The Qatar Central Bank (QCB) has decided to "maintain" the current interest rates for deposits, lending and repurchases (repo) based on an "assessment" of the country's current monetary policies. In a message posted on X last night, the central bank said it is maintaining the deposit rate (QCBDR) at 4.60%, lending rate (QCBLR) 5.10% and repo rate (QCBRR) 4.85%

Israel massacres 59 in Gaza

escuers in the Gaza Strip yesterday said Israeli bom-bardment killed 59 people – 48 of them in Gaza City.

"Civil defence crews, paramedics and volunteers transported at least 33 martyrs and more than 80 injured, about half of them children and some women, as a result of the Israeli air strike" in the Al-Rimal neighbourhood of Gaza City, spokesman Mahmud

The strike is one of the deadliest since the restart of Israel's offensive on Gaza after a twomonth ceasefire in the Palestinian territory collapsed on March 18.

Bassal earlier reported 15 dead in strikes on the Tuffah district east of Gaza City and 11 killed elsewhere in the territory.

One strike hit a house in the southern city of Khan Younis, kill-

ing eight Al-Qidra family members and wounding 12, he said. The dead were aged between

two and 54, he added. footage from Younis's Nasser Hospital showed wounded children crying on hospital beds while bodies covered in blankets arrived in ambulances.

Qatar, Egypt united in Gaza mediation efforts

atar and the Arab Republic of Egypt have reaffirmed that their mediation efforts in the Gaza Strip remain ongoing, consistent, and grounded in a unified vision aimed at ending the unprecedented humanitarian crisis and alleviating the suffering of civilians by fostering the necessary conditions for achieving a comprehensive ceasefire.

In a joint statement, the two countries emphasised that attempts to sow discord among brotherly nations – whether through the casting of doubt, distortion, or media escalation - will not succeed, nor will they deter the two nations from continuing their joint efforts to end the war and the resulting humanitarian catastrophe.

Qatar and Egypt reiterate that they will not be drawn into any internal dynamics or secondary agendas that do not serve the interests of the brotherly Palestinian people. Both countries reaffirm their unwavering commitment to a clear framework focused on alleviating suffering, promoting deescalation, and working toward a lasting resolution.

Qatar and Egypt further affirm that they are closely co-ordinating with the US to reach an agreement that will bring an end to the humanitarian tragedy and ensure the protection of civilians. (QNA)

UN experts warn of annihilation in Gaza

N experts demanded action yesterday to avert the "annihilation" of Palestinians in Gaza, as rescuers said Israeli strikes across the territory killed dozens of people.

A planned expanded offensive revealed by the Israeli military has drawn international condemnation, after UN agencies previously warned of humanitarian catastrophe in the Palestinian territory already devastated by 19 months of war.

More than 20 independent

United Nations experts said the world faced a "stark decision" to "remain passive and witness the slaughter of innocents or take part in crafting a just resolution".

The experts implored the international community to avert the "moral abyss we are descending into".

Israel's broader offensive, approved by the government amid a two-month aid blockade on Gaza, would include displacing "most" of its residents, the military has said.

France's President Emmanuel Macron yesterday called the situation in Gaza "the most critical

we have ever seen". Spain's Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez said Madrid would present a draft resolution at the UN General Assembly aimed at "proposing urgent measures to stop the killing of innocent civilians and ensure humanitarian aid" in Gaza.

British Prime Minister Keir Starmer told parliament the situation in Gaza and the occupied West Bank was "increasingly intolerable".

Palestinian resistance group Hamas yesterday reiterated its call for a "comprehensive" agreement to end the war.

Israel demands the return of all hostages and the group's disarmament, which it has rejected as a "red line".

Qatar urges India, Pakistan to solve crisis through talks

Qatar is following with great concern the ongoing escalation between the Republic of India and the Islamic Republic of Pakistan. In a statement issued yesterday by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Qatar once again called on both countries to exercise the utmost restraint, prioritise wisdom, uphold the principles of good neighbourliness, and resolve the crisis through diplomatic

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs stressed the urgent need to maintain open lines of communication between India and Pakistan to defuse tensions and address outstanding issues through constructive dialogue that ultimately leads to comprehensive. consensual, and sustainable solutions. The State of Oatar also reaffirmed its full support for all regional and international efforts aimed at promoting security, peace, and stability in the region. (QNA)







DI holds conference on demography impacts on Mena labour markets

QNA Doha

oha Institute for Graduate Studies (DI) launched yesterday a conference on the impacts of demography on labour markets in the Middle East and North Africa (Mena). International researchers and experts on economics and human development will be engaged in extensive debates in the event held by the School of Economics, Administration, and Public Policy (SEAPP).

