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QCB cuts interest rates by 0.25%

Qatar Central Bank (QCB) has decided to reduce the current interest rates for deposits, lending and repo by 0.25% or 25 basis points (bps). The new rates will take effect on December 11, QCB announced last night. Qatar Central Bank's deposit rate (QCBDR) will now be 3.85%, lending rate (QCBLR) 4.35% and repo rate (QCBRR) 4.10%. QCB said the rate cut followed its "assessment of the current monetary policy of Qatar".

Minister unveils key budget figures

HE the Minister of Finance Ali bin Ahmed al-Kuwari revealed yesterday the key features of Qatar's General Budget for the year 2026, including sectoral expenditure distribution, government contracting plans, and the financing of the Third National Development Strategy. He presented several initiatives by the Ministry of Finance to empower and engage the Qatari private sector. HE al-Kuwari stated that the total expenditure for the 2026 budget amounts to QR220.8bn, distributed as follows: QR69.5bn allocated for salaries and wages, QR81.5bn for current expenditures, QR7bn for minor capital expenditures, and QR62.8bn for major capital expenditures. The minister confirmed that Qatar's credit rating is among the best in the region and the world, reflecting confidence in the Qatari economy. **Business Page 1**

Web Summit pulls over 130 world partners

This came during its regular meeting to review the latest preparations ahead of the upcoming third edition taking place from February 1-4.

The committee announced the addition of a new group of leading international speakers at Web Summit Qatar 2026, including Cliff Obrecht, co-founder of Canva; Eric Jing, co-founder and CEO of Genspark AI; Tao Zhang, co-founder of Manus AI; and Allyson Felix, 11-time Olympic medallist.

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Cabinet nod for move to give priority to national products

HE the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim al-Thani chaired the Cabinet's weekly meeting yesterday at the Amiri Diwan.

Following the meeting, HE the Minister of Justice and Minister of State for Cabinet Affairs Ibrahim bin Ali al-Mohannadi stated the following:

At the outset of the meeting, the Cabinet welcomed the results of the 8th meeting of the Qatari-Saudi Co-ordination Council, held on Monday in Riyadh, co-chaired by His Highness the Amir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani and Saudi Crown Prince and Prime Minister Prince Mohammed bin Salman bin Abdulaziz al-Saud.

The Cabinet affirmed that the deep-rooted historical relations between Qatar and Saudi Arabia have moved to a new stage in light of what was included in the joint statement issued at the conclusion of the Co-ordination Council meeting, and its emphasis on the importance of continuing to support and develop joint co-ordination in priority areas, including political, security, military, energy, industry, economy, investment, trade, technology, infrastructure, culture, tourism and education, in a way that meets the aspirations of the two fraternal peoples and supports security, peace and prosperity in the region.

The Cabinet praised the agreements and memorandums of understanding signed that would open new horizons for the strategic partnership between the two



countries, particularly the agreement to link the two countries by high-speed electric train, which connects the cities of Doha and Riyadh, as it is a major strategic initiative that is consistent with the objectives of Qatar National Vision 2030 and Saudi Arabia Vision 2030, and that contributes to facilitating the movement of tourists and trade and enhancing communication between the two fraternal peoples.

The Cabinet praised the success of the 23rd Doha Forum 2025, which was inaugurated by His Highness the Amir. The two-day forum was held under the theme "justice in Action: Beyond Promises to Progress." This edition was distinguished by holding high-level dialogue sessions, in which an elite group of decision-makers, thought leaders, opinion leaders, and experts participated. The sessions were characterised by depth and objectivity, and addressed the key regional and international issues and how to address current challenges, which confirmed the role of the forum and the strength of its influence, and embodied the approach of Qatar's diplomacy that calls for dialogue and supports peaceful solutions, achieving justice, hu-

man dignity, and respect for the rights of peoples.

The Cabinet welcomed the signing of the historic peace and economic agreement between the Democratic Republic of Congo and Rwanda in Washington, which complements previous agreements that Qatar and the US helped to facilitate and strengthen, and represents an important step toward ending the conflict in eastern Democratic Republic of Congo, consolidating regional stability, and enhancing co-operation in East and Central Africa.

