs, Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim al-Thani, chaired the Cabinet's weekly meeting held yesterday morning.

Following the meeting, HE the Minister of Justice and Minister of State for Cabinet Affairs Ibrahim bin Ali al-Mohannadi issued the following statement:

The Cabinet considered the topics on its agenda, as it approved – in principle – the draft Cabinet resolution to define the administrative units comprising the General Retirement and Social Insurance Authority and specify their areas of specialisation.

This draft, which was prepared in co-ordination with the Civil Services and Government Development Bureau, aims to complete the modernisation and development of the institutional structure of the administrative units responsible for implementing modern social insurance systems in accordance with the Social Security Law and the Military Retirement Law.

The Cabinet also approved a draft decision of the Minister of Finance to determine the remuneration of members of tender and auction committees and secretariats, as well as the regula-

tions for their entitlement and disbursement. The draft decision was prepared in accordance with the Tenders and Auctions Regulation Law.

The Cabinet approved a draft decision by the Minister of Environment and Climate Change to issue a guide to radiation practice in industrial radiography, and for the draft to be posted on the "Sharek" platform for a period of ten days for any comments and feedback in its regard.

The draft decision aims to protect against the dangers of radiation used in industrial radiography across various fields by establishing guidelines and regulations on how to meet national oversight requirements in this field.

The Cabinet approved a draft decision by the Minister of Justice to organise the initial real estate registry, with the draft to be posted on the "Sharek" platform for a period of ten days to gather comments and feedback.

This draft, prepared in co-ordination with the Real Estate Regulatory Authority, comes in implementation of the provisions of Law No 6 of 2014 which regulates real estate development. It aims to provide a legislative framework for recording data on the real estate units delineated on the map and for documenting the rights and legal dispositions that apply to them.

The Cabinet decided to take the necessary measures to ratify

a memorandum of understanding (MoU) for co-operation in the fields of tourism and business events between the governments of Qatar and Sierra Leone. The Cabinet also decided to approve a draft MoU between Qatar's National Planning Council and Saudi Arabia's General Authority for Statistics for co-operation and exchange of expertise in the field of statistics, a draft MoU for co-operation on reforming public administration and enhancing its capabilities in the field of qualifying and developing human resources between the governments of Qatar and Morocco, and a draft MoU between the Qatar Financial Information Unit of Qatar and the Financial Information Unit of Libya regarding co-operation in combating money laundering crimes.

The Cabinet concluded its meeting by reviewing three reports and taking the appropriate decisions in their regard. The reports included the first semi-annual report on the progress made in implementing the National Cyber Security Strategy 2024-2030, a report on the results of the participation of the State of Qatar's delegation, headed by HE the Minister of Labour, in the Global Labour Market Conference, and a report on the results of the participation of Qatar's delegation, headed by HE the Minister of Public Health, in the Arab Health Conference and Exhibition 2025.

QC distributes Ramadan food baskets in Sudan

Field teams from Qatar Charity (QC) in Sudan have begun distributing Ramadan food baskets to orphans, needy families, and people displaced due to the ongoing conflict.

QRCS continues Ramadan Iftar project in Gaza

Furthermore, the MoPH closed four units in private healthcare centres for violating the laws regulating the health sector. Most of the violations involved healthcare practitioners operating beyond the scope of their professional licences.

The MoPH also suspended the professional licence of a doctor for working outside the scope of the licence, in addition to taking other legal actions against the doctor and the private healthcare facility where they were employed.

The MoPH is committed to ensuring the highest standards of quality and safety in healthcare services provided in the country, striving to enhance the quality of healthcare and ensure patient safety. (QNA)

How to improve your relationship with the Qur'an

It is recommended for every believing man and woman to recite the Book of Allah, the Noble Qur'an, often, with due contemplation and understanding. This may be done by using a copy of the Qur'an or from one's memory. Allah - the Most High - Says (what means): "[This is] a blessed Book (the Qur'an) which We have revealed to you, (O Muhammad, sallallaahu 'alaihi wa sallam), that they might reflect upon its verses and that those of understanding would be reminded." [Qur'an 38:29]

Are you one of those people who rarely touch the Qur'an? Or do you read it daily, but don't find it is having the impact on you that it should? Whatever the case may be, these are some simple tips that can help you connect with the Qur'an.