The opening session delved into the social and economic obstacles facing women in the regional labour market, leading to low female employment rates in the Mena region.

SEAPP Dean Dr Ayhab Saad emphasised the importance of exploring the deep links between demographic shifts and labour market developments in the region, emphasising the urgent need for innovative policies that respond to



contemporary economic and social challenges.

The papers submitted on the first day covered several topics, including the impact of the Green Dam Afforestation Program on the labour market in Algeria; inter-

generational labour market transformations in the region under the influence of climate shocks; the impact of the closure of displacement camps in Iraq on population welfare, migration and its impact on employment in developing countries, particularly the case of Syrian refugees in Lebanon.

Other sessions also addressed the impact of unpaid work on labour markets in Jordan and Palestine, women's economic participation and the impact of the minimum wage rise on infant health in Turkiye.

health in Turkiye.

Today, there will be debates on the impact of demographic shifts on stunting among children in Tunisia, unequal educational opportunities in Lebanon, and shifting reproductive decisions across generations in Egypt. A study of the impact of family law reforms in Morocco on women's labour market participation will also be examined.

The conference is witnessing a significant turnout of academics, researchers, and policymakers from various countries in the region and around the world, reflecting the momentum that demographics and the labour market enjoy as two pivotal issues in sustainable development.



Cabinet acclaims launch of national statistics strategy

E the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim al-Thani chaired the Cabinet's weekly meeting held yesterday at the Amiri Diwan.

Following the meeting, HE the Minister of Justice and Minister of State for Cabinet Affairs Ibrahim bin Ali al-Mohannadi stated the following: At the outset of the meeting, the Cabinet hailed the national data and statistics strategy that was launched under the sponsorship of HE the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs and the President of the National Planning Council (NPC), Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim al-Thani.

Inaugurated by HE the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of State for Defence Affairs and Vice-President of NPC Sheikh Saud bin Abdulrahman bin Hassan al-Thani, the strategy is based

on a three-pronged approach, mainly: achieving the highest level of data and statistical reliability through the National Statistics Center, building an integrated and interconnected national data system, and utilising data technology, big data, and artificial intelligence (AI) in operations.

Thereafter, the Cabinet scrutinised the items on the agenda and approved a draft legislation issuing the traffic law and referred it to the Shura Council. The preparation of the draft legislation is part of the Ministry of Interior's strategy, which includes among its objectives the regulation and development of traffic movement, as well as enhancing traffic security and safety.

The draft legislation also takes into account developments in the nation's infrastructure, road usage, automotive technology, and the strengthening of mechanisms and methods for detecting traffic violations in a way that serves the public interest. In addition, the Cabinet approved its draft decision amending some provisions of Decision No 4 of 2020, to establish the Permanent Committee for Addiction Treatment Affairs.

The draft decision aims to reorganise the committee in alignment with the administrative updates in the country, bolstering its effectiveness and enabling it to better achieve its objectives.

The Cabinet decided to approve the draft of the Core Contribution Agreement for Unrestricted Financial Resources (2025-2026) between the Qatar Fund for Development and the UN High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR), and the draft memorandums of understanding on co-operation and exchange of news between Qatar News Agency (QNA), Tunis Afrique Presse (TAP), Vietnam News Agency (VNA), and Guinea-Bissau News Agency (ANG).