The Cabinet also welcomed the signing by the Government of Colombia and the self-declared EGC of the "Doha Agreement to reinforce the commitment to peace" following two rounds of mediation in Doha, which was reached through the efforts of Qatar and its partners, and included a commitment to alleviate the suffering of the civilian population, end the armed conflict, and open a path for both parties toward building a sustainable peace.

The Cabinet then considered the topics on its agenda. The Cabinet approved the draft decision to specify the items that government agencies are obligated to provide from national products. The draft

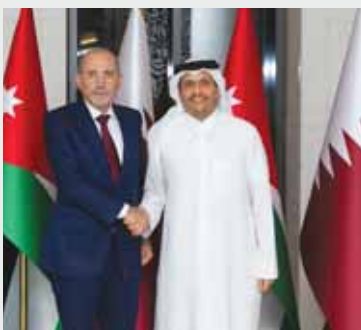

The Cabinet also approved the draft Cabinet decision to establish and form a committee to manage the work of the International Telecommunication Union Plenipotentiary Conference 2026. The preparation of the draft decision comes within the framework of the Communications Regulatory Authority's preparations to host that conference, which is scheduled to be held in Doha in November 2026.

The Cabinet decided to approve a draft memorandum of understanding (MoU) for co-operation in the field of technical and vocational education and training between the Ministry of Education and Higher Education of Qatar and the Ministry of Culture and Innovation of Hungary, and a draft MoU in the field of academic co-operation between University of Doha for Science and Technology (UDST) in Qatar and the Ministry of Education, Culture and Higher Education of Somalia. PM, Jordan deputy PM meet

HE the Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim al-Thani, met yesterday with the visiting Jordanian Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs and Expatriates Dr Ayman al-Safadi. Talks during the meeting dealt with bilateral relations and ways to strengthen them, as well as developments

NHRC stresses right to freedom of expression

HE the Chairperson of the National Human Rights Committee (NHRC), Maryam bint Abdullah al-Attiyah, met yesterday with US Deputy Assistant Secretary of State in the Bureau of Democracy, Human Rights, and Labour (DRL), Jacob McGee.

HE al-Attiyah stressed, during the meeting, that the right to freedom of opinion and expression, along with the prevention of discrimination, has been among the top priorities of the NHRC since its inception, as the cornerstones of respecting human rights.

She noted the NHRC's efforts in numerous international conferences concerning the freedom of opinion and expression and its pursuit of connecting this attention with the upgrade of national legislations.

The issue of trafficking



in persons tops the NHRC's operational priorities, as the committee receives appeals from individuals and immediately embarks on exploring appropriate legal solutions with the competent authorities, observing the humanitarian dimension in each case, she stressed.

HE al-Attiyah further noted that the committee undertakes a significant role in training and bolstering awareness of relevant international agreements, including the Protocol to Prevent, Suppress and Punish Traf-

ficking in Persons.

She highlighted that the committee provides training for a variety of community members, enterprises, commercial companies, and university students in co-ordination with the Ministry of Labour's National Committee for Combating Human Trafficking.

The training courses the committee provides range from social to legal awareness, and they focus on the National Law on Combating Human Trafficking and its amendments, and the

Business and Human Rights principles, with reference to the competent authorities and contact numbers that should be approached in case of any suspected case, HE al-Attiyah highlighted.

She further emphasised that Qatar conducted amendments to the National Law on Combating Human Trafficking in December 2024, which allow the arrest of suspects for prolonged periods and offer additional time to collect evidence, in addition to facilitating the referral of victims to shelters and care centres.

Throughout this meeting, the Chairperson touched on the primary segments that need care in terms of the Law on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, which has recently been issued, noting that this law aligns with the relevant international standards. (QNA)

Qatar pledges \$1mn to UN emergency fund

Qatar has pledged \$1mn to support the UN Central Emergency Response Fund (CERF) out of its belief in the vital role played by the CERF in responding to urgent humanitarian needs and its longstanding partnership with the UN.