1. Before you touch it, check your heart

The key to really benefiting from the Qur'an is to check your heart first, before you even touch Allah's Book. Ask yourself, honestly, why you are reading it. Is it to just get some information and to let it drift away from you later? Remember that the Prophet Muhammad, sallallaahu 'alaihi wa sallam, was described by his noble wife, 'Aa'ishah, radhiallah 'anha, as a "walking Qur'an": in other words, he didn't just read and recite the Qur'an, he lived it.

2. Before you touch it, do your Wudhoo' (ablution)

Doing your Wudhoo' is good physical and mental preparation to remind you that you are not reading just another book. You are about to interact with Allah, the Most Exalted, so being clean should be a priority when

communicating with Him.

3. Start with reading only five minutes everyday

Too often, we think that we should read the Noble Qur'an for at least one whole hour. If you are not in the habit of reading regularly, this is too much. Start off with just five minutes daily. If you took care of step one, Insha Allah (Allah willing), you will notice that those five minutes will become 10, then half an hour, then an hour, and maybe even more!

4. Make sure that you understand what you have read

Five minutes of reading the Qur'an in Arabic is good, but you need to understand what you are reading. If you are not Arabic, or you don't understand the Arabic language, then make sure you have a good translation of the Qur'an in the language you understand best. Always try to read the translation of what you have read that day.

Regarding those who neglect the Glorious Qur'an by not reading or not understanding it, Allah Almighty Says (what means): "And the Messenger has said, 'O my Lord, indeed my people have taken this Qur'an as [a thing] abandoned.'" [Qur'an: 25: 30]

Allah Almighty informs us about His Prophet and Messenger, Muhammad, sallallaahu 'alaihi wa sallam, that he said: "My Lord my people have abandoned - acting or listening - to the Qur'an" and that is because the idol-worshippers did not pay attention nor listen to the Qur'an, as Allah Says (what means): "And those who disbelieve say, "Do not listen to this Qur'an and speak noisily

during [the recitation of] it that perhaps you will overcome." [Qur'an 41:26]

5. Remember that the Noble Qur'an is far more interactive than a CD

In an age of "interactive" CD-ROMs and computer programs, a number of people think books are passive and boring. But the Qur'an is not like that. Remember that when you read the Glorious Qur'an, you are interacting with Almighty Allah. He Almighty is talking to you, so pay attention.

6. Do not just read, you have to listen too

There are now many ways to listen to audios of the Qur'an, a number of them with translations as well. This is in addition to your daily Qur'an reading, not as a replacement for it.

7. Make Du'aa' (supplication)

Ask Allah, the Most Exalted, to guide you when you read the Qur'an. Your aim is to sincerely, for the love of Allah, interact with Him by reading, understanding and applying His blessed words. Making Du'aa' to

Allah for help and guidance will be your best tool for doing this.

When you are making du'aa', you have a direct connection with Allah Almighty. So when you are saying your du'aa', you shouldn't be distracted, but instead you should be fully concentrated. The Prophet, sallallaahu 'alaihi wa sallam, said: "Make Du'aa' and be assured of it being answered, and know that Allah, the Exalted, does not answer a Du'aa' from a careless heart which is not concentrating." [At-Tirmithi]

Call for correcting the misconceptions of Islam



The Ministry of Endowments (Awqaf) and Islamic Affairs concluded yesterday the 11th Ramadan dialogue programme 'Wa Amenhum mein Khawf' (secure them from fear), at the Imam Muhammad bin Abdul Wahhab Mosque.

The four-day programme brought together a select group of Islamic scholars and thinkers to discuss fundamental issues related to the Muslims' present and future, with a focus on correcting misconceptions.

The closing session addressed ways to counter Islamophobia. It was moderated by Sheikh Moaz al-Qasimi.

Dean of the College of Sharia and Islamic Studies, Qatar University, Dr Ibrahim al-Ansari said there were attempts to reinforce negative stereotypes about the Islamic world through studies,

lectures, and the media, and to block any positive images of Islam in these outlets. Dr al-Ansari emphasised the need to focus on Islamic issues that aim to correct the false image of Islam and investigate the roots and causes of the phenomenon of hatred.

He called for the preparation of joint studies with prestigious Western universities that focus on detailed issues related to Islamophobia, and for the establishment of academic chairs in Western universities to combat Islamophobia.

President of the International Union of Muslim Scholars Dr Ali al-Qaradaghi said Islamophobia has religious, expansionist, economic, social and intellectual roots, citing several verses of the Holy Qur'an discussing the phenomenon.