The Cabinet wrapped up its meeting by reviewing the annual report of the Standing Committee for Rescue, Relief, and Humanitarian Aid in Afflicted Areas in Brotherly and Friendly Countries, and the report on the outcomes of the participation of Qatar's delegation, chaired by HE the Minister of Commerce and Industry, in the opening ceremony of Qatar's pavilion at the international

"By combining evidence-based guidelines with compassionate care, HMC continues to set the benchmark for thyroid cancer treatment in the region," Dr Rohani concluded. (QNA)

NHRC discusses human rights co-operation with Australian officials

QNA Canberra

E the National Human Rights Committee (NHRC) Vice-Chairperson Dr Mohammed bin Saif al-Kuwari has discussed further human rights co-operation with Australian officials in Sydney. The talks with Australian Human Rights Commission (AHRC) President Hugh de Krester, Senior Assistant Ombudsman NSO (Commonwealth Ombudsman) Kate Anderson, and Director of the Asia-Pacific Forum of National Human Rights Institutions (APF) Kieren Fitzpatrick explored potentials for co-operation and expertise-sharing to serve and enhance both sides' common

In this sphere, a memorandum of co-operation (MoC) was inked between the NHRC and APF to further collaborate on information, legislation, and publications that reflect the nature of their work and competencies, as well as the principles guiding

their performance. They will also hold workshops and consultative meetings and interactive dialogues.

Under the deal members of both

Under the deal, members of both parties will engage in mutual conferences, seminars, and cultural activities related to the promotion and protection of human rights, and to establish joint research projects and training programmes to disseminate a culture of human rights and boost capacity building. There will also be a possibility of creating an e-platform for the exchange of opinions, information, and experiences.

During his meeting with Fitzpatrick, HE al-Kuwari emphasised the importance of co-operation with Australia on human rights and all related aspects, and the development of a framework for co-operation in the field of strengthening and building capacity with relevant authorities in this regard.

He highlighted the roles played by Qatar and Australia in maintaining international peace and security, and in mediating to resolve disputes through peaceful means. He commended the two countries' roles in promoting dialogue among civilizations, tolerance, and coexistence among peoples.

The talks with Hugh de Krester culminated in the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding expanding co-operation, exchanging official visits, and inviting guests to major events they organise, as well as enhancing joint action in all areas of human rights. The two sides agreed that ioint co-operation would include the exchange of expertise in protecting individual rights, developing educational programmes, and monitoring human rights regionally and globally. They would also organise joint events to raise awareness of human rights, exchange progress reports, and support legal initiatives that promote human rights in both countries.

HE al-Kuwari said the meeting discussed collaboration to organise joint training programmes with the aim of enhancing institutional capabilities and the ability to address human rights issues from a legal and social perspective. He added that this co-operation

could include training staff on best practices for handling complaints and resolving disputes. The two parties could also co-operate in overseeing international human rights commitments, work together to enhance the Arab region's participation in international forums, exchange experiences on how to effectively implement international human rights agreements, and co-ordinate the submission of joint reports to international bodies.

At the conclusion of the meeting. al-Kuwari invited de Krester to participate in the international conference on artificial intelligence and human rights, which the NHRC will organise on May 27 and 28. In another context, during his meeting with Anderson, HE al-Kuwari provided an explanation of NHRC's national, regional, and international efforts, highlighting the most significant developments and updates witnessed in the State of Qatar in the field of human rights. The two sides agreed to co-operate, particularly with regard to receiving complaints and protecting individual rights.

Expert physicist, Najla al-Muhannadi said the platform provides more than 60 services, covering all stages of the licensing process, from submitting the application to issuing and printing the license.

She pointed out that the sys-

tem is characterised by ease of use and fast performance, with the ability to track applications in real-time.

Al-Muhannadi added that the MECC has provided comprehensive training to its employees and those of the companies and institutions benefiting from the system, which helped enhance user readiness and to achieve high satisfaction among the initial users who participated in the user experience trials.

Qatar has been selected this year by the WHO to showcase its national campaign as an example country during the recent global WHHD webinar. The topic of the presentation is: Qatar's Strategy for WHHD: From Awareness to Action, Inspiring Cultural Change.

This week-long campaign will combine education, engagement, and innovation to reinforce hand hygiene practices across all levels of care. Participating institutions have hosted a variety of activities, including staff education sessions, creative competitions

and public awareness booths. Moreover, awareness sessions on hand hygiene were organised for school-aged children at all levels in co-operation with the Health Promotion Department at the MoPH. As part of national co-ordination, the IPC and AMR team will conduct site visits to government, semi-government and private healthcare facilities to support and enhance their local celebration activities.