Qatar's Permanent Representative to the UN HE Sheikha Alya Ahmed bin Saif al-Thani announced this during her participation in the High-level Pledging Event at the UN headquarters in New

York, in the presence of UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres and Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Co-ordinator Tom Fletcher.

In a statement during the event, HE Sheikha Alya expressed Qatar's deep appreciation for the fund's pivotal role, noting that it has demonstrated a unique capacity to deliver rapid, life-saving assistance in the most urgent and complex humanitarian situations. She highlighted-

ed that CERF has provided food, shelter, medical care, and essential services at critical moments when swift response has meant the difference between life and death.

She also underscored the fund's sustained role in responding to emergencies in conflict zones and in addressing climate-related disasters, stressing its continued importance and indispensable value to the international community. (QNA)

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

Qatar, Spain interior ministries sign joint action plan



HE the Minister of Interior and Commander of the Internal Security Force (Lekhwiya) Sheikh Khalifa bin Hamad bin Khalifa al-Thani met with Spain's Interior Minister, Fernando Grande-Marlaska Gomez, and the accompanying delegation. The meeting discussed bilateral co-operation in security fields and ways to enhance and further develop them, besides touching on issues of mutual concern. The meeting also witnessed the signing of a joint action plan between the interior ministries of the two countries in the areas of information exchange, counter-terrorism, and crime prevention, along with a joint statement between Lekhwiya and the Spanish interior ministry to advance security co-operation mechanisms. HE Sheikh Khalifa and Gomez signed the agreement on behalf of their respective sides. **(QNA)**

Attorney-general says integrity, transparency pillar for achieving justice

Attorney-General HE Dr Issa Saad al-Jafali al-Nuaimi affirmed that integrity and transparency constitute the fundamental pillar for protecting society and achieving justice. This came in a lecture delivered by HE Dr al-Nuaimi at the College of Graduate Studies at the Police Academy to the members of the second batch of the Security Command and Staff Programme. He addressed a number of key themes related to consolidating the rule of law, and the role of security agencies as a key partner in supporting the work of the Public Prosecution and the judiciary. He also reviewed the mechanisms for effective co-ordination between judicial and security institutions to confront emerging challenges. The lecture witnessed an



interactive discussion from the participants, during which questions and inquiries were raised about ways to develop legal leadership skills, and the role of security leaders in enhancing the efficiency of criminal procedures. **(QNA)**

Doha Metro, Lusail Tram ferry over 2.5mn Arab Cup fans



Qatar Railways Company (Qatar Rail) has carried more than 2.5mn passengers on its Doha Metro and Lusail Tram networks during the group stage of the FIFA Arab Cup Qatar 2025. From Dec 1-9, the Doha Metro registered 2.41mn passengers, while the Lusail Tram ferried 108,239 passengers during the sporting event.

The Doha Metro and Lusail Tram services saw a remarkable turnout from Arab Cup fans, particularly on day eight of the tournament, which marked the highest ridership since the competition kicked off on Dec 1. More than 315,000 passengers were transported that day across the networks.

The highest daily ridership was recorded on Dec 8, driven by two major fixtures: the Saudi Arabia vs Morocco match at Lusail Stadium, directly connected to Lusail QNB Station on the Red Line, and the Oman vs Comoros match at Stadium 974, served by Ras Bu Aboud Station on the Gold Line.

On the record-setting day, Lusail QNB Station was the busiest across the entire metro network, welcoming nearly 88,000 passengers, followed by Msheireb and DECC stations. Within the Lusail Tram network, Legtaifiya Station recorded the highest footfall.

Across the group stage, Doha Metro's busiest stations were Lusail QNB, DECC, and Msheireb. The metro provided connectivity to key fan zones and event areas and attractions, such as Souq Waqif, Lusail Boulevard, Katara, and Old Doha Port.