For his part, Lebanese cleric Dr Bilal Baroudi said Muslim scholars hold the responsibility of restoring Islamic glory by erasing every ignorant interpretation that confuses Islam in the souls of its listeners.

Vice-President of the International Union of Muslim Scholars Dr Issam al-Bashir said that orientalism distorted Islam and played a major role in the growth of Islamophobia.

He slammed the collapse of Western values and its selective approach when dealing with religion, citing rejection and intransigence from the major powers against Muslims when they present their issues to the UN and demanded they be addressed in accordance with the UN laws and regulations. (QNA)

QDA, Awqaf launch 'Safe fasting with diabetes' programme

The Qatar Diabetes Association (QDA), in collaboration with the Ministry of Endowments (Awqaf) and Islamic Affairs, launched the "Safe fasting with diabetes" programme, which aims to raise worshippers' awareness about how individuals with diabetes should fast safely during Ramadan.

The programme featured educational sessions after Taraweeh prayers at several mosques

statewide, namely Hamad bin Jassim bin Jaber Al-Thani Mosque in the Pearl, Hamad Al Manaa Mosque in Lusail, Nasser bin Abdullah Al Musaid Mosque in Al Khor, Al Saad Mosque in Abu Hamour and Al-Mujadilah Center and Mosque for Women and Al Manaratein Mosque in Education City, where professional medical tips were provided to patients, along with free-of-charge blood sugar level testing.

Over 900 individuals from both genders benefited from this initiative, underscoring the community's interest in increasing the awareness of managing diabetes complications during Ramadan.

plans for mosque maintenance and imam accommodations. It also oversees the design, construction, and renovation of mosques and imam residences financed by endowments, ensuring adherence to technical and architectural standards, while maintaining a compre-

hensive database of all mosques and staff. The ministry's website offers a unique feature allowing users to locate mosques geographically using precise GPS-based maps, facilitating easy access to mosque locations in cities across Qatar. (QNA)

Ban on fishing nets at certain sites

However, such ban is not applicable on the entities or individuals authorised or licensed to practice fishing for the purpose of scientific research or studies.

Significant efforts being made in Qatar to reduce spread of glaucoma

In Qatar, 1.7% of the population is affected by glaucoma, with approximately 1,000 new cases recorded annually, noted a physician from Primary Health Care Corporation (PHCC).

Globally, glaucoma is the second leading cause of blindness after cataracts.

Dr Tawfik Dhaiban, consultant ophthalmologist at Al Thumama Health Centre PHCC, noted that glaucoma is the leading cause of blindness in Qatar, and the most at-risk groups are individuals over the age of 40 and those with a family history of the disease. Glaucoma is one of the leading causes of blindness worldwide, particularly among individuals over the age of 60.

Every year, the world observes World Glaucoma Week from March 9 to 15 to raise awareness about eye diseases that cause blindness, particularly glaucoma.

Health institutions in Qatar actively participate in this awareness week to educate the public, as glaucoma is the primary cause of blindness among residents over the age of 60.

Glaucoma, also known as "blue water", is an eye disease that damages the optic nerve, often due to increased intraocular pressure. If left untreated, it can lead to gradual vision loss and even complete blindness.

According to the World Health

Organisation, an estimated 80mn people worldwide suffer from glaucoma, and this number is expected to rise to 111mn by 2040. Glaucoma accounts for around 10% of total blindness cases worldwide, and in certain regions, such as Africa, this percentage is even higher due to limited awareness and access to medical care.

In Qatar, significant efforts are being made to reduce the spread of glaucoma through initiatives led by the Ministry of Public Health, Hamad Medical Corporation, and PHCC. These efforts include routine eye screenings, ongoing awareness campaigns via lectures, TV interviews, and educational brochures, and establishing specialised glaucoma clinics in various health centres.

Dr Dhaiban explained that several factors contribute to the development of glaucoma, including: high intraocular pressure; family history of glaucoma; ageing; chronic diseases such as diabetes and high blood pressure; eye injuries and certain medications.

While glaucoma cannot be cured, treatments are available to reduce intraocular pressure and prevent further damage to the optic nerve. Treatment options include: eye drops; oral medications; laser therapy and surgical intervention.

MoPH provides all glaucoma treatments free of charge, including eye drops, laser treatments, and surgeries, ensuring the well-being of both citizens and residents.