Additionally, the MoPH organised a Hand Hygiene Compliance Training Workshop, bringing together more than 100 IPC professionals in the field of infection prevention and control from across the healthcare sectors.

MoPH enhances vaccine access across Qatar

The Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) announced yesterday that the number of vaccines included in Qatar's national immunisation schedule has risen to 15, contributing to the prevention of 17 diseases and their complications.

An MoPH statement said the vaccines, available free of charge in all Hamad Medical Corporation's primary healthcare centres as well as in 70 private centres, cover all groups within society, including children, adolescents, adults, the elderly, pregnant women, travellers, people with chronic conditions, and healthcare workers.

Several vaccines have also been approved and added in recent years, including the human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine for adolescents, the shingles (herpes zoster) vaccine, and the respiratory syncytial virus

(RSV) vaccine for the elderly. The statement added that MoPH is working with technical support from the National Immunisation Technical Advisory Group, to monitor and ensure the safety of vaccines. The MoPH has intensified its awareness efforts on the occasion of World Immunisation Week, which is designated by the World Health Organisation during

the last week of April each year. This year's celebration is held under the theme "Humanly Possible: Immunization for All," and the week represents an opportunity to enhance access to and use of vaccines to protect individuals and communities from diseases and epidemics.

The efforts to improve vaccine access in Qatar are being made in co-operation with its partners in the healthcare sector. (QNA)

Ashghal project aims to design, construct veterinary and agricultural laboratories

The Public Works Authority (Ashghal), in collaboration with the Ministry of Municipality, has announced the launch of a project to design and construct veterinary and agricultural laboratories - an initiative aimed at enhancing research infrastructure in both sectors and developing national capabilities in this vital field.

The project involves the development of three primary research facilities: the Veterinary Laboratory in the Old Airport area, the Agricultural Laboratory in Al Sheehaniyya, and the Agricultural Laboratory at Qatar Science and Technology Park (OSTP).

Project Manager Eng Ahmad Saleh explained that the new laboratories will provide a modern research environment aligned with the highest international standards in agricultural and veterinary sci-

He noted that the project aims to empower national laboratories to efficiently support Qatar's food security and animal health systems.

Deputy Head of the Health Projects Section Eng Asma al-Maslamani stated that work on the project has already begun in co-ordination with the Ministry of Municipality and is expected to be completed by the second quarter of 2026.

Al-Maslamani highlighted that approximately 55% of the materials used - such as steel, electrical and mechanical tools, glass, aluminium, and carpentry - are manufactured locally, underscoring the project's support for the national economy.

She also noted that the veterinary laboratory in the Old Airport area will undergo a comprehensive infrastructure upgrade, in-



cluding structural repairs, the development of laboratory units, and the construction of modern support facilities. These will include a fully equipped veterinary autopsy building, which will enhance the effectiveness of diagnostic and scientific research op-

Project Engineer Eng Omar Abdulaziz al-Mahmoud revealed that the integrated Agricultural Laboratory in Al Sheehaniyya will cover a total area of 1,191 square metres. It will serve as a research hub housing specialised laboratories for sample eparation, physical and chemical processing, spectroscopic analysis, and soil extraction. The facility will also include administrative offices, meeting rooms, and dedicated storage areas for chemicals and

Meanwhile, Project Engineer Eng Fahad al-Abdullah stated that three research units (104, 105, 106) at QSTP will be outfitted with state-of-the-art equipment and technologies to support advanced research. These will include a pesticide lab, a biotechnology and plant disease lab, and a herbs and seeds lab. The facility will also feature support spaces such as sample storage, researcher offices, and meeting rooms, all designed according to quality and innovation standards set by the Qatar Founda-

Ashghal emphasised that the project has been designed to meet the highest environmental and sustainability standards, while also incorporating elements of Qatari cultural identity. The project includes energy and water coneco-friendly and locally sourced materials, stringent fire safety protocols, and carbon emission reduction measures.

Aligned with Qatar National Vision 2030, the project marks a significant step in strengthening the country's scientific research ecosystem in the fields of agriculture and animal resources. It also contributes to sustainable development and the pursuit of national self-sufficiency. (QNA)

Meloni the leader Europe needs?