As Qatar welcomes fans for the FIFA Arab Cup 2025 and the FIFA Intercontinental Cup Qatar 2025, held from Dec 1-18, Qatar Rail and its service provider, continue to scale up the operational performance of the Metro and Tram networks through a sophisticated control ecosystem and a fully co-ordinated command structure designed to ensure uninterrupted, safe, and reliable mobility throughout the tournaments period.

Also, Qatar Rail fully mobilised the entire fleet of 110 modern, comfortable, and secure Doha Metro trains. This includes the deployment of six-carriage trains on the Red Line, doubling the capacity to 1,120 passengers per train, and reducing the headway between trains on all three lines, not only during usual peak hours, but also before and after the match times.

With large match-day crowds expected across multiple venues, Qatar Rail has intensified monitoring capabilities, reinforced on-the-ground readiness, and expanded its coordination with national partners to maintain seamless passenger flow across stations and trains.

Central to this operational readiness are Qatar Rail's two main control centres: the Integrated Control Centre (ICC) at Al Wakra and the Operations Control Centre (OCC) at Lusail.

The ICC oversees all train movements on the three Metro lines, co-ordinating real-time operations across 37 stations. This includes monitoring passenger flow, station systems, platform activities, train headways, and safety protocols.

Also, the OCC performs an equally critical role for the Lusail Tram network, ensuring consistent performance, maintaining timetable adherence, and responding quickly to operational demands.

Both centres provide 24/7 visibility over their respective networks, enabling the operations teams to adjust service plans, deploy additional trains and teams during peak hours, and mitigate any disruptions with immediate effect.

Additional field inspections are carried out at stadium stations and high-footfall interchange points between one and three days before each match. To ensure faster technical response times, dedicated maintenance teams from all Facility Management subcontractors have been deployed across key stations, supported by First Line Response Technicians positioned strategically at stadium and interchange locations. These measures reinforce network resilience and increase the capacity to manage large crowds expected before and after each game.

The 105 Contact Centre continues to serve as a multichannel communication hub 24/7, offering passengers access through phone calls, emails, WhatsApp, social media, and the Qatar Rail website and app. With passengers frequently seeking real-time train schedules, station access information, and service modification alerts, the centre provides continuous live updates to support trip planning and ensure smooth mobility between stadiums, fan zones, and key destinations.

The centre operates using advanced customer engagement tools for call, WhatsApp management, case management and interaction tracking. Recent enhancements, including the upgrade of the WhatsApp communication channel, allow the centre to handle high volumes more efficiently while maintaining accuracy and speed in response times.

Passengers wishing to contact the centre during the tournament may dial 105 or through WhatsApp at 4443 3105, where the team continues to offer real-time response and direct support throughout the tournament period.

The candidate must also not be prohibited from engaging in any activity within entities subject to the Authority's supervision pursuant to Article (35), paragraph (12) of Law No. (8) of 2012. Accordingly, the Authority must be provided with the candidate's criminal record certificate.
- The candidate must be a shareholder and the owner of one million (1,000,000) shares of the Company's shares. These shares must be deposited with the depository within sixty days from the start date of membership, and the deposit shall remain until the end of the membership term and the approval of the final financial year's audited accounts. These shares may not be traded, pledged, or seized. Independent members and members representing the Company's employees are exempted from the shareholding requirement stipulated in this clause.
- The candidate must not have been previously declared bankrupt unless rehabilitated, nor have defaulted on debts resulting in losses to financial institutions, nor previously been dismissed from a position, nor have any conflict of interest that may affect impartiality and independence.
- All board members, or their representatives, must hold university degrees or equivalent qualifications or experience, and must possess diverse and appropriate competencies and skills individually and collectively to perform their role in a professional, effective, and integrated manner.

Toyota, Honda, Ford models recalled

The Ministry of Commerce and Industry, in co-operation with Al Abdulghani Motors, has announced the recall of Toyota LC300 (Twin Turbo), LC300 (Hybrid), New Prado 250, Lexus 700h (Hybrid), Lexus LC500 Vehicles 2024-2025 models.