To reduce the risk of glaucoma, Dr Dhaiban recommends regular eye check-ups, especially for individuals over 40 or those with risk factors; managing chronic diseases such as diabetes and hypertension; protecting the eyes by wearing protective eyewear during high-risk activities and recognising symptoms: such as loss of peripheral vision or seeing halos around lights.

Glaucoma is often called the "silent thief of sight" because it may not cause noticeable symptoms in its early stages. Therefore, early detection and regular eye exams are crucial to preserving vision.

Europe faces stark choices over Russia asset seizure

Growing challenges to the euro’s status as a reserve currency in a fast-changing global economy are, for now, staying the hand of European capitals as they weigh up the repercussions of a potential seizure of frozen Russian assets.

Nevertheless, Europe faces an increasingly urgent need to help bankroll Ukraine’s survival as President Donald Trump looks to pull the plug on US support and instead bargain with Russia’s Vladimir Putin.

That throws a spotlight on the roughly \$300bn of Russian central bank assets frozen by the West after Putin ordered his troops into Ukraine three years ago, the bulk of which is held in Europe – mainly as government bonds, the profits from which are used to guarantee loans to Ukraine.

While seizing those assets outright may be very tempting, such actions have a long and legally fraught history, and could scare off other central banks looking to park assets in Europe.

An early example of such action cited by European economists in research last year was the Soviet confiscation of gold shipped to Moscow by the National Bank of Romania back in 1918. The wars of the 20th century yielded dozens more examples.

But European officials who pride themselves on the region’s respect for the rule of law are fighting shy of any breach of the legally enshrined immunity of sovereign assets.

“This is not for the European Central Bank to debate, but I would certainly submit that the international law basis on which any decision is made will matter as far as other investors are concerned,” ECB President Christine Lagarde said last week.

The final decision rests not with the ECB but its political masters in Berlin, Paris and the other 18 capitals of the euro countries. But they will not take Lagarde’s argument lightly.

Germany, France and Belgium have restated their opposition

“No-one has any interest in doing things that would weaken our system now, which is also being widely attacked elsewhere via trade, tariff, customs policies,” French Defence Minister Sebastien Lecornu said last week of threats by Trump to impose hefty new levies on European exports.

Europe has long had to accept that the euro is unlikely to

challenge the dominance of the dollar as a reserve currency – briefly an aspiration in the heady days after its 1999 birth.

In fact since 2010, the share of global currency reserves held in the euro has dropped from 25.8% at current exchange rates to 20% as other currencies gain traction. Even the dollar has slipped slightly, while still accounting for 58.4%.

In a report last year on the euro’s international standing, Lagarde cited challenges ranging from the emergence of other units as trade-invoicing currencies through to renewed interest in gold as a reserve asset in troubled times.

Some, however, question the rationale of even seeking to position the euro as a major reserve currency given the weak points in its construction, already exposed in debt crises 15 years ago.

“If we assume that this is a political ambition, then indeed the euro is handicapped by the absence of capital markets union, the lack of a euro safe asset and the lack of fully fledged banking union,” said Hans Geeroms, a professor at the College of Europe and a visiting fellow at the EU think tank Bruegel.

Those were among the failings identified by former ECB chief Mario Draghi in a report last year on how Europe can avoid the “slow agony” of an economy falling further behind US and Asian rivals. Yet scant progress has been made on them even now.

But if such fragilities help explain why Europe is wary of anything which could weaken the credibility of its currency, wider geopolitical considerations are closing in.