Donald Trump's return to the White House has made Giorgia Meloni an unlikely leader of the European Union in its dealings with the United States. Italy's prime minister may hail from a far-right nationalist party, but she is siding squarely with the EU, arguing that it is "childish" to think that Italy must choose between Trump and

Meloni was the first European leader to visit the White House after Trump announced his sweeping tariff plan - which he soon paused under market pressure, claiming that it was all intended to force others to the negotiating table. She was then back in Rome the next day to host Vice-President J D Vance, who had made his own opinion of Europeans clear in a scathing speech at the Munich Security Conference in February.

Although Meloni's ideological instincts align with the current US administration, she has framed her diplomacy as part of a carefully co-ordinated effort with the European Commission, which leads trade policy. She and the president of the Commission, Ursula von der Leyen, spoke several times by phone before and after her meeting at the White House, and they briefly exchanged words at Pope Francis's funeral on April 26. Meloni is lobbying to arrange a meeting between Trump and Von der Leyen in Rome, positioning herself as a broker between Washington and Brussels.

Although she has promised to import more liquefied natural gas from the US, and to boost Italy's defence budget, she is being a European team player, not just a national leader. "The first thing Meloni will do in dealing with Trump is call Brussels and have the EU involved in the decision," a senior Italian official told me last November, right after Trump was elected. The implication was that her institutionalist side would prevail over her populist instincts. So

This outcome was far from assured. In principle, Meloni does not disagree with Trump's description of the EU as a "pathetic" institution that exists solely to rip off America, or with Vance's image of a den of grifters who have betrayed their own values. "I've been saving this for years," she remarked after Vance's Munich speech. "Europe has a bit lost

The question is whether EU power brokers will trust her enough to give her a leading negotiating role when the time comes. "The great irony here is that Germany and France acted as informal representatives of the EU for decades, and no one objected to that," a Meloni adviser told me. "But if Italy tries to take that role, suddenly it's a problem - even though Italy's leader is objectively in an advantageous position to talk to the White House."

Meloni is walking a fine line. A regular guest at the American Conservative Political Action Conference, she was the only European leader invited to Trump's inauguration. She is so confident in her MAGA bona fides that, a few days before Trump was sworn in, she flew to Mar-a-Lago to press him to release an Iranian engineer that Italy had arrested at the US Department of Justice's behest. Iran had jailed an Italian journalist in retaliation, and the two prisoners were soon exchanged.

Trump has praised Meloni as someone who can "straighten out the world a little bit," and her advisers have built strong ties in Trumpworld. Her relationship with Elon Musk is so warm that Musk once had to deny any romantic involvement. Meloni is the first postfascist leader to rule Italy. Until a few years ago, her Fratelli d'Italia ("Brothers of Italy") party thrived on bashing Brussels bureaucrats and openly advocated dismantling the eurozone.

But things have changed radically since Meloni rose to power in 2022. She has moderated her stance on the EU and abandoned her harsh rhetoric toward the European Commission. Her staunch support for Ukraine has boosted her credibility with other European governments, and leading figures in the pro-European establishment have vouched for her reliability. In her two and a half years as prime minister, Meloni has gone from being a threat to the EU to becoming an internationally recognised European leader (though many confer this status on her only reluctantly). She has inverted the approach taken by Hungarian Prime Minister Viktor Orbán, who regularly obstructs EU projects to secure national advantages.

Meloni also has very practical reasons for remaining aligned with the EU. The Italian government is still supposed to receive €72bn (\$81bn) from the NextGenerationEU fund. Moreover, Meloni managed to secure von der Leyen's blessing for her controversial plan to detain migrants in Albania, outside the EU's borders. -Project Syndicate

Trump's boomerang: How Europe found its backbone



His first 100 days in office stand out as one of the most volatile periods in American history

S President Donald Trump's first 100 days in office stand out as one of the most volatile periods in American history - arguably the most turbulent in peacetime. And the consequences continue to reverberate far beyond the United States, as demonstrated by Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney's federal election victory following a campaign defined by sharp opposition to Trump's agenda.

other long-standing US allies, the start of Trump's second term has posed a direct challenge to the foundational pillars of the transatlantic alliance - security, defence, trade, and shared democratic values - all of which Trump views as negotiable.