The recall is due to a possible defect in the Parking Assist ECU which may cause the rear-view image to freeze briefly during reverse or rear-view image not display during reverse if the ignition is turned on and off within a specific time.

The ministry, in co-operation with Doha Marketing Services co (Domasco), announced the recall of Honda CBF300 motorcycle 2022 model as the headlight while in use may suddenly flicker and eventually shut off.

The ministry, in co-operation with Almana Motors Company, also announced the recall of Ford Mustang 2024-2025 models due to the possibility of water leaking into the car’s body control unit which

may cause loss of connection to the external lighting components.

The ministry said the recall campaign comes within the framework of its ongoing efforts to protect consumers and ensure that car and motorcycle dealers follow up on vehicle defects and repairs.

The ministry said it will co-ordinate with the dealer to follow up on the maintenance and repair works and will communicate with customers to ensure that the necessary repairs are carried out.

The flip side of fuel economy rollback: higher gas bills will absorb savings

The Trump administration's proposal to roll back Biden-era vehicle fuel-efficiency standards may save automakers in the US tens of billions of dollars and potentially lower upfront purchase costs for American car buyers. But any savings for car buyers will vanish quickly as drivers are forced to shell out more cash at the fuel pump, according to industry experts who analysed the administration's proposal as well as the administration's own projections. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) and the Environmental Protection Agency last Wednesday proposed cutting the fuel-economy requirements for cars to 34.5 miles per gallon on average by 2031, down from the 50.4 miles per gallon (21.4km per litre) set by former President Joe Biden.

As a result, automakers would save \$35bn through 2031 and average upfront vehicle costs would decline by about \$930, assuming the automakers pass along the savings, according to NHTSA's economic analysis in support of the proposal.

But the NHTSA's same economic analysis said the proposal would raise fuel consumption by around 100bn gallons through 2050 relative to the Biden standard, costing Americans up to \$185bn.

"The Department of Transportation is now estimating larger upfront savings on technology costs, but they are also estimating even larger losses in fuel savings," said Jason Schwartz, legal director at New York University's Institute for Policy Integrity.

"As for just how quickly any upfront savings will evaporate in the face of more money spent at the gas pump, very quickly indeed," he said.

Car buyers with long-term financing may not feel even the short-term benefits, as purchase savings would be spread out over time alongside the higher fuel bills.

"From the very first day of driving, it will cost consumers more to operate their less-efficient cars: more for gas, more for repairs, more time wasted pumping gas," he said.

The Trump administration touted the fuel economy rollback proposal as a boost to the auto industry and a benefit for consumers by potentially allowing for the comeback of less-efficient vehicles such as station wagons, a staple of 1970s and 1980s family travel.

It criticised Biden's standards as a mandate for more electric vehicles that are more expensive, and which American automakers have struggled to produce profitably at scale. Some of the biggest beneficiaries of the proposal include US automakers Ford and GM, along with Europe-based Stellantis, which produces vehicles under the Chrysler, Dodge and Ram brands in the United States, according to the NHTSA's analysis. The administration has said that longer-term cost estimates including fuel prices are more speculative and that its cost-benefit analysis did not factor in maintenance costs.

"Under our proposal, initial vehicle owners will save more upfront relative to fuel costs. Moreover, that savings calculation does not include savings from reduced fines [from non compliance with higher CAFE standards]," an NHSTA spokesperson said.

Dave Cooke, a senior scientist for the clean transportation programme at Union of Concerned Scientists, said he believed the proposal amounted to a financial hit to consumers.

"It shows that consumers will be paying more in lifetime fuel costs than saved in technology costs beginning in model year 2027 in every single one of their three alternative (scenarios) compared to the original standards under Biden," he said of the NHTSA analysis.

He also criticised the administration's analysis for omitting the foregone financial benefits associated with increased tailpipe pollution and greenhouse gas emissions.

The NHTSA's analysis showed the proposal would raise vehicle carbon dioxide emissions by around 5% relative to the Biden standards. Transport is the top source of US carbon dioxide output, according to the EPA. Trump has called global warming a "con job" and pulled the United States out of international efforts to combat it.