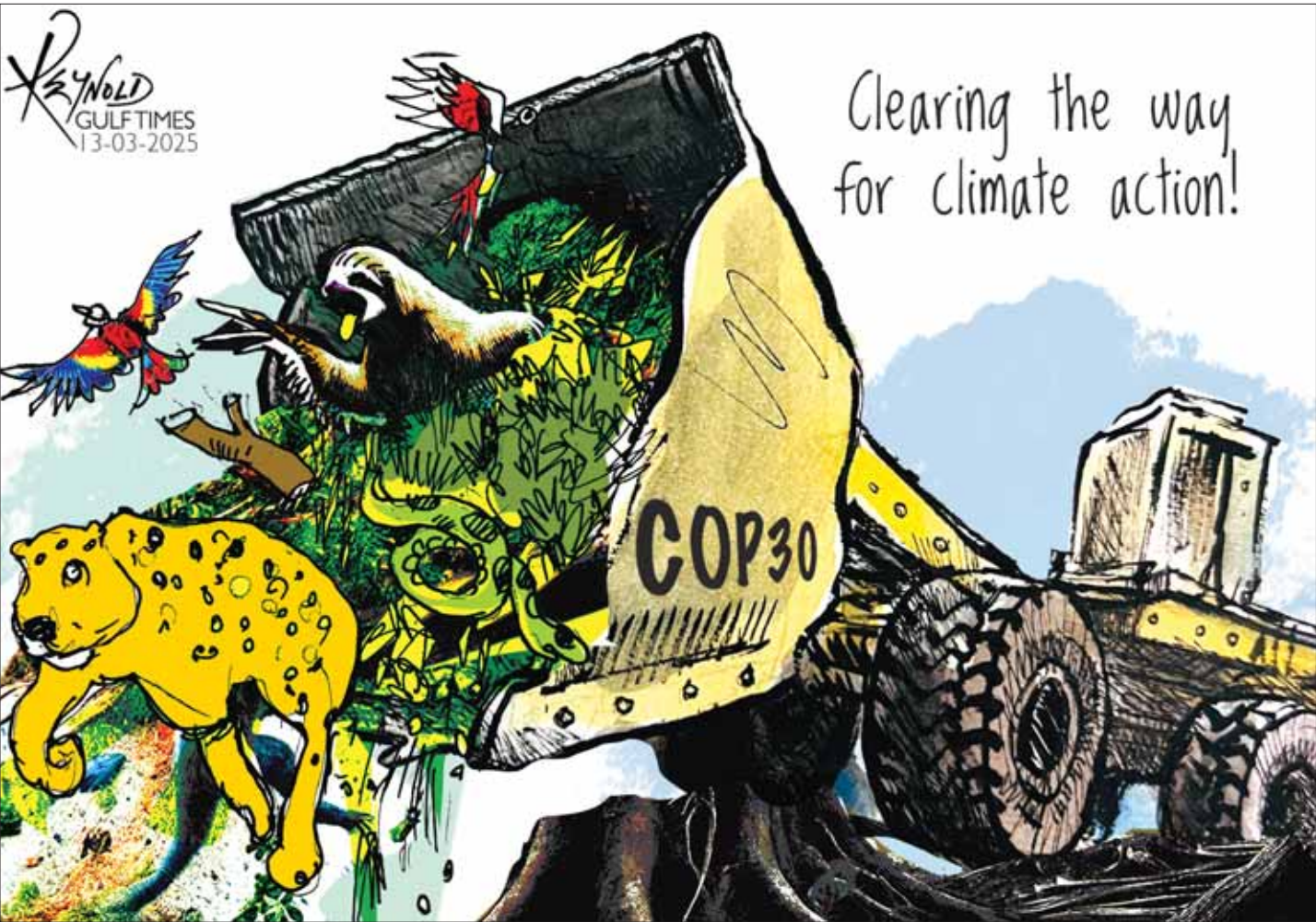
Participants at Thursday’s summit on boosting European defence spending said no decisions on Russian asset seizures were taken in the talks, with one EU diplomat confirming that Germany, France and Belgium – home to the Euroclear securities depository where many of the assets are parked – had restated their opposition.

However Mitu Gulati, an expert on sovereign debt law at the University of Virginia, said Trump’s reversal of US policy on Ukraine had shocked Europeans into “looking to do the things they weren’t willing to do six months ago.

“The same people that said we are not going to do (full seizure) are calling now to say we are interested,” said Gulati, who declined to elaborate on which countries he had spoken to.

One euro zone central banker who requested anonymity agreed the political pressure to consider confiscation was mounting.

“The ECB’s advice won’t change,” the banker said. “But this may not sway politicians. The bill for Ukraine has just gone up a lot, and this makes this money so much more attractive.” – Reuters



Tesla’s stock defied gravity for years. Is Musk’s EV party over?

Tesla’s stock has dropped by nearly half in three months. Even so, investors are still debating whether Elon Musk’s electric-vehicle maker remains overpriced.

The company’s market capitalisation has dropped 45% since hitting an all-time high of \$1.5tn on December 17, erasing most of the gains the stock made after CEO Musk helped finance the election victory of US President Donald Trump.