The European Union, long dependent on the US security umbrella, has found itself facing threats of trade wars and relentless attacks from Trump and his allies - most notably Vice-President I D Vance and the ubiquitous (though perhaps fading) tech billionaire Elon Musk. But instead of wallowing in despair over the fraying security alliance, these provocations have fostered an unexpected sense of purpose and unity in Europe.

I call this the "Trump Boomerang Effect". Paradoxically, Trump's attempts to weaken America's allies - whether Canada, Mexico, Australia, Denmark, or the EU - have energised them politically and encouraged them to become more self-reliant. Trump's ham-fisted effort to extract concessions has instead reinforced their national resolve and solidarity.

The fallout has also hurt the popularity of Trump-aligned cheerleaders worldwide, from Canadian Conservative Party leader Pierre Poilievre (who lost the parliamentary seat he had held for over 20 years) to Australia's Peter Dutton, Greenland's self-proclaimed Trump protégé Jorgen Boassen, and Hungarian Prime Minister Viktor Orbán.

Perhaps most strikingly, Trump's campaign to undermine Europe has prompted political leaders to display a surprising degree of courage and confront long-standing challenges. By trying to bully the EU, he has inadvertently empowered member states to achieve goals that once seemed unattainable through internal negotiations alone.

As a result, Europe has emerged as a beacon of economic and political stability, attracting capital inflows and US-based researchers considering

relocation. Meanwhile, far-right leaders across the continent - with the notable exception of Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni - have seen their popularity decline due to their association with Trump, offsetting the boost that Trump's re-election gave figures like Orbán.

Vance's insulting speech at the Munich Security Conference in February was one of the clearest manifestations of the Trump Boomerang Effect. In response, incoming German Chancellor Friedrich Merz broke with his country's Atlanticist tradition to declare a second Zeitenwende ("enochal change") - a paradigm shift aimed at meeting the demands of a rapidly changing global landscape.

Merz's new strategic doctrine, endorsed by French President Emmanuel Macron and others, aims to reduce Europe's dependence on the US. It includes a historic shift in fiscal policy, exempting defence spending above 1% of GDP from Germany's constitutional debt brake. This adjustment is set to unlock substantial new resources for both military expenditures and broader infrastructure investment.

Trump's actions have also rekindled the Franco-German alliance – historically, the EU's engine of economic growth - which will reshape the bloc's political trajectory. France and Germany now have a shared purpose: to achieve strategic independence from the US and bolster Europe's geopolitical resilience against its unpredictable and untrustworthy president. This, in turn, has led to an unexpected rapprochement between the EU

and the United Kingdom. While post-Brexit Britain remains formally free to align with either the US or the EU, Prime Minister Keir Starmer has clearly sided with Europe.

These developments are paving the way for deeper European integration, with far-reaching implications for regional security and economic prosperity. One key initiative involves financing increased defence spending through joint borrowing - a strategy pioneered by the NextGenerationEU fund, the bloc's Covid-19 recovery programme.

Moreover, the push for deeper defence integration may soon extend into the broader economy. Over the past year, separate reports by former Italian Prime Ministers Mario Draghi and Enrico Letta have highlighted Europe's lagging innovation and productivity compared to the US, calling for a stronger and more unified single market in financial services, energy, and digital technologies.

At the core of the EU's emerging strategy for reigniting economic dynamism is the creation of a Capital Markets Union, now rebranded as the Savings and Investment Union. The goal is to give firms easier access to pan-European financing and repatriate Europe's substantial savings surplus - much of which currently flows into US markets - while maintaining financial stability. Trump's disruptive economic policies are already accelerating

The Trump Boomerang Effect appears to be driving a profound transformation, underpinned by renewed confidence in the European project. Europeans

today are experiencing a degree of unity and common purpose not seen in decades. Even previously staunch Euroskeptics now speak in pan-European terms. Meloni, for example, has deferred to the EU in negotiating with Trump, recognising that the bloc is responsible for trade policy and also better positioned than any individual member state to confront the US effectively.

It remains to be seen whether Europe's political leaders will be able to capitalise on these favourable circumstances to achieve genuine EU independence and strategic autonomy. Given the scale of Trump's assault on the continent, they at least appear to understand that their actions will be judged not only by their own constituents but by people across Europe. This new form of pan-European political accountability may end up making Europe - not America – great again. – Project Syndicate