The EPA said its administrator, Lee Zeldin, had made revitalising the American auto industry one of his priorities.

"EPA is committed to delivering on this promise and giving consumers choice through rulemaking within EPA's jurisdiction," the agency said in a statement.

Analysts for Edmunds, a consumer research guide for car buyers, said it may be too early to forecast how quickly the projected upfront savings on vehicles might be offset by higher fuel costs. Edmunds told Reuters that product development cycles are typically planned years in advance, so any meaningful impact would take quite a while to materialise. — Reuters

Trump backs broader review of all childhood immunisations

US vaccine advisers' decision to scrap longstanding guidance on hepatitis B shots will expose more children to the harmful virus and may signal how other evidence-based vaccine policies can be undermined, doctors and disease experts said.

Since 1991, US health officials have recommended universal vaccination for infants against hepatitis B, with the first of three shots administered very soon after birth. The move has cut infections dramatically and saved lives, federal data show.

On Friday, an advisory panel appointed by Health Secretary Robert F Kennedy Jr said a birth dose should only be given to newborns whose mother tests positive for hepatitis B or whose status is unknown. In cases where the mother tests negative, parents should decide with their doctors when, or even if, their children should receive any hepatitis B vaccines, the panel said.

The advisers, many of whom share Kennedy's anti-vaccine views, provided no evidence of new harms from the shot. They argued that vaccination was too broad compared to the risk of infection and that US policy was out of step with certain developed countries.

"Do you want to expose your child, your baby, to an intervention that could have some potential harms when the risk is so low?" said Retsef Levi, one of the advisers

who supported the new recommendation.

Experts warn of risks

Disease experts said that current US infection rates are low thanks to the decades-old vaccination policy and warned that will change if the Trump administration accepts the new recommendation. More families will likely opt out of vaccination without a firm federal policy in place, and children can be easily infected through exposure to household members other than their mothers, who may not be aware they have hepatitis B.

Many people with hepatitis B do not have symptoms and are unaware of their infection. In infants and young children, an initial infection becomes chronic in about 95% of cases, potentially causing liver damage and liver cancer decades later, according to the World Health Organisation.

"This is a watershed moment for our country," said Dr Alex Cvijanovich, a paediatrician in Albuquerque, New Mexico. "I don't think it's going to take long to start seeing cases of hepatitis B come back, and I think that the burden of these cases will lay squarely on the shoulders of a group of people who don't understand the science of vaccines."

Trump backs full review of childhood vaccination policy

The repudiation of a safe and successful vaccine also raises concerns over how the advisory panel will conduct a planned review of all routine childhood immunisations, according to former vaccine advisers, paediatricians and experts in infectious diseases.

Late on Friday, President Donald Trump stressed his support for such a review, instructing Kennedy to study how US childhood vaccine policy differs from "peer, developed countries", and make changes where warranted.

"What they are really doing is dismantling the vaccine schedule," said Dr Flor Munoz, an infectious diseases specialist at Texas Children's Hospital. "Every other vaccine is probably going to fall under their plan."

HHS spokesman Andrew Nixon said in a statement to Reuters "there is no way to infer broader change" from the decision on hepatitis B shots or assume that it "sets a template for rolling back other childhood vaccine recommendations".

The decision by the Advisory Committee on Immunisation Practices (ACIP) must be adopted by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's acting director before taking effect. It will help determine states' immunisation requirements, insurance coverage and procurement for the CDC's Vaccines for Children program relied upon by many families.

Robert Malone, vice-chair of the ACIP panel, supported the new recommendation. Public health "is focused on maximising the greatest good for the greatest number," he said. "The counterbalance to that is the need to respect the rights of the individual for self-determination."

US hepatitis B infections have fallen nearly 90% from about 9.6 per 100,000 before vaccination became widespread to approximately one per 100,000 in 2018, according to the CDC.

Major side effects, such as allergic reactions, are very rare.