And yet Tesla continues to fetch a valuation far above those of the world’s biggest automotive and technology firms, judging by standard financial metrics. That’s because most investors and analysts have bought Musk’s pitch that the world’s most-valuable automaker isn’t really a car company at all, but rather an artificial-intelligence pioneer that will soon unleash a revolution in robotaxis and humanoid robots.

Tesla’s electric-vehicle business accounts for almost all of its revenue but less than a quarter of its stock-market value, according to a Reuters review of more than a dozen analyses by banks and investment firms. The bulk of its worth rests on hopes for autonomous vehicles Tesla hasn’t yet delivered, despite Musk’s promises in every year since 2016 that driverless Teslas would arrive no later than the following year.

The stock’s decline since December stems from falling vehicle sales and profits; protests of Musk’s political activity, including his mass firings of US government workers as a senior Trump adviser; and investor worries that politics are distracting the world’s richest man from tending to his cash cow. Still, Tesla’s market capitalisation remains up about \$65bn since the election – an amount higher than the entire value of General Motors.

After this article was published on Monday, Tesla shares fell by more than 15%, slicing off more than \$125bn in market value, after UBS cut its forecast for the automaker’s first-quarter deliveries. The decline came in tandem with a broader market selloff on worries about tariffs and recession fears, with the Nasdaq losing 4% and the S&P 500 dropping 2.7%.

Tesla’s total worth of \$845bn as of Friday’s close still tops the next nine most-valuable major automakers combined, which collectively sold about 44mn cars last year, compared to Tesla’s 1.8mn.

Investors have long bet on Musk’s visions of Tesla’s tomorrow rather than its profits today. But the widening gap between its real-world performance and analysts’ earnings estimates for unborn products has prompted some to warn of irrational exuberance.

“For how much longer can the stock remain divorced from the fundamentals?” JP Morgan analyst Ryan Brinkman wrote in January, after Tesla reported poor earnings and its first-ever annual vehicle-sales decline. Tesla and Musk did not respond to requests for comment. In July, Musk said investors who don’t believe Tesla would “solve vehicle autonomy” should “sell their Tesla stock.”

Tesla’s previous peak value of more than \$1.2tn came in 2021, in response to concrete achievements. Soaring sales of its ground-breaking Model 3 and Model Y had proved that EVs could sell profitably in mass volumes. Musk vowed then that Tesla would produce even cheaper EVs and sell 20mn vehicles annually by 2030, nearly double what the world’s largest automaker, Toyota, sells now.

Musk, however, shifted from the mass-volume goal last year. In April, Reuters reported Tesla had killed a long-awaited, all-new \$25,000 “Model 2” that investors had counted on to drive growth. Since then, Musk has pitched investors on Tesla’s robotaxi focus.

The pivot was persuasive: Tesla shares jumped 71% from last year’s low in April through the November election, even as its EV sales stalled and profits fell.

Then the stock nearly doubled in the weeks after Trump’s election. Musk spent more than \$250mn supporting Trump and now serves as his top advisor on slashing government staff and regulations.

Musk’s political clout has convinced bullish analysts that Trump will clear regulatory roadblocks to deploying a vast fleet of Tesla robotaxis. Tesla, however, already faces little oversight from many US states, which control most autonomous-vehicle regulation. Texas, where Musk promises to launch fare-collecting robotaxis by June, has barred cities from regulating them.

“There’s absolutely nothing stopping him from releasing this self-driving technology right now,” said Gordon Johnson, chief executive of investment-advisory firm GLJ Research, which recommends shorting Tesla’s stock. The tech isn’t road-ready, Johnson argues: “If he released it tomorrow, the jig would be up. These things would be wrecking across America.”

Tesla has faced lawsuits and federal investigations into accidents, including fatalities, involving the driver-assistance systems it has marketed as Autopilot and Full Self-Driving. The company warns consumers the systems don’t make its cars autonomous and require drivers to pay strict attention. Musk has long said Tesla’s technology will soon be safer than a human driver.

The automaker’s core EV business is struggling. The only vehicle Tesla has launched since the 2020 Model Y is the Cybertruck. The triangular pickup had sales of 38,965

units last year, Cox Automotive estimates, well below the 250,000 that Musk initially predicted Tesla would produce by 2025. Tesla has also cut prices on the now-ageing models 3 and Y amid slowing electric-vehicle demand globally and rising competition, especially in China, where EVs start below \$10,000. New data also show sharp Tesla-sales declines this year in European markets following Musk’s embrace of far-right political movements there.