Before routine vaccination at birth, 18,000 US children contracted the virus each year by age 10, according to the American Academy of Family Physicians.

"Some of these committee members would indeed be pleased if some parents chose never to vaccinate their children against hepatitis B," said Dr William Schaffner, an infectious diseases specialist at Vanderbilt University and a former ACIP member. "They've turned back the clock to pre-1991."

Medical societies to ignore new vaccine guidance

Leading US medical societies, including the American Academy of Pediatrics, and at least 12 states said they would ignore the new recommendation and continue to support the hepatitis B vaccine for all newborns. They include Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Illinois, Massachusetts, Maryland, Michigan, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina and Rhode Island.

The full impact from a reversal will take time to materialise, making it harder to communicate the risks to families, according to paediatricians and disease experts.

Dr Sharon Nachman, chief of paediatric infectious diseases at Stony Brook Children's Hospital in New York, said the concern within the medical community is that more families will buy into the notion promoted by Kennedy, but unsupported by scientific evidence, that vaccines cause more harm than the diseases they prevent. It will take much longer for the worst complications of hepatitis B to show up.

"This is a 20-year ticking time bomb," she said. — Reuters

'With You It Rises, From You It Awaits'

He said the venue continues to develop as a dynamic cultural and heritage platform, showcasing the depth of Qatar's history through diverse programming that blends heritage, culture, education and entertainment. This year's edition, he added, places particular emphasis on strengthening na-

tional identity and engaging all segments of society through modern, innovative presentations of Qatari heritage.

A wide range of ministries and State institutions are taking part, including the Ministries of Defence, Interior, and Communications and Information Technology, as well as the Qatar Documentary House, the National Cybersecurity



Agency, the Qatar Cultural Center for the Deaf, the Qatar Photography Center, the Social and Cultural Center for the Blind, Qatar Reads and Qatar Islamic Bank.

The programme features traditional displays of Qatar's past on land and sea, the Qatari house, and the old market that reflects the country's social history. Key heritage components include Al-Maqtar – a recreation of Bedouin life with poetry sessions, riddles, and specialised heritage houses such as the Falconry House and the Sadu and Weaving House – and Al-Ezbah, where children learn camel riding and experience traditional nomadic life.

A major maritime heritage zone, Al-Bidaa showcases traditional seafaring culture through the nakhuda majlis, the nahham, the tawwash, the teacher's house and a dedicated maritime museum, alongside traditional games and cultural competitions. Children's programming is extensive, including outdoor sports and Sana Qatar, a digital exhibition offering immersive experiences using advanced display technologies and interactive content.

The main stage will host daily cultural activities, including seminars and poetry evenings, while several art exhibitions explore different facets of Qatar's history and

identity. Among them is the 'Year of the Drowning' exhibition, highlighting one of the Gulf's most significant maritime tragedies.

Other showcases include You-suf Ahmed's 'Palm Tree' exhibition, featuring handmade paper crafted from palm fronds, and Mohammed al-Jaidah's 'Features of Life', documenting scenes from Qatar's past.

Darb Al Saai is open to the public daily from 3pm to 11pm at its permanent location, which blends Qatari architectural heritage with contemporary design and provides enhanced facilities to ensure a comfortable and safe visitor experience.

L'Heure du Diamant Chopard, the Master of Jewellery Watches

The history of jewellery watches at Chopard is a tale of innovation, craftsmanship, and artistic excellence, interwoven with the legacy of the Scheufele family. Since its founding in 1860 by Louis-Ulysse Chopard, the Maison has remained at the forefront of fine watchmaking, with a distinctive expertise in jewellery watches emerging over time. Parallel to this, the Scheufele family's heritage in Pforzheim – a historic centre of jewellery and watchmaking – laid the foundation for a tradition of precision and artistry. In 1904, Karl Scheufele I established his own Manufacture, Eszeha, specialising in jewellery watches and luxury items crafted in gold and platinum, which confirmed his reputation as 'The Master of Jewellery Watches'. The era's Belle Epoque aesthetic, with its delicate, transformable designs and the use of platinum, greatly influenced his creations. In 1912, he introduced an innovative clip that allowed a pocket watch to be worn on the wrist, an elegant precursor to the modern wristwatch. By the 1920s, Eszeha had embraced the Art Deco movement, producing timepieces distinguished by their daring geometric shapes, stylised diamond settings, and platinum cases. Following the challenges of World



War I, Karl Scheufele I focused his collection increasingly on watches, incorporating Swiss movements into his meticulously crafted cases. This expertise was carried forward by his son, Karl Scheufele II, who steered the Maison through the post-war years and positioned it for expansion. In 1958, at just 20 years old, Karl Scheufele III assumed leadership, alongside his wife, Karin. Seeking to broaden the Maison's reach, he set his sights on acquiring a Swiss watch manufacture – an ambition realised in 1963 with the purchase of Chopard. Fortunately for him, Louis-Ulysse Chopard's heir quickly realised their mutual alignment in terms of values and vision and was therefore open to passing the baton to the Scheufele family.



From then on, their stewardship of Chopard ushered in a new era of creativity and technical refinement. Jewellery watches became central to the Maison's identity, with diamond-set designs showcasing an exceptional interplay of baguette and brilliant-cut stones. By the late 1960s, the Maison had gained international recognition for its artistry and innovation, winning 15 Golden Rose of Baden-Baden awards – known at the time as the 'Oscars' of jewellery. The period also saw Chopard's early advertisements feature the slogan *Maîtres de la montre-bijou* (Masters of Jewellery Watches), cementing its growing reputation in the field. The 1970s brought a bold new aesthetic, reflecting both the



exuberance of the era and Chopard's evolving expertise. Timepieces such as 1976's Concord watch featured ornamental stone dials, vibrant colours, and sculptural bracelets, including Milanese mesh and tree-bark textures – techniques long mastered by the Scheufeles. This savoir-faire became intrinsic to Chopard's visual universe, seamlessly blending goldsmithing traditions with Swiss horological precision. The decade also saw the launch of the Belle Epoque collection, reinterpreting the curving, floral motifs of the early 20th century for a contemporary audience. By the 1990s, renowned for its jewellery watches, Chopard created the world's most precious watch in 1997, the groundbreaking



'Chopardissimo', which required 2000 hours of work and sparkled with 874 diamonds totalling 163 carats. The launch of the L'Heure du Diamant collection in 2012 further cemented Chopard's and the Scheufele family's shared heritage of creating "jewels that tell the time." One model from the collection even went on to earn the Jewellery Watch Prize at the Grand Prix d'Horlogerie de Genève the following year. In 2018, Chopard became the first luxury watch and jewellery Maison to commit to using 100% ethical gold in the production of its watch and jewellery creations, including L'Heure du Diamant, reaffirming its 'Journey to Sustainable Luxury'. In 2024, the introduction of the 10.01-C calibre, dedicated to L'Heure du Diamant, marked

another milestone as the smallest and thinnest in-house movement on the market, measuring 15.70mm in diameter and only 2.90mm in thickness. In 2025, Chopard continues to honour its legacy of jewellery watchmaking with several landmark initiatives. For the first time, a moonphase complication is introduced to a L'Heure du Diamant timepiece, adding a new chapter to the collection's mechanical evolution. At the same time, the Maison unveils its latest campaign, featuring Chopard ambassador Bella Hadid framed by flowers, a Chopard signature seen as far back as its 60s catalogues. A travelling exhibition dedicated to L'Heure du Diamant will also launch this year, showcasing over 15 exceptional diamond-set timepieces. Many of these creations highlight Chopard signatures, such as ornamental stone dials, crown-set diamonds, and bark-type bracelets. The exhibition will debut in Geneva before touring global destinations, including Dubai, Cannes, and Paris. Heritage pieces will be displayed alongside contemporary L'Heure du Diamant watches and jewels, such as The Precious Hours set and the L'Heure du Diamant Moonphase watch.