Tesla now faces headwinds from the president Musk helped elect. Trump, a frequent EV critic, has called for scrapping EV subsidies and policies that have added billions of dollars to Tesla’s bottom line. Musk has dismissed the impact on Tesla of losing subsidies, saying rivals would suffer more.

When Tesla reported a 20% drop in annual operating profit in January, analysts on the earnings call asked no questions about Tesla’s financials or falling EV sales. They focused instead on Musk’s promises of “autonomous ride-hailing” in Austin, Texas, by June and a wider driverless-vehicle launch by year-end. Tesla shares rose 3% the next day.

Tesla still trades at huge premiums, as measured by forward price-to-earnings ratios. The measure is used by investors to judge whether stocks are fairly valued. A high ratio suggests shares might be overpriced.

Tesla’s forward PE ratio is more than nine times the average of the next 25 most-valuable automakers. It’s quadruple that of BYD, the Chinese automaker that passed Tesla last year as the world’s top EV seller. Unlike Tesla, BYD also has a booming business in gas-electric hybrids, driving total 2024 sales to about 4.2mn units, more than double Tesla’s deliveries. Yet BYD’s market capitalisation is less than a sixth of Tesla’s.

Tesla’s forward PE ratio also is more than double or triple those of tech giants Nvidia, Apple, Meta Platforms, Alphabet, Amazon.com and Microsoft – the other six high-flying stocks, along with Tesla, known as the Magnificent Seven.

Bulls discount standard financial metrics for judging Tesla’s potential, arguing Musk is singularly capable of leading a transportation revolution. He has said robotaxis and robots will make Tesla the “most valuable company in the world by far.”

Brian Mulberry, client-portfolio manager at Tesla investor Zacks Investment Management, said

Musk “always pulls off the technology,” despite long-running concerns about his “mad-scientist personality.”

Most analyst models reviewed by Reuters remain bullish.

Such models typically justify Tesla’s market value by breaking it into several categories: Its auto business, including services such as EV charging (now 90% of revenue); its energy-generation and storage business (10% of revenue); and three embryonic businesses: robotaxis; licensing or subscriptions for self-driving technology; and Optimus humanoid robots. Three such models in January rated EV sales as a relatively minor factor in Tesla’s expected growth.

Truist Securities attributed just 9% of Tesla’s value to car sales, 21% to driverless-tech services, 17% to robotaxis and 34% to robots.

Bank of America’s model attributes about half of Tesla’s value to robotaxis and 28% to self-driving software subscriptions.

Morgan Stanley attributes 21% to robotaxis and 39% to subscriptions for autonomous-tech and other services.

Tesla investor Ark Investment Management projects the stock will hit \$2,600 by 2029, with robotaxis accounting for 88% of the company’s value. Ark forecasts Tesla could produce millions of robotaxis by then, generating about \$760bn in annual revenue. That would be more than Walmart, the world’s largest company by revenue.

Tasha Keeney, Ark’s director of investment analysis and institutional strategies, said she believes Tesla will achieve such growth by slashing the cost-per-mile of ride-hailing, making human drivers obsolete.

“It’s cheaper than driving your personal car,” she said. “Maybe people will stop even driving.”

Trump could potentially clear the path for driverless cars with no steering wheels or pedals because the federal government regulates the safety of vehicle designs. Musk last October unveiled a concept car with such a configuration, the two-door Cybercab, saying it would go into production in 2026.

But individual states govern autonomous-vehicle travel on public roads, limiting Trump’s influence. Some states, including Texas, have few rules. Tesla’s largest US market, California, requires extensive driverless testing under state oversight before granting robotaxi permits.

A Trump move to loosen robotaxi regulation could benefit all competitors, not just Tesla. The tiny US robotaxi industry, for now, is dominated by Alphabet’s Waymo, which operates hundreds of driverless taxis in cities including Los Angeles and Phoenix.

Waymo and most other autonomous-tech developers seek to ensure safety with many overlapping technologies, including artificial intelligence, radar and lidar. Tesla aims to develop much cheaper robotaxis by relying solely on cameras and AI.

Some investors doubt Tesla has found a unique path to cut-rate robotaxis. Mark Spiegel, an investment manager at Staphyl Capital Partners, is shorting Tesla’s stock, an investment that pays off if shares fall. — Reuters
